RESOLVED That the Design Commission, having considered designs for the construction of a café addition, storage building, and adjacent site work, McCarren Park House, McCarren Park, between Lorimer Street, Bedford Avenue, and Driggs Avenue, Brooklyn, submitted by the Department of Parks & Recreation, represented by exhibits 580-CO, CP & CQ of record in this matter, hereby gives to the same unanimous preliminary approval with the understanding that the team will conduct paint removal tests to determine the color of the original brick façade and submit the results of the findings along with alternative paint color options at final review. The Commission urges the team to consider colors for the café addition, window mullions, and storage building that complement the historic brick instead of matching it. The Commission also encourages the Department of Parks & Recreation to replace the 1930s era roof with one that more closely matches the original roof design in a future project.

Preliminary approval is conditioned upon commencement of work before June 22, 2022 and submission of this project for final review and approval.
