#### **Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rules**

In November 2013, the City Council passed Local Law 116 of 2013 ("LL 116"), which amended the City Administrative Code to permit candidates running for offices covered by the Campaign Finance Act ("Act") to accept contributions via text message. The local law also makes text message contributions matchable with public funds, so long as all eligibility requirements under the Campaign Finance Program are met.

To comply with LL 116, the Board is proposing amendments to its rules. The proposed rules set minimum requirements for receiving text message contributions so that the Board can evaluate compliance with the Act and Board rules and eligibility for matching public funds. Specifically, the proposed rules:

- establish that public funds will not be used to match text message contributions until after those contributions are paid via the contributor's phone bill and delivered by a mobile fundraising vendor to a candidate's authorized committee;
- establish record keeping requirements for text message contributions, including records relating to the mobile fundraising vendor, the contributor, and the registered user of the mobile device used to make the contribution; and
- require a contributor to certify that he or she is the registered user of the phone and that the contribution will be made from his or her personal funds.

The proposed amendments do not prescribe any method for candidates to use in accepting text message contributions. The Board welcomes and encourages comments about ways to match contributions earlier in the process, including the feasibility of matching payments from a mobile fundraising vendor before delivery of a contributor's funds to a candidate's authorized committee.

Because the Board cannot anticipate every requirement that may apply to text message contributions, following the adoption of the final rules, the Board will also update training materials and other published guidance to assist candidates in ensuring that their receipt of text message contributions from contributors via mobile fundraising complies with all requirements of the Act and Board rules. For example, if a candidate receives aggregate contributions, whether by text message or other means, totaling more than \$99 from a contributor during an election cycle, the candidate will have to solicit employment information to comply with section 303(c)(4)-(6) of the Board rules. Similarly, if a candidate receives aggregate contributions, whether by text message or other means, from a contributor over an election cycle that reach the "doing business" limits, a candidate will be required to inquire whether the contributor is doing business with New York City in accordance with section 3703(1b) of the City Administrative Code. These and other similar issues will be addressed in training materials.

The Board's authority for these rules is found in sections 1043 and 1052(a)(8) of the City Charter, sections 3-703(1-c), 3-703(1)(g), and 3-708(8) of the City Administrative Code, and section 4 of LL 116.

**§ 2. Subdivision (a) of section 1-04 of chapter 1 of title 52 of the rules of the city of New York is amended to read as follows:**

(a) **Receipt.** A monetary contribution is received on the date it is delivered. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a text message contribution is received on the date it is delivered to an authorized committee by a wireless carrier or other mobile fundraising vendor. An in-kind contribution is received on the date the goods or services are received or rendered. Candidates must report the date of receipt of each contribution that is accepted and deposited on disclosure statements filed with the Board.

**§ 3. Paragraph (4) of subdivision (b) of section 4-01 of chapter 4 of title 52 of the rules of the city of New York is amended to read as follows:**

(4) **[Omitted.] Text message contributions.** Whenever a candidate accepts a text message contribution, the candidate must maintain:

- (a) copies of all relevant third-party vendor agreements between



the candidate and mobile fundraising vendor, copies of records maintained by a mobile fundraising vendor listing contributors and amounts pledged and paid, receipts indicating fees paid by the candidate to a mobile fundraising vendor and fees deducted by such vendor, and similar records relating to the solicitation or receipt of text message contributions;

(b) records demonstrating:

- (1) the contributor's name, residential address, and phone number,
- (2) the amount of the contribution,
- (3) the name and residential address of the registered user of the specific mobile device used to initiate the contribution, to the extent that such information may be reasonably obtained under law; and
- (4) that the contributor has certified via text message the following statement: "I certify I am the registered user of this phone and will personally pay the amount specified from my own funds.";

(c) copies of any content used by the candidate to solicit text message contributions; and

(d) copies of any templates or scripts used by a mobile fundraising vendor to communicate with a contributor in facilitating and processing a text message contribution.

**What authorizes HRA to make this rule?** Sections 34, 56, 61, 62, 77, and 131 of the Social Services Law, sections 603 and 1043 of the New York City Charter, and sections 352.3(a)(3) and 352.6 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations authorize HRA to make this proposed rule. This proposed rule was not included in HRA's most recent regulatory agenda because it was not contemplated when HRA published the agenda.

