(3) For #zoning lots# in R8 Districts within a #large-scale general development# that is located in or partially within a C6 District, the permitted #floor area ratio# may be increased from 4.88 to 6.5, provided that the amount of #low income floor area# is equal to at least 10 percent of the #residential floor area#, and that the amount of #low income floor area# plus two-thirds of the amount of #moderate income floor area# is equal to at least 20 percent of the #residential floor area#.

For the purposes of this paragraph, (b), inclusive, #low income floor area# may be considered #moderate income floor area#, and #moderate income floor area# may be considered #middle income floor area#.

Location of a Accessory parking spaces and loading berths**

For a #large-scale general development# the City Planning Commission may permit:

(a) Modification of location requirements

When a #large-scale general development# includes two or more #zoning lots#, the City Planning Commission may permit required or permitted #accessory# off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking spaces or loading berths to be located anywhere within a #large-scale general development# without regard for #zoning lot lines#, provided that the Commission shall find:

- (1) such off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking spaces and loading berths will be conveniently located in relation to the #use# to which such spaces or berths are #accessory#;
- (2) such location of off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking spaces and loading berths will result in a better site plan; and
- (3) such location of off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking spaces and loading berths will not unduly increase the number of spaces in any single #block#, draw excessive traffic through local #streets#, or otherwise adversely affect traffic conditions in the surrounding area.

Whenever required off-street parking spaces, bicycle parking spaces and loading berths are permitted to be located without regard for #zoning lot lines# in accordance with the provisions of this Section, the number of spaces required for each #building# shall be kept available for such #building# throughout its life.

(b) Waiver or reduction of loading berth requirements

When a #zoning lot# in a #large scale general development#, that is located within a waterfront area pursuant to Section 62-132(b), in Community District 1 in Brooklyn, contains one or more #retail or service uses# listed in Use Group 6A, 6C, 7B, 8B, 9A, 10A, 12B, 14A or 16A, and where no single such establishment exceeds 8,500 square feet in #floor area#, the City Planning Commission may waive the requirement for loading berths, or reduce the number of required loading berths, provided that:

- (1) curbside deliveries will not create or contribute to serious traffic congestion or unduly inhibit vehicular or pedestrian movement and will not interfere with the efficient functioning of nearby #uses#;
- (2) an efficient goods receiving system will be implemented within the #commercial# establishment to expedite the movement of goods from the curb to areas within the establishment;
- (3) such modification allows for a better relationship of the #street walls# of the #building# containing such establishment with the sidewalks and surrounding area; and
- (4) such modification will not impair or adversely affect the development of the surrounding area.

The City Planning Commission may prescribe additional conditions and safeguards to minimize adverse effects on the surrounding area.

In Area C, the regulations of the underlying districts shall apply, except as otherwise set forth in this Section, inclusive. The boundaries of Northern Subarea C1 and Western Subarea C2 are shown on the District Map in Appendix A of this Chapter.

Special Regulations in Northern Subarea C1**

Within Area C1-1 within Northern Subarea C1, as shown on the map in Appendix A of this Chapter, the following special #use# and Inclusionary Housing regulations shall apply.

(a) Inclusionary Housing Program

The boundaries of the #Inclusionary Housing designated area# within the #Special Clinton District# are shown on Map 2 in Manhattan Community District 4, in Appendix F of this Resolution. Such area shall be an #Inclusionary Housing designated area#, pursuant to Section 12-10 (DEFINITIONS), for the purpose of making the Inclusionary Housing Program regulations of Section 23-90, inclusive, applicable as modified within the Special District.

The maximum base #floor area ratio# for #zoning lots# containing #residences# shall be 9.0 plus the product of 0.25 multiplied by the non-#residential floor area ratio# provided on the #zoning lot#, but shall not exceed 10.0. Such #floor area ratio# may be increased to a maximum of 12.0 only through the provision of #affordable housing#, pursuant to Section 23-90, inclusive.

The height and setback regulations of paragraph (a) of Section 23-954 (Additional requirements for compensated developments) shall not apply. In lieu thereof, the height and setback regulations of the underlying district shall apply.

