### LOFT BOARD

#### ■ NOTICE

##### NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF FINAL RULES

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN THE NEW YORK CITY LOFT BOARD** by Article 7-C of the Multiple Dwelling Law and Mayor's Executive Order No. 129, dated May 22, 2009, and pursuant to and in accordance with the requirements of Section 1043 of the New York City Charter, that the New York City Loft Board intends to amend section 2-01 of Title 29 of the Rules of the City of New York, to add a section under which the Loft Board may object to the issuance of the work permit by the Department of Buildings.

A duly noticed public hearing was held on September 16, 2010, affording the public opportunity to comment on the proposed amendments, as required by Section 1043 of the New York City Charter. Written comments were accepted through September 16, 2010.

Subdivision (d) of section 2-01 of Title 29 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new paragraph (4), to read as follows:

##### (4) Requirement of a Letter of No Objection for Work Permits in IMD Buildings

(A) Proposed Work in Non-IMD Spaces: An owner of an IMD building who is applying to the New York City Department of Buildings ("DOB") for a permit to perform work in the non-IMD spaces of such building, (including any commercial space or residential space not covered by Article 7-C of the MDL), must first provide DOB with a letter of no objection ("LONO") from the Loft Board.

(B) Proposed Work in the IMD Spaces: Any request for a LONO by or on behalf of the owner for work to be performed in the IMD spaces will be processed by the Loft Board as an amendment to the building's narrative statement and the Loft Board certified legalization plans pursuant to paragraph (2) of this subdivision.

(C) Requirements to Obtain a Letter of No Objection:

1. In order to be granted a LONO, a building owner must demonstrate compliance with the annual registration requirements set forth in § 2-11, and all outstanding fees and fines payable to the Loft Board for the subject building must be paid.
2. The LONO request shall consist of:
  - a. a request on such form as may be prescribed by the Loft Board;
  - b. a copy of the current month's monthly report relating to the legalization projects in the building, in accordance with the terms set forth in § 2-01.1(a)(ii) herein;
  - c. a copy of the alteration application (PW-1 form) filed with DOB;

- d. a copy of the DOB objection sheet listing the only remaining DOB objection to be the requirement to obtain a LONO from the Loft Board; and
- e. a stamped copy of the corresponding drawings/plans filed with DOB, on paper no larger than 11 inches wide by 17 inches long.

3. The Loft Board's staff will not consider an incomplete request for a LONO.

4. The Loft Board's staff may request additional information or documentation, as it deems necessary in its review of the LONO request. If the owner does not respond to the Loft Board staff's request within ten (10) calendar days, the request for a LONO will be deemed to be withdrawn.

5. The Loft Board's staff may deny a LONO request for the proposed work where:

- a. the owner does not have an open alteration application filed with DOB to perform the legalization work of the IMD spaces;
- b. the Loft Board issued a certification of the legalization work in the IMD spaces pursuant to subparagraph (vii) of paragraph (2) of this subdivision, and the owner does not have a current permit to perform the legalization work in such IMD spaces;
- c. DOB had issued a temporary certificate of occupancy for the residential portion of the subject building before the owner applied for a LONO, and the temporary certificate of occupancy expired and has not been renewed;
- d. the owner's monthly reports as set forth in § 2-01.1(a)(ii) show no advancement of legalization projects in the building. The Loft Board's staff may supplement its review of owner's monthly reports to consider any relevant information in the Loft Board's files;
- e. the subject IMD building already has a final certificate of occupancy, but the owner has not applied to the Loft Board for removal;
- f. the owner applied to the Loft Board for removal of the subject building prior to filing the LONO request, but the owner has not exercised all diligent efforts to submit additional information that was requested by the Loft Board's staff for processing the removal application; or
- g. any other circumstance exists that indicates to the Loft Board's staff that the owner has failed to take all reasonable and necessary action to obtain a final certificate of occupancy for the residential portions of the IMD spaces to legalize the subject building.

6. Granting of a LONO is not a finding by the Loft Board that the owner is exercising all reasonable and necessary action toward obtaining a final certificate of occupancy for the residential portions of the IMD spaces to legalize the subject building.

(D) Nature of the Proposed Work. In granting a LONO request, the Loft Board staff may consider the effect the proposed work may have on the IMD spaces and the protected occupants of the building. If the proposed work would (1) result in a change in the use, egress, buildings' systems, or occupancy of IMD space in the building, or (2) affect an IMD unit in which there is an active dispute or finding of harassment by the Loft Board, or (3) adversely affect any protected occupants of the IMD spaces in the building, the Loft Board's staff may decide to conduct an informal conference with the protected occupants and the owner upon fifteen (15) calendar days notice to discuss the proposed work's effect on the occupants. Service of conference notice shall be by mail.

(E) Appeal of Decision.