**Where can I find HRA's rules?** HRA's rules are in Title 68 of the Rules of the City of New York.

**What rules govern the rulemaking process?** HRA must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter.<sup>1</sup>

1 In following the process set forth in New York City Charter § 1043, HRA does not waive its right to take the position that any future action, requirement or procedure, or any part thereof, does not meet the definition of a rule under New York City Charter § 1041 and is not subject to this process.

### Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

In order to implement the Mayor's priority of moving families from shelter into stable housing, and in a joint effort with the Commissioner of the New York City Department of Homeless Services (DHS), the Commissioner of the New York City Human Resources Administration (HRA) proposes to add Chapter 7 to Title 68 of the Rules of the City of New York to continue implementation of three new rental assistance programs targeted to specific populations within the City's homeless shelter system. These three rental assistance programs, which were established by an emergency rule issued on September 5, 2014, are collectively referred to as the Living in Communities or "LINC" Rental Assistance Programs. The purpose of these programs is to assist low-income working families, vulnerable families, and families whose lives have been affected by domestic violence move out of shelter into stable housing, and to assist those families to remain stably housed in their communities. The LINC I and LINC II programs are joint programs of the City of New York and the State of New York. The LINC III program is a City of New York program.

HRA and DHS submitted plans concerning the LINC I and LINC II programs to the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) for approval in accordance with Section 352.3(a)(3) of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations. The plans were so approved by OTDA on August 1, 2014. Because HRA is not seeking State reimbursement for the LINC III program, a plan was not submitted to OTDA for its approval.

The urgent need for these programs is established by census data from DHS establishing that the number of families in the DHS shelter system is at a record high. Census data also demonstrates the urgent need for a rental assistance program targeted to families whose lives have recently been affected by domestic violence. As of June 2014, there were 1,099 families, including 1,917 children, in HRA's domestic violence shelters. Due to a lack of housing resources, nearly 100 families had to enter the DHS shelter system between May and July of 2014 because they had reached the maximum length of stay of 180 days in a domestic violence shelter under State regulation and had no other housing options. As of July 2014, over 1,000 families in the DHS shelter system were survivors of domestic violence certified by HRA.

Subject to an annual review of available funding, the LINC Rental Assistance Programs will consist of three programs: LINC I, LINC II, and LINC III. In the first year of the program:

- LINC I will assist approximately 1,101 families in shelter who are working full-time but are unable to afford stable housing on their own to relocate from the City shelter system;
- LINC II will assist approximately 970 families in shelter who are identified within vulnerable populations and who need additional assistance and supports to relocate from the City shelter system and become securely housed in the community; and
- LINC III will provide rental assistance for up to 1,900 families recently affected by domestic violence to relocate them from the City shelter system, approximately 900 families in HRA domestic violence shelters and approximately 1,000 families in DHS shelters who HRA has certified as survivors of domestic violence.

In all three programs, priority has been and will continue to be given to families who have been in shelter the longest.

The proposed rule sets forth definitions applicable to the chapter (Section 7-01); a general description of responsibility for program administration and eligibility determinations (Section 7-02); program-specific eligibility, certification, and renewal requirements (Sections 7-03, 7-04, and 7-05); a description of how monthly program participant contributions and the monthly rental assistance amounts are calculated (Section 7-06); review and appeal procedures (Sections 7-07 and 7-08); and additional provisions, including a description of certain program benefits as well as requirements for program participants and participating landlords (Section 7-09).

HRA's authority for this rule may be found in sections 34, 56, 61, 62, 77, and 131 of the New York Social Services Law, sections 603 and 1043 of the New York City Charter, and sections 352.3(a)(3) and 352.6 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations.

Section 1. Title 68 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new chapter 7 to read as follows:

#### **Chapter 7: The Living in Communities (LINC) Rental Assistance Programs**

##### **§ 7-01 Definitions.**

For the purposes of this chapter, unless otherwise specified, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

(a) The "LINC Rental Assistance Programs" means collectively the

LINC I, LINC II and LINC III rental assistance programs described in this chapter.

(b) The "City shelter system" means DHS Shelters and HRA Shelters.

(c) "DHS" means the New York City Department of Homeless Services.

(d) A "DHS Shelter" means a shelter for families with children operated by or on behalf of DHS.

(e) "Earned income" is defined and computed as set forth in Section 352.17 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations, except that it does not include income earned through subsidized employment.