(b) Special #use# regulations

The following #uses# shall be permitted below the level of the lowest floor occupied by #dwelling units#:

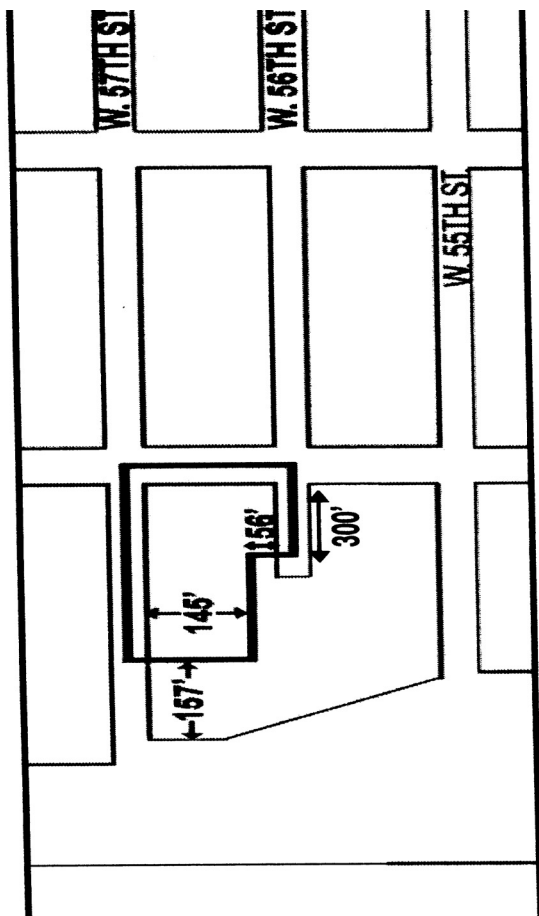
- (1) automobile showrooms or sales with preparation of automobiles for delivery; and
- (2) automobile repairs.

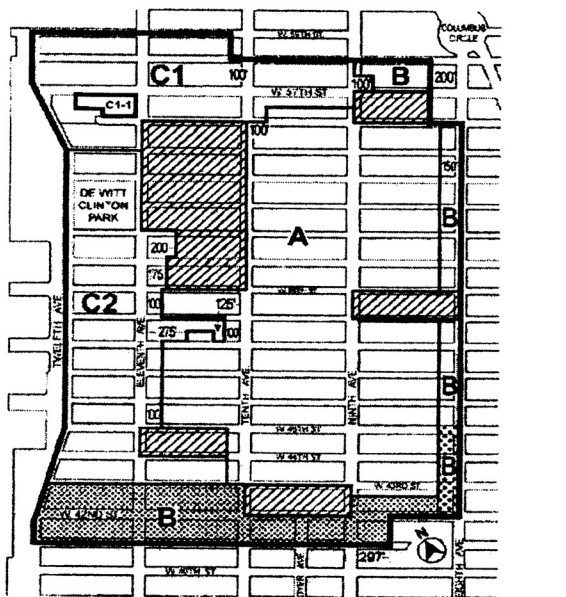

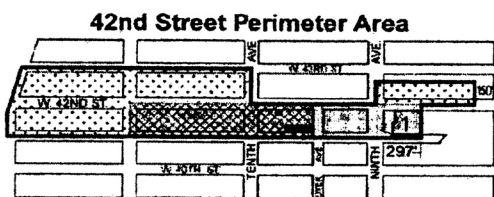
C1-1: Special Use Regulations Area



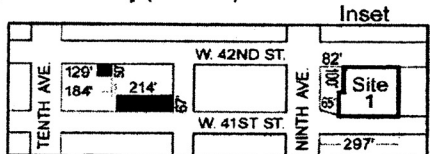
Appendix A - Special Clinton District Map (96A)

