MS. CHENITZ: Good morning. I'm Zoey
Chenitz, senior policy counsel at the New York
City Commission on Human Rights. I've been
désignated as the hearing officer for the
public hearing on the proposed rules of
practice promulgated by the City Commission on
Human Rights.

This hearing is being held in Spector Hall at 22 Reade Street. It is now 11:01 a.m. on Thursday, May 30th, 2019, and I'm hereby convening the public hearing on this proposed rule.

The proposed rule was published in the city record on April 22nd, 2019. Copies of the proposed notice and rules are available on the Commission of Human Rights website, on the New York City Rules website, and here, in paper form, on the table up front. Sections 905 and 1043 of the New York City Charter authorize the commission to adopt these proposed rules.

This hearing affords the public the opportunity to comment on all aspects of the rules the commission has proposed. The commission will carefully review all testimony

and written comments received at this hearing and will give due weight and consideration to all adequately substantiated proposals and recommendations that are submitted within the public comment period.

To ensure that everyone seeking to testify will have an opportunity to do so, I will strictly follow these simple ground rules:
Signing-in in order of appearance. Anyone seeking to testify must complete a registration card so you can be correctly identified in the hearing record. Witnesses will be called to testify in the order that they have signed in. Anyone who does not appear when their name is called will be deemed to have passed over the opportunity to testify. Anyone who is passed will be called at the end of the hour. Anyone who still does not appear must then sign in again if they wish to testify.

Time limits on testimony: Each witness will have a maximum of three minutes to testify. There is a time keeper. And to be fair to everyone seeking to testify, I will strictly apply the three-minute limit to every

speaker. If your comments take longer than three minutes, synthesize your oral testimony and leave a written copy for the record.

Written testimony: Unlike the limit for the time the testimony -- unlike the limit for the time for testimony, there is no limit on the number of pages you can submit as written comments or as documents for the record. The written submission will be made part of the record as exhibits presented with your testimony.

I must also make a couple of housekeeping announcements. Emergency exits are located at the front and back of this hall. Restroom facilities are located through the waiting area for the Commission on Human Rights, which can be accessed from the lobby. And if you would please turn off all your cell phones and turn them -- or turn them to vibrate. Thank you.

Seeing no one present to offer testimony at this time, I'll adjourn the hearing until an individual appears to offer testimony or until 12 p.m., whichever comes first.
