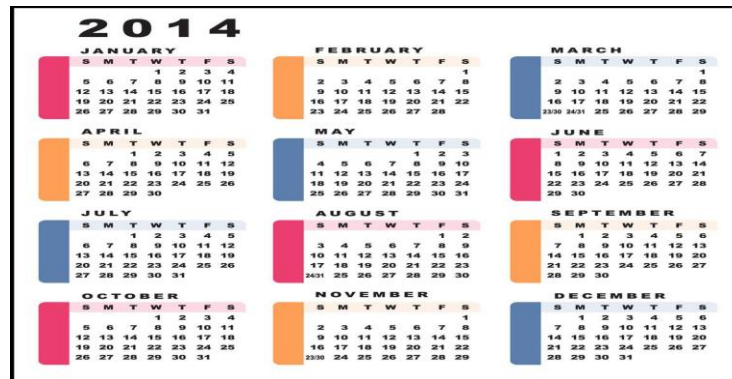

ALTERNATE SIDE PARKING RULES SUSPENSION CALENDAR The City suspends alternate side parking (ASP) rules on legal and religious holidays. On major legal holidays (those with a **), stopping, standing and parking are permitted except in areas where stopping, standing and parking rules are in effect seven days a week (e.g., "No Standing Anytime"). Parking meter regulations are also suspended on major legal holidays. On all other holidays, only street cleaning rules are suspended, all other regulations remain in effect. There are three (3) dates in January 2014: 1/1** (Wed.), 1/20 (Mon.) and 1/31 (Fri.).

The NYC Department of Transportation (DOT) has announced that the 2014 Alternate Side Parking (ASP) Rules Suspension Calendar is now posted on its Web site at <http://www.nyc.gov/html/dot/html/motorist/alternate-side-parking.shtml#cal>, and is available in formats that can be imported into Outlook and now into Google Calendar or iCal-three popular electronic calendar systems on Web-enabled mobile phones and other Portable Data Accessories (PDAs).

HOPE 2013: THE NYC STREET SURVEY On January 27, 2014, the NYC Department of Homeless Services will conduct the Homeless Outreach Population Estimate (HOPE). We need thousands of volunteers to canvass parks, subways, and other public spaces to count the number of people living unsheltered in the city. Just one night of your time will help us collect vital information that is used by outreach teams to help homeless people leave the streets for a better life. 3,000 NEW YORKERS NEEDED...The information gathered by volunteers during HOPE 2014 is critical to our ongoing efforts, but we need your help to make it possible. We need more than 3,000 volunteers, who are 18 years-old or older, to give just one night of their time to help count the number of New Yorkers living on city streets. We will provide you with all the training you will need to conduct the survey on the night of HOPE plus a quick, convenient online orientation when you register to give you the basics.