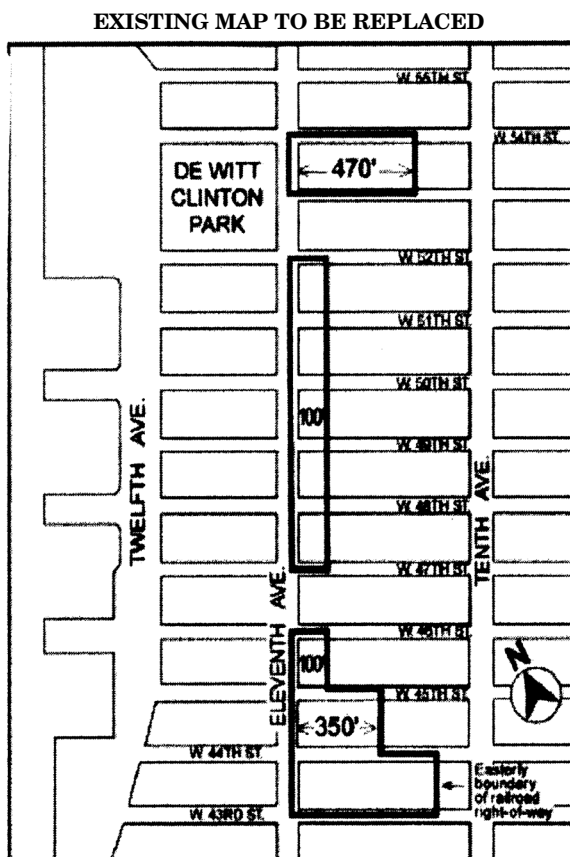

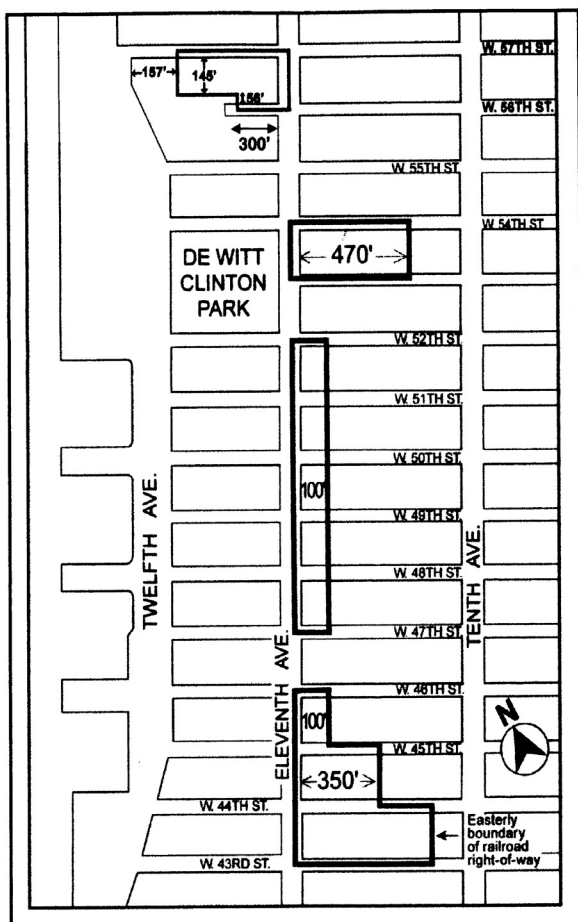

On Wednesday, January 22, 2014, at 10:00 A.M., in Spector Hall, at the Department of City Planning, 22 Reade Street, in Lower Manhattan, a public hearing is being held by the City Planning Commission in conjunction with the above ULURP hearing to receive comments related to a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) concerning a rezoning of a portion of Manhattan block 1104 (Lots 25, 29, 31, 36, 40, 44 and 55), along with related land use actions that include text amendments, a special permit and a zoning authorization. The affected area is located within the "Other Area" (Northern Subarea C1) in the Special Clinton District of Manhattan Community District 4. The proposed actions would facilitate a proposal by the applicant to develop a new, mixed use building of

up to approximately 1.2 million gross square feet (gsf) including 1,189 residential apartments, approximately 42,000 gsf of ground-floor local retail uses, and 500 below-grade parking spaces (or an alternate garage configuration that would provide up to 395 spaces). Twenty percent of residential floor area (up to 238 units) would be affordable. Written comments on the DEIS are requested and would be received and considered by the Lead Agency through Monday, February 3, 2014.

The City Planning Commission (CPC), acting as lead agency, issued a Notice of Completion on October 18, 2013 for a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the proposed 606 West 57th Street Rezoning in accordance with Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law. A public hearing on the DEIS will be held on Wednesday, January 22, 2014, at 10:00 A.M. in Spector Hall, at the Department of City Planning located at 22 Reade Street, New York, New York 10007, in conjunction with the City Planning Commission's citywide public hearing pursuant to ULURP. Comments are requested on the DEIS and will be accepted until Monday, February 3, 2014.

