Census

- Judith Hertzberg from Persist! NYC joined the meeting as a guest and shared outreach and marketing materials for engaging the community census counting efforts.
- Brooklyn was the most undercounted urban area in 2010. Accurate count is important because it impacts federal funding for services, business decisions to move to a community, municipal services such as bus routes, and even things like cellular tower placement.
- It is imperative that CB9 residents are accurately reflected, regardless of documentation status. In 2010, only 54% of Brooklynites self-responded.
- This will be the first year that the census will be available to file online.
- All children born by April 1, 2020 should be counted.
- Persist is working on getting materials translated into Haitian- Creole.
- The Health and Social Services Committee will continue to lead efforts for counting in the community focusing on Churches, Senior Centers, Stores, Marketing, Apartment Complexes and Kings County Hospital.

Committee Projects / Old Business

- HSS will partner with Kings County Hospital and provide volunteer assistance at a Mental Health Symposium to be held at Brooklyn Borough Hall on Friday May 1st from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm (volunteers will work from 3:00 pm 7:00 pm). This symposium will feature doctors, Eric Adams and a panel of guests and will discuss depression, anxiety, self-harm, suicide and addiction.
- HSS will begin planning for a Community Health Forum to be held in the summer.
