## **May Concerts at Jacobi**

Includes Māori, Latin Jazz and Slavic Performances



**Bronx, New York** – North Bronx Healthcare Network (NBHN) Senior Vice President William P. Walsh announced today that Jacobi Medical Center would be hosting several concert performances in the upcoming month of May. The concerts will reflect different international cultures that span the globe from the Maori (a major Polynesian culture of New Zealand) to Slavic Soul to Latin Jazz. They include the following performances:

- <u>Kahurangi: Maori Dance Theatre of New Zealand</u>, Performing May 14<sup>th</sup> from Noon to 1pm in the Atrium (Building 8).
- <u>Chris Washburne and the Syotos Latin Jazz Band</u>, Performing May 15<sup>th</sup>from Noon to 1pm in the Rotunda, adjacent to the Nurses' Residence (Building 4). This concert will feature songs and lyrics that have been created by Jacobi's own patients and performed by these professional musicians. This is a project of the Medical Center's longstanding partnership with Carnegie Hall.
- <u>Slavic Soul Party and Falu</u>: Performing May 30<sup>th</sup> from Noon to 1pm in the Rotunda. The event will also include Stroke Screenings for those in attendance. This performance is also facilitated through the Carnegie Hall partnership.

Said Mr. Walsh "We encourage our patients, neighbors and partners in the community to come out and enjoy these festive and lively events."