The DEIS analyzes a proposal by the Applicant, 606 W. 57 LLC to rezone a portion (Lots 25, 29, 31, 36, 40, 44 and 55) of Manhattan block 1104, which is bounded by West 56th and West 57th Streets and Eleventh and Twelfth Avenues (the "affected area" or "project block"), along with related land use actions that include text amendments, a special permit and a

zoning authorization. The affected area is located within the "Other Area" (Northern Subarea C1) in the Special Clinton District of Manhattan Community District 4. The proposed actions, which are described in detail below, would facilitate the development of a new, mixed use building of up to approximately 1.2 million gross square feet (gsf) on the parcels that are controlled by the applicant (the "proposed project site," or "development site 1").

The proposed actions would facilitate a proposal by the applicant to develop a mixed use building containing up to 1,189 dwelling units, ground-floor local retail uses up to 42,000 gsf, and up to 500 below-grade parking spaces (or an alternate garage configuration that would provide up to 395 spaces). Twenty percent of residential floor area (up to 238 units) would be affordable. These uses would be developed on the proposed project site, which consists of Block 1104 Lots 31, 40, 44, and 55 ("development site 1"). It is assumed that the proposed actions would also result in the redevelopment of two other lots on the block, lots 25 and 29 ("development site 2"), which are non-applicant owned. It is projected that these properties would be developed with an approximately 117,612 gsf hotel. Collectively, this development scenario is referred to in the DEIS as the Reasonable Worst-Case Development Scenario (RWCDs) 1. It is anticipated that development would be complete by 2017.

The proposed actions would permit a range of project characteristics, or development scenarios, to occur on development site 1 even though the actions are being sought in order to facilitate a specific development described above. Therefore, an additional development scenario was identified for environmental review purposes that considers an alternate mix of uses on the site, referred to as "RWCDs 2." Since a Restrictive Declaration is expected to control building massing and design on development site 1, the alternative development differs in terms of the mix of uses, but remains the same with regard to design and massing. As with RWCDs 1, development site 1 would consist of a 1.2 million gsf mixed use building under RWCDs 2. However RWCDs 2 could include approximately 848 residential units (of which up to 170 would be affordable) and could include up to 500 parking spaces, along with approximately 185,000 gsf of hotel (285 rooms), 35,000 gsf of local retail, 75,000 gsf of destination retail, and 30,000 gsf of medical office space.

Development of the proposed project requires approvals from the City Planning Commission (CPC) for the following discretionary actions: Rezoning of a portion of the block bounded by West 56th Street, West 57th Street, Eleventh Avenue and Twelfth Avenue in Manhattan from the existing M2-3 and M1-5 districts to a C4-7 commercial district; An amendment to Zoning Resolution (ZR) Appendix F to designate the rezoning area an Inclusionary Housing (IH)-designated area; A text amendment to ZR §96-34, to provide that 20 percent of the residential floor area be affordable housing; achieve the floor area bonus which facilitates more than one floor of commercial uses; and to allow an automotive showroom with repairs; A special permit pursuant to ZR §13-45 for a public parking garage that would contain up to 500 spaces; an Authorization pursuant to ZR §13-441 to permit a curb cut on a wide street. In addition, the applicant may apply for the New York State Housing Finance Agency's (HFA) "80/20" program to finance the affordable housing component.

Three Alternatives were considered in the DEIS: a No-Action Alternative, which assumes none of the proposed actions would be adopted; a Lower Density Alternative that considers a C6-3X zoning designation and development with no affordable housing component; and a No Impact Alternative that would reduce the size of the development such that there would be no potential for significant adverse impacts. These alternatives would not achieve some or all of the project goals as identified by the applicant.

The proposed actions are expected to result in significant adverse impacts related to community facilities (child care) and transportation. Mitigation measures will be further explored between the DEIS and FEIS. Absent the implementation of mitigation measures, the proposed actions could have unmitigated significant adverse impacts.

Wheelchair using passengers. The proposed change to the rule would require medallion owners to remit payment of the Taxi Accessibility Fee to the Taxi and Limousine Commission instead of making payment to the Accessible Taxi Dispatcher.

This proposed rule was not included in the Commission's regulatory agenda for this Fiscal Year because the need for it was not contemplated when the Commission published the agenda.

Where can I find the Commission's rules? The Commission's rules are in title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? The Commission must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043(b) of the City Charter.

STATEMENT OF BASIS AND PURPOSE OF RULES

The TLC seeks to change how Medallion Owners pay the Taxi Accessibility Fee required by TLC's Accessible Dispatch Program.

