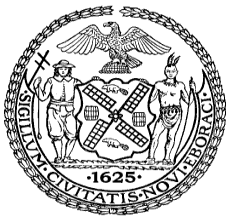
A. Police Department, NYPD Update

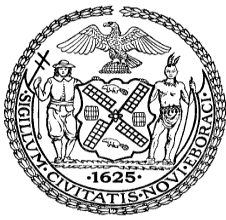

 - c) Robberies are mostly due to mopeds, where if they have no plates or are chained to a pole, then they will be stolen.

 - (1) Body keeps the score through mental and physical ways
 - (2) “Flipped Lid” is when someone is always feeling threatened; always in survival mode
- d) Trauma-informed approaches
 - (1) Be aware of how you interact with individuals
 - (2) Build trust and focus on environmental issues
 - (3) Educate organizations on what trauma and trauma-informed can do to help interactions between people

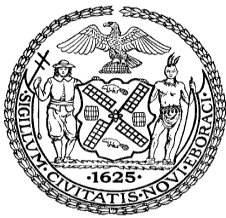

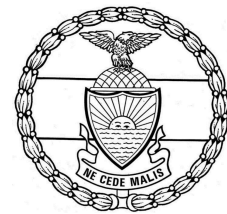

* Uniform Crime Reporting ("UCR") Rape consists of all crimes defined in the FBI UCR definition of rape.

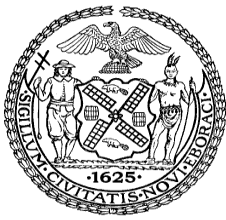

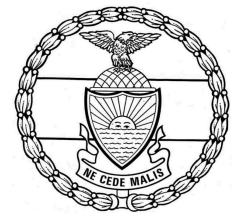

Universal Precaution is recognizing that trauma is most likely in the room, and intentionally responding through the way we do our work to neutralize the environment with individuals.




WORLDVIEW → EXPERIENCE → PERCEPTION → TRAUMA

THE EFFECTS OF TRAUMA


Trauma and adversity impact the body and the brain, including our core beliefs and world view.




Physical & Mental Health
Eating and sleeping difficulties, chronic pain, depression, anxiety, suicide, etc.




Relationships
Difficulty forming and keeping close relationships, trusting others, and maintaining healthy boundaries




Cognitive Functioning
May have trouble concentrating, making decisions, processing and remembering information, etc.



Emotional Regulation
Difficulty regulating the intensity and duration of emotions.



Behavior
Linked with impulsive and self-destructive behaviors, substance use, risky sexual behaviors, etc.















Perceptions & Beliefs
Self and world view changes, often regarding safety, trust, identity & self-esteem.



• Providing clear and consistent information




CHOICE

• Providing an individual with options in their treatment



COLLABORATION
Partnership | Feedback | Preferences
• Making decisions together



EMPOWERMENT
Validation | Growth | Solutions
• Noticing capabilities in an individual
