 Buildings.

IX. Committee Reports -

A. Environment & Sanitation – Betty Arce

- 1. Organic Curbside Composting coming to the borough 10/6.
- 2. Residences with 1-9 apartments will have to containerize their garbage.
- 3. Committee Members reviewed the budget requests and were unhappy with all the negative responses. The issue of dirty catch basins was discussed and a new community resident said in Seattle, they are using removable grates on their catch basins. The committee will explore this information.
- 4. The need for more enforcement of trash disposal and keeping sidewalks clean was discussed at length.
- 5. The next Sanitation meeting will be Wednesday, November 6th due to Election Day being on Tuesday, when we normally meet. DSNY will be presenting to discuss the October changes.
- 6. There is on-line training for building owners and superintendents on the October changes.

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C. Traffic & Transportation – Edgar Ramos