1. If the Loft Board's staff denies a LONO request, the owner may appeal to the Executive Director for an administrative determination.
2. To be considered timely, the appeal to the Executive Director must be received by the Loft Board within fifteen (15) calendar days from the mailing date of the LONO's denial. An untimely

appeal is subject to dismissal by the Executive Director. The appeal to the Executive Director must state:

- a. the basis for the appeal;
- b. that requirements for the LONO set forth in subsection (C) above are true, correct and complete as of the date of the appeal;
- c. a detailed report of the current status of the legalization projects; and
- d. a detailed schedule of the work to be performed in connection with achieving compliance with Article 7-B of the MDL, and a projected compliance date, to the extent the building is not yet in compliance therewith.

3. The Executive Director shall issue a written determination within thirty (30) calendar days of its receipt of the request.

4. The Executive Director will not consider any incomplete appeals. Failure to file a complete appeal shall result in rejection of the appeal without consideration of the issues raised.

5. Appeals from the written determination of the Executive Director shall be governed in accordance with § 1-07.1 herein.

##### Statement of Basis and Purpose:

Pursuant to § 282 of Article 7-C of the MDL ("Loft Law"), the Loft Board may promulgate rules to ensure compliance with the Loft Law. This proposed rule seeks to address a Loft Board concern that IMD owners may focus on revenue-generating projects in a building at the expense of legalizing the IMD spaces. The Loft Board proposes to add a new paragraph (4) to subdivision (d) of 29 RCNY § 2-01, setting forth a procedure by which the Loft Board may prevent the proposed work from being performed in the non-IMD space of an IMD building when an IMD owner is not in compliance with the Loft Board's rules, and/or when the Loft Board finds that the legalization work in the IMD space is not progressing.

##### Notice of Promulgation of Rules

**Notice is hereby given in accordance with section 1043(b) of the Charter of the City of New York ("Charter") that the Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC") promulgates rules governing retirement rules for black cars and creating an incentive to use vehicles that meet clean air for-hire vehicle standards as black cars.**

These rules are promulgated pursuant to sections 1043 and 2303(b)(11) of the Charter and section 19-503 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York.

These rules were published on August 10, 2010, for public comment in The City Record. On September 16, 2010, a public hearing was held by the TLC at its offices at 40 Rector Street, 5th Floor, New York, New York 10006. Pursuant to section 1043(e)(1)(c) of the Charter, these rules will take effect 30 days following publication in The City Record.

New material is underlined.

[Material inside brackets indicates deleted material.]

Section 1. Section 6-09 of Chapter 6 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§6-09 [Black Car Vehicle Specifications] Black Car Service: Line Work.

[(a) Beginning on January 1, 2010, no vehicle that is the subject of a new application for a for-hire vehicle permit shall be affiliated with a black car base unless the for-hire vehicle meets either the requirements of an accessible vehicle pursuant to section 6-07(f) of this chapter or section 3-03.2 of this title, or has a minimum city rating of twenty-five (25) miles per gallon as labeled pursuant to title 49, section 32908 of the United States Code and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto. For purposes of this subdivision, an application for a for-hire vehicle permit after a previous permit has expired will be considered a new application. For-hire vehicles that are affiliated with luxury limousine or livery bases are not subject to the requirements of this subdivision.

(b) Beginning on January 1, 2011, no vehicle that is the subject of a new application for a for-hire vehicle permit shall be affiliated with a black car base unless the for-hire vehicle meets either the requirements of an accessible vehicle pursuant to section 6-07(f) of this chapter or section 3-03.2 of this title, or has a minimum city rating of thirty (30) miles per gallon as labeled pursuant to title 49, section 32908 of the United States Code and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto. For purposes of this subdivision, an application for a for-hire vehicle permit after a previous permit has expired will be considered a new application. For-hire vehicles that are affiliated with luxury limousine or livery bases are not subject to the requirements of this subdivision.

(c) Only black car bases may dispatch vehicles to do line

work and only for-hire vehicles that are affiliated with black car bases may perform line work.

Section 2. Section 6-10 of Chapter 6 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

**§6-10 [Affiliation with Black Car Bases] Retirement of For-Hire Vehicles in Black Car Service.**

(a) [All for-hire vehicles affiliated with black car bases that are model year 2001 or earlier must be retired from black car service no later than the expiration dates of their for-hire vehicle permits on and after January 1, 2010.

(b) All for-hire vehicles affiliated with black car bases that are model year 2003 or earlier must be retired from black car service no later than the expiration dates of their for-hire vehicle permits on and after January 1, 2011.

[(c) (b) All for-hire vehicles affiliated with black car bases that are model year 2005 or earlier must be retired from black car service no later than the expiration dates of their for-hire vehicle permits on and after January 1, 2012.