(f) "Emergency assistance" means benefits issued pursuant to New York Social Services Law § 350-j, Title 8 of Article 5 of the New York Social Services Law, and/or Section 370.3 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations.

(g) "Gross income" means the sum of earned income and unearned income.

(h) The "household" means all individuals collectively intended to reside and/or residing together in the place of residence obtained pursuant to this chapter, regardless of their eligibility for Public Assistance.

(i) "HRA" means the New York City Human Resources Administration.

(j) An "HRA Shelter" means a domestic violence shelter operated by or on behalf of HRA pursuant to Part 452 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations.

(k) "Public Assistance" means benefits, including monthly grants and shelter allowances, issued under the Family Assistance program pursuant to New York Social Services Law § 349 and/or the Safety Net Assistance program pursuant to New York Social Services Law § 159, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

(l) A "program participant" means an individual who has entered into a lease for housing to which LINC rental assistance payments have been or are being applied.

(m) "Unearned income" means all regularly recurring income received during a month, other than earned income and income earned through subsidized employment, and shall include but not be limited to:

- (1) assistance payments from federally funded assistance programs other than Public Assistance, such as Supplemental Security Income (SSI);
- (2) annuities, pensions, retirement, veterans' or disabilities benefits, workers' or unemployment compensation, old-age, survivor's or social security benefits, foster care payments for children or adults, and adoption subsidies;
- (3) support or alimony payments made directly to the household from non-household members;
- (4) scholarships, educational grants, fellowships, deferred payment loans for education, and veterans' educational benefits;
- (5) payments from government-sponsored programs unless otherwise excluded;
- (6) dividends, interest, royalties and all other direct money payments from any source which can be construed to be a gain or benefit; and
- (7) monies which are withdrawn or dividends which are or could be received by a household from trust funds.

(n) "Subsidized employment" means subsidized private sector employment or subsidized public sector employment as those terms are used in New York Social Services Law § 336(1)(b)-(c).

(o) "Unsubsidized employment" means unsubsidized employment as that term is used in New York Social Services Law § 336(1)(a).

##### **§ 7-02 Administration of the LINC I, LINC II, and LINC III Programs.**

HRA shall administer the LINC Rental Assistance Programs and shall make eligibility determinations in accordance with this chapter, except that initial eligibility determinations for current shelter residents pursuant to subparagraph (C) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) of section 7-03 or 7-04 of this chapter, or paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of section 7-05 of this chapter, are made by HRA's Family Independence Administration in consultation with DHS's Division of Policy and Planning and Division of Family Services.

##### **§ 7-03 The LINC I Rental Assistance Program.**

(a) Initial Eligibility and Certification for the LINC I Program.

(1) To be eligible for an initial year of LINC I rental assistance, a household must meet the following eligibility requirements at the time of certification:

(A) The household must include at least one member who is

in receipt of Public Assistance or emergency assistance, and all household members who are eligible for Public Assistance or emergency assistance must be in receipt of such benefits;

(B) The household must include a child who meets the criteria set forth in Section 369.2(c) of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations;

(C) The household must include at least one member who: (i) is eligible for shelter as determined by DHS pursuant to Parts 351 and 352 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations or as determined by HRA pursuant to Sections 452.2(g) and 452.9 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations; and (ii) currently resides in the City shelter system;

(D) The household member described in subparagraph (C) of paragraph (1) of this subdivision must have resided in the City shelter system for at least ninety consecutive days prior to certification, excluding gaps of up to three calendar days;

(E) The household must include at least one member who is working and any such member or members must be collectively working at least thirty-five hours per week in unsubsidized employment;

(F) The household must demonstrate earned income for at least ninety days prior to certification; and

(G) The household must have total gross income that does not exceed 200% of the federal poverty level as established annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

(2) The number of eligible households that can be certified to receive LINC I rental assistance will be limited by the amount of available funding. Subject to HRA's exercise of discretion under subdivision (a) of section 7-09 of this chapter, upon finding that a household has met the eligibility requirements set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision and that appropriate funding is available to provide LINC I rental assistance to such household, HRA and/or DHS shall issue such household a certification letter. The letter will include an expiration date and will be conditioned on the household continuing to meet the requirements of subparagraphs (A), (B), (C), (E), and (G) of paragraph (1) of this subdivision up to the time when the lease for the housing to which LINC I rental assistance will be applied is executed. Priority will be given to families whose current stays in the City shelter system are the longest.

