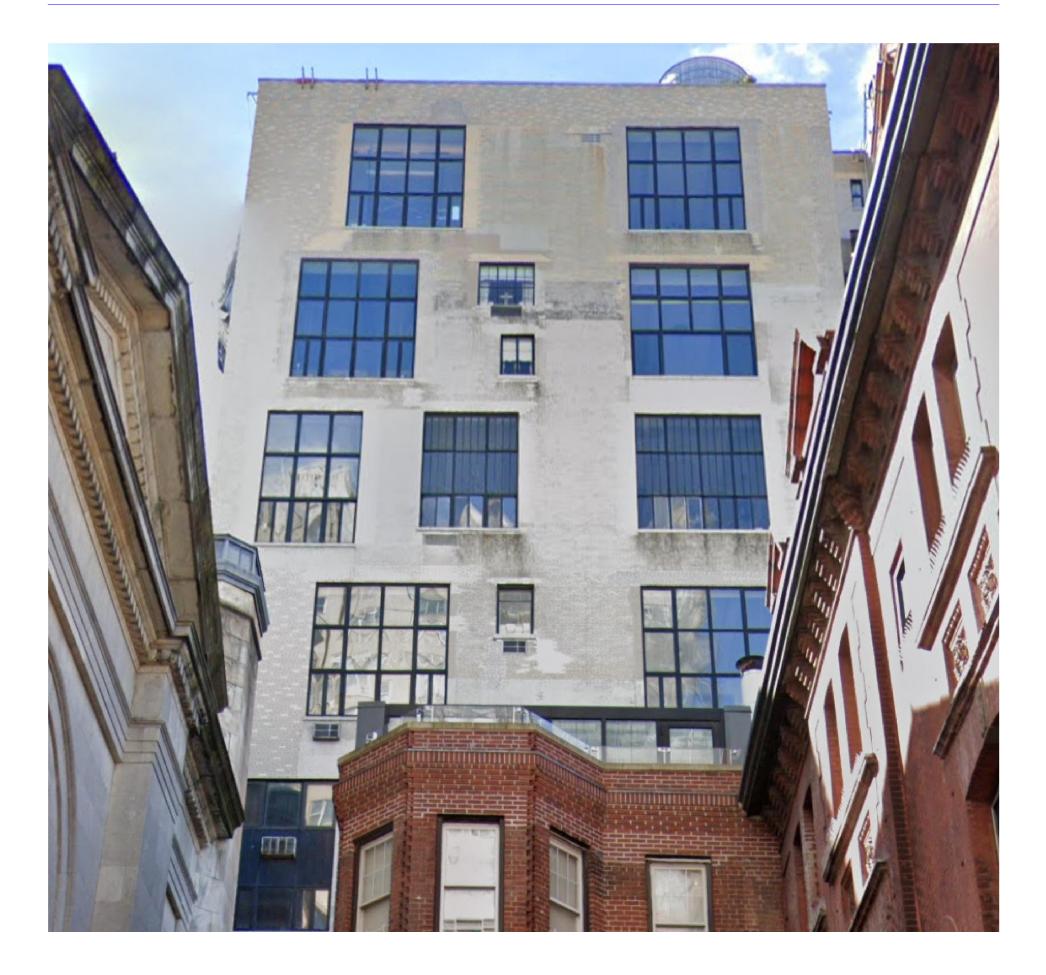

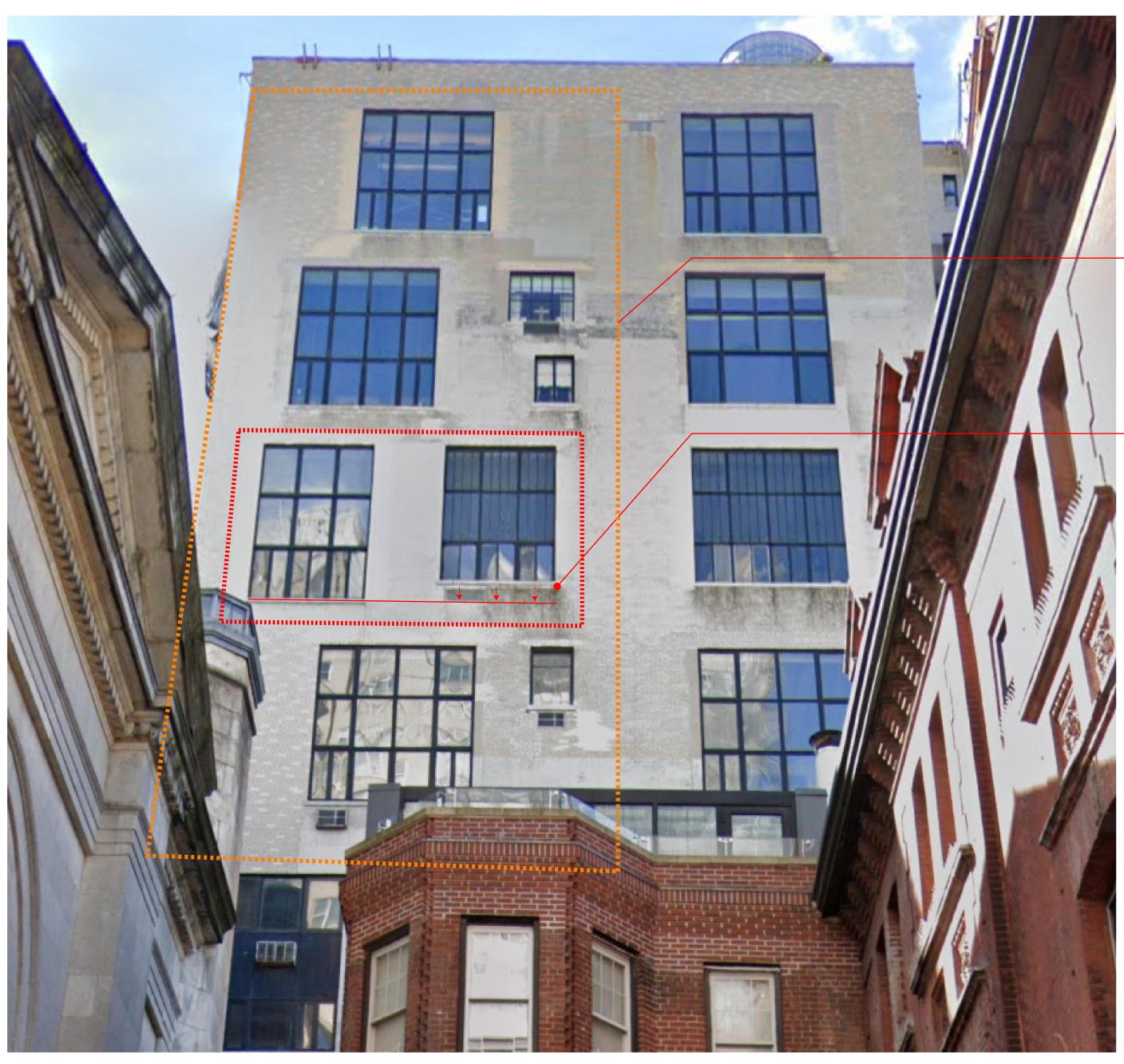

# **701-702 Windows**

- Enlarge the height of the masonry opening to match the immediate adjacent window
- There is little to no uniformity throughout the North facing facade
- The proposed window reverts back to the historic aesthetic as opposed to the rest of the windows on the facade

#### WINDOW CONDITION REPORT

Per the NYC Landmarks Preservation Commission Upper West Side/Central Park West Historic District Designation Report (1990), **1 West 67**<sup>th</sup> **Street** was constructed between 1915 and 1918 of neo-Gothic/ Tudor style using brick and stone. The original fenestration for this building is described as "multipane casements with transoms/ steel multipane pivoting" windows. Since its construction there have been no major alternations noted on the designation report.

The window(s) in question are located on the North façade of the building, on the 7<sup>th</sup> story. A large portion of this façade is visible from both Central Park West and West 68<sup>th</sup> Street. The residence consists of 10, originally steel casement windows and steel double hung windows, replacement steel windows as well as two, steel, double height casement *studio* windows, of which 2/3 of one of the windows is original. These two windows consist of 3 vertical portions, stack on top of each other. The original configuration consists of:

- Top row of multipane pivoting windows flanking a center fixed window
- Middle row of multipane fixed windows
- Bottom row of single pane casement windows

Currently, one of the two *studio* windows have been replaced in its entirety (using all single lite units). The remaining window's operable (lower row) portion was replaced at the same time.

Panorama recommends the replacement of both windows with new, thermally efficient, steel casement windows matching the historic configuration. The replacement of the partially historic window is necessary as there are many structural and aesthetic flaws which are irreparable.

In addition, it is proposed that the smaller of the two *studio* windows will have its masonry opening enlarged so that the heights of the two windows align. This will allow the alignment of the horizontal mullions across the openings, creating uniformity.

Of the 7 **fully** visible, double height *studio* windows on the North façade, there is only 1 completely historic remaining. Replacing these two windows will not only offer a more structurally sound window, enhance the buildings thermal efficiency, but also help repair the historic aesthetic of the North façade.

Upon further inspection of the window in question, Panorama has found the following:

- 1. Glazing of the historic windows is not consistent
- 2. Essential structural members have rusted beyond repair
- 3. Glazing putty is damaged beyond repair
- 4. Operable units are not historic
