14	Proposed Final Rule regarding Commercial
15	Waste Zones Implementation and Maximum
16	Rate Cap. Pursuant to these prepared
17	rules, the Commission proposes to modify
18	a number of its rules effecting trade
19	waste licensees once particular waste
20	zones are implemented. Specifically, in
21	these rules, the Commission identifies
22	which sections of the BIC rules will no
23	longer apply to carters within
24	designated Commercial Waste Zones.
25	The Commission further proposes to

modify traffic safety reporting rules that effect trade waste and licensees and registrants. These rules are no longer necessary since the Commission's authority was expanded to include traffic safety requirements for vehicles used in the collection, removal transportation or disposal of trade waste.

> The Commission is also proposing to require the surrender of Commissioner-issued trade waste license plates upon the disposition of a vehicle that has been issued such plates. proposed rules also clarify the recycling requirements for self-hauler registrants.

> The final the Commission is proposing to an increase in the maximum rate that a licensee may charge for the collection, removal, disposal or recycling of trade waste to \$26.87 per cubic yard and \$17.64 per 100 pounds. On July 9, 2024, the Commission held

1 a public hearing on the proposed rules. 2 3 The Commission considered the public's 4 comments and determined that no changes to the rules as originally proposed were 5 6 necessary. 7 The proposed rule change is now up for a vote as to whether it should be 8 9 adopted. If the Commission votes yes to 10 adopt the proposed change, the final 11 rule will be published and will go into 12 effect 30 days after application. 13 Do any of the Commissioners have any 14 questions or comments regarding the 15 proposed final rule? 16 (No response.) 17 MS. STATZ: Seeing none. Commission will now vote on these rules. 18 19 If the Commission votes yes, the 20 rules will be adopted. If the 21 Commission votes no, the rules will not 22 be adopted. If there is a motion from 23 the Commissioners to adopt the proposed 2.4 rules? 25 MR. NUNEZ: Yes.