[(d) (c) All for-hire vehicles affiliated with black car bases that are model year 2006 or earlier must be retired from black car service no later than the expiration dates of their for-hire vehicle permits on and after January 1, 2013]; provided, however, a for-hire vehicle that is six model years old upon its permit expiration on and after January 1, 2013, shall not be affiliated with a black car base after one year following such renewal].

[(e) (d) All for-hire vehicles affiliated with black car bases that are [seven (7)] six model years old or older and are not specified in subdivisions (a), (b), or (c) [or (d)] of this section must be retired from black car service no later than the expiration dates of their for-hire vehicle permits on and after January 1, 2014 [and every year thereafter; provided that a for-hire vehicle that is [six] five model years old upon its permit renewal on or after January 1, 2014 shall not be affiliated with a black car base after one year following such renewal].

(e) All for-hire vehicles affiliated with black car bases that are five model years old or older and are not specified in subdivisions (a), (b), (c) or (d) of this section must be retired from black car service no later than the expiration dates of their for-hire vehicle permits on and after January 1, 2015 and every year thereafter.

(f) [A for-hire vehicle affiliated with a black car base which has reached its retirement date must be retired from black car service regardless of whether it passes the New York State Department of Motor Vehicle inspection.] (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivisions (a) though (e) of this section 6-10, beginning on January 1, 2011, the retirement date of any vehicle licensed to operate in black car service and affiliated with a black car base that is a level one clean air for-hire vehicle is extended for an additional two model years or that is a level two clean air for-hire vehicle is extended for an additional one model year.

(2) A level one clean air for-hire vehicle is one which receives an air pollution score of 9.5 or higher from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or its successor agency and is estimated to emit 5.0 tons or less of equivalent carbon dioxide per year by the United States Department of Energy (DOE) or its successor agency, provided that such vehicle is powered by the fuel for which such vehicle meets the above-specified standards; and a level two clean air for-hire vehicle is one which receives an air pollution score of 9.0 or higher from the EPA or its successor agency and is estimated to emit 6.4 tons or less of equivalent carbon dioxide per year by the DOE or its successor agency and that does not meet the definition of a level one clean air for-hire vehicle, provided that such vehicle is powered by the fuel for which such vehicle meets the above-specified standards.

[(f) (g) A for-hire vehicle affiliated with a black car base which has reached its retirement date must be retired from black car service, regardless of whether it passes the New York State Department of Motor Vehicle inspection.

Section 3. Subdivision (g) of Section 6-12.1 of Chapter 6 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended, to read as follows:

**§6-12.1 Additional Conditions of Operation of For-Hire Vehicles and Bases.**

A base owner and a for-hire vehicle owner shall each be separately and individually responsible for compliance with the following provisions and liable for penalties for violation thereof.

(g)[(1) To be affiliated with a black car base, a vehicle [owned or leased by a new applicant, beginning January 1, 2010, must meet the requirements set forth in section 6-09 and], beginning January 1, 2011, must meet the requirements set forth in section 6-10 of this chapter. [For purposes of this paragraph (g)(1), a "new applicant" is the owner or lessee of a vehicle who does not hold a current for-hire vehicle permit for that vehicle.

(2) To be affiliated with a black car base, a vehicle owned or leased by a renewal applicant, beginning January 1, 2011, must meet the requirements set forth in section 6-10 of this chapter. For purposes of this paragraph (g)(2), a "renewal applicant" is the owner or lessee of a vehicle who holds a current for-hire vehicle permit for that vehicle and is affiliated with a black car base when the application is submitted.]

Section 4. Section 6-22 of Chapter 6 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City is amended by amending the penalty previously labeled §6-09(c) as follows:

**Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rules**

In April 2008, the Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC) promulgated rules requiring new black cars, except for wheelchair accessible vehicles, to achieve fuel efficiency standards of 25 mpg city rating in 2009 and 30 mpg city rating in 2010. The rules were promulgated with the express understanding that, before the rules became effective, the TLC would arrange for financing to assist black car owners in complying with the rules.

After promulgation of those rules, the economic downturn precipitated by the 2008 financial crisis made it impossible for the TLC to arrange the promised financing. As a result,

the TLC three times deferred the effective date of the April 2008 rules – once by rulemaking and twice by industry notice.

The continued unavailability of a financing package for black car owners requires the TLC to devise a new approach. These promulgated rules repeal the 25 and 30 mpg requirements for black cars. Instead, the promulgated rules revise the provisions for retirement of black cars, in three respects.

- Phase in a maximum black car vehicle age of five model years;
- Allow two additional model years for black cars that meet the level one clean air for-hire vehicle standard; and
- Allow one additional model year for black cars that meet the level two clean air for-hire vehicle standard.

The definitions of "level one" and "level two" vehicles are taken from the definitions of "level one clean air taxicab" and "level two clean air taxicab" in section 19-535(a) of the New York City Administrative Code.
