Action Items

Create a resource book listing services available to the LGBTQ community that committee members can provide to individuals who reach out.

Reach out to LGBTQ clubs and groups at local colleges and high schools to collaborate and share resources.

Attend the annual GSA conference hosted by the Department of Education and bring a group from the community. (Speaker 2 will provide the conference date)

Reach out to schools in the district to identify if they have LGBTQ clubs or groups, or interest in starting one, and offer the committee as a resource.

Plan an all-ages prom for LGBTQ individuals who missed prom. Research funding opportunities.

Create a shared document to compile resources available to the LGBTQ community.

Schedule a visit to The Door to collaborate and learn about their services.
