Immigration services and resources in NYC.

- Policy Director Rebecca Engel from Mayor's Office of Immigration Affairs discusses how MOIA is collaborating with the community.

- Community support crucial for refugees' survival in new country.

Action Items

Distribute flyer on local public library resources and English classes.

Schedule follow up meeting to provide job training and workforce integration support.

Address issues with inadequate shelter conditions and lack of support for migrants.

Provide contact information for legal assistance organizations in each borough to help with criminal/immigration issues.

Accompany individuals to appointments and help orient them to available resources.

Develop a support system within the community to help individuals navigate services.
