A. Update on neighboring community fire at 388 East 181st Street:

- 2. The Mayor's Fund to Advance New York City announced the launch of the Bronx Fire Relief Fund to support those affected by the recent apartment building fire in the Bronx. Those impacted by the fire on January 9th face a variety of associated costs. The Bronx Fire Relief Fund will provide them with financial relief as they recover and rebuild. 100% of donations will go directly towards supporting families impacted.

B. COVID Testing sites in the Bronx:

- 1. Click to find a testing site near you, or text "COVID TEST" to 855-48.
- 2. You can get a free at-home COVID-19 test mailed to your home. Every home in the U.S. is eligible to order 4 free at-home COVID-19 tests. The tests are completely free. <u>Click here to order.</u>
- 3. At-home testing for COVID-19 is now available to all immunocompromised New Yorkers and those ages 65 and older. To schedule an in-home appointment, call (929) 298-9400 between 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM (7 days a week).
- 4. All New Yorkers should get tested now, whether or not you have symptoms or are at increased risk. Your COVID-19 diagnostic test may be conducted using a nasal swab, oral swab, or saliva sample.

C. Winter Weather guidance

- 1. <u>PlowNYC</u> is to allow the public to: (1) track the progress of DSNY spreader/plow vehicles; and (2) confirm the snow designation of City streets.
- D. The most up-to-date guidance on the Evictions Moratorium: the Emergency Rental Assistance Program and Illegal Lockouts can be found on the Mayor's Office to Protect Tenants (MOPT) COVID-19 FAQ.

E. Community Updates:

- 1. January 19, 2022 at 6:45pm Officers responded to a call at E.198 street and Bainbridge avenue and discovered a 11month female shot once in the face. The Victim was removed to St Barnabas hospital and then transported to Cornell Hospital for further treatment. The 11 month old is in critical but stable condition. The 52pct Detective squad is currently investigating this shooting.
- 2. We are getting a Stabilization Bed Facility at 2287 University Avenue
 - a) Capacity/population: 59 Single Adults
 - b) Nonprofit service provider: Acacia
 - c) This location has been previously utilized to provide shelter to adult families without minor children.
 - d) Stabilization bed facilities provide specialized services in transitional housing settings and serve as an important step towards helping individuals experiencing unsheltered homelessness accept services and transition off the streets. These locations are equipped with on-site resources, including health and mental health services, and compassionate staff who work closely with these New Yorkers to build the trust and relationships needed to help them stabilize their lives. These facilities are a vital tool for outreach teams when engaging unsheltered New Yorkers, providing a low-barrier housing

option to a population that may not be ready for or may not be best served by more traditional transitional housing settings.

3. Kingsbridge Underpass

We will continue to push for the temporary closure in order to provide the local residents a better quality of life while still providing health services to those individuals who may have been using the underpass to sell or use illegal substances.
