 - a. Flatbush Commercial District Needs Assessment
 - i. 2021 a group of Flatbush community organizations received grants to conduct a Commercial District Needs Statement
 - ii. Merchant and Consumer surveys conducted; 300 business owners and 312 consumers
 - iii. Findings
 - 1. Residents and owners agree that Flatbush is special accessibility, diversity, affordability
 - 2. Need for more community activities, landscaping and beautification and sanitation monitoring supported by merchants and consumers
 - 3. 80% of merchants saw profits declined during COVID-19
 - 4. Merchant concerns crime/safety; lack of parking lease/rent prices; low foot traffic and access to foot traffic
 - 5. Merchants want information on credit and financing; support on landlord/tenant issues
 - 6. 12% store front vacancy; Storefront conditions 61% in Excellent/good; 28% fair; 11% poor
 - 7. 50% of consumers shop on Flatbush at least 2-4 times a week

- 8. 60% of shoppers walk or take the bus
- 9. Most live in Flatbush and prefer to shop on weekdays.