After reviewing the first year of operation of the Accessible Dispatch program, the TLC has decided that the Taxi Accessibility Fee paid by Medallion Owners should be paid directly to the TLC instead of to the Accessible Taxi Dispatcher. Payments to the TLC will be placed in a Trust in Agency account. The TLC believes that direct payments to the TLC will make the new payment process more efficient and easier to monitor. The TLC will amend the current agreement with Metro Taxi, Inc. to reflect this change.

The proposed changes to the rules will not alter the original purpose or intent of the current Accessible Dispatch Program. The change only modifies the process for payment of the Taxi Accessibility Fee by medallion owners. The TLC does not anticipate an adverse impact on medallion owners resulting from the payment of this fee to the TLC.

The Commission's authority for these rules is found in section 2303 of the New York City Charter and Section 19-503 of the New York City Administrative Code.

Section 1. The definition of "Taxi Accessibility Fee" set forth in section 51-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§51-03 Definitions

Taxi Accessibility Fee is the fee required by these rules to be paid by Owners, as defined by Chapter 58, to the [Accessible Taxi Dispatcher] Commission to provide accessible service to Wheelchair using Passengers. The Taxi Accessibility Fee shall be set in accordance with the terms of an agreement between the Commission and an approved vendor and will be based on the per medallion cost to the vendor for equipment, administrative expenses associated with operation of the

dispatch system, outreach and Dispatch Fees.

Section 2. The definition of "Taxi Accessibility Fee" set forth in section 53-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§53-03 Definitions

(b) *Taxi Accessibility Fee* is the fee required by these rules to be paid by Owners to the [Accessible Taxi Dispatcher] Commission to provide accessible service to Wheelchair using Passengers. The Taxi Accessibility Fee shall be set in accordance with the terms of an agreement between the Commission and an approved vendor and will be based on the per medallion cost to the vendor for equipment, administrative expenses associated with operation of the dispatch system, outreach and Dispatch Fees.

Section 3. The definition of "Taxi Accessibility Fee" set forth in section 58-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§58-03 Definitions Specific to this Chapter

(a) *Taxi Accessibility Fee* [as used in this Chapter,] is the fee required by these rules to be paid by Owners to the [Accessible Taxi Dispatcher] Commission to provide accessible service to Wheelchair using Passengers. The Taxi Accessibility Fee shall be set in accordance with the terms of an agreement between the Commission and an approved vendor and will be based on the per medallion cost to the vendor for equipment, administrative expenses associated with operation of the dispatch system, outreach and Dispatch Fees.

Section 4. Subdivision (j) of section 58-07 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(j) *Taxi Accessibility Fee.* An Owner must pay the Taxi Accessibility Fee [set by the Accessible Taxi Dispatcher] for each Medallion owned. The Taxi Accessibility Fee must be paid when charged by the Commission.

Section 5. Subdivision (f) of section 58-16 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(f) *Taxi Accessibility Fee.*

(1) An Owner must pay the Taxi Accessibility Fee for each of the Owner's Medallions as required by the [Accessible Taxi Dispatcher] Commission.

(2) The Owner must pay the Taxi Accessibility Fee when required to do so by the [Accessible Taxi Dispatcher] Commission. If the Taxi Accessibility Fee is not paid by the time required by the [Accessible Taxi Dispatcher] Commission, the Owner will be liable for penalties for non-payment.

[(3) If an Owner does not pay the Taxi Accessibility Fee by the time required, non-payment will be grounds for suspension or revocation of the Taxicab license, and/or denial of any renewal application or of any application for another TLC issued license, as well as monetary penalties.]

[(4) An Owner must comply with all requirements of the Accessible Taxi Dispatcher relating to payment of the Taxi Accessibility Fee. An Owner must register with the Accessible Taxi Dispatcher for purposes of billing the Taxi Accessibility Fee and must keep all registration and billing information current.]

KEY TO METHODS OF SOURCE SELECTION

The Procurement Policy Board (PPB) of the City of New York has by rule defined the appropriate methods of source selection for City procurement and reasons justifying their use. The CR procurement notices of many agencies include an abbreviated reference to the source selection method utilized. The following is a list of those methods and the abbreviations used:

HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section.

At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified unless a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed.

The following is a SAMPLE notice and an explanation of the notice format used by the CR.