(3) At the time of certification, HRA will calculate the household's monthly program participant contribution and the maximum monthly rental assistance amount pursuant to subdivision (a) of section 7-06 of this chapter. The monthly program participant contribution and monthly rental assistance amount will not change during the first year of the program, regardless of changes in household composition or income.

**(b) Renewals after the First Year.**

(1) Subject to the availability of funding, a household in receipt of LINC I rental assistance will receive two one-year renewals of such assistance if it meets the following continued eligibility requirements:

(A) At least one member of the household must be working, and the household's working member or members must be collectively working at least thirty-five hours per week in unsubsidized employment;

(B) The household's total gross income must not exceed 200% of the federal poverty level as established annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services;

(C) At least one member of the household must be continually engaged in enhanced employment and social service supports developed in conjunction with a case manager or employment vendor designated by DHS or HRA intended to maintain or enhance the household's employment; and

(D) The household must provide prompt notice to HRA of any rent arrears that have accrued so that they may be addressed.

(2) Subject to the availability of funding, households that meet the continued eligibility requirements set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision may receive up to two additional one-year extensions after their third year in the LINC I rental assistance program pursuant to a determination by HRA on a case-by-case basis.

(3) HRA will determine a household's eligibility for renewal of LINC I rental assistance at the end of each year of the household's participation in the program, subject to the availability of funding. Prior to the commencement of each one-year renewal period, HRA will recalculate the household's monthly program participant contribution and the monthly rental assistance amount pursuant

to subdivision (a) of section 7-06 of this chapter. The monthly program participant contribution and monthly rental assistance amount will not change during the one-year renewal period, regardless of changes in household composition or income.

**§ 7-04 The LINC II Rental Assistance Program.**

**(a) Initial Eligibility and Certification for the LINC II Program.**

(1) To be eligible for an initial year of LINC II rental assistance, a household must meet the following eligibility requirements at the time of certification:

(A) The household must include at least one member who is in receipt of Public Assistance or emergency assistance, and all household members who are eligible for Public Assistance or emergency assistance must be in receipt of such benefits;

(B) The household must include a child who meets the criteria set forth in Section 369.2(c) of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations;

(C) The household must include at least one member who: (i) is eligible for shelter as determined by DHS pursuant to Parts 351 and 352 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations or as determined by HRA pursuant to Sections 452.2(g) and 452.9 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations; and (ii) currently resides in the City shelter system;

(D) The household member described in subparagraph (C) of paragraph (1) of this subdivision must have resided in the City shelter system for at least ninety consecutive days prior to certification, excluding gaps of up to three calendar days;

(E) The household must include at least one member who has experienced two or more prior stays in the City shelter system of thirty days or more within five years of the first day of the current shelter stay;

(F) The household must have some income, earned or unearned; and

(G) HRA must have determined that the household will be eligible for Public Assistance upon exit from shelter.

(2) The number of eligible households that will be certified to receive LINC II rental assistance will be limited by the amount of available funding. Subject to HRA's exercise of discretion under subdivision (a) of section 7-09 of this chapter, upon finding that a household has met the eligibility requirements set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision and that appropriate funding is available to provide LINC II rental assistance to such household, HRA and/or DHS shall issue such household a certification letter. The letter will include an expiration date and will be conditioned on the household continuing to meet the requirements of subparagraphs (A), (B), (C), (F), and (G) of paragraph (1) of this subdivision up to the time when the lease for the housing to which LINC II rental assistance will be applied is executed. Priority will be given to families whose current stays in the City shelter system are the longest and among those, further priority may be given to families who are receiving social services from multiple government agencies or who have a member who is in receipt of disability benefits and/or who is an employable adult.

(3) At the time of certification, HRA will calculate the household's monthly program participant contribution and the maximum monthly rental assistance amount pursuant to subdivision (a) of section 7-06 of this chapter. The monthly program participant contribution and monthly rental assistance amount will not change during the first year of the program, regardless of changes in household composition or income.

**(b) Renewals after the First Year.**

(1) Subject to the availability of funding, a household in receipt of LINC II rental assistance will receive four one-year renewals of such assistance if it meets the following continued eligibility requirements:

(A) At least one member of the household must be continually engaged in ongoing case management activities designed to assist the household member in obtaining, maintaining and/or enhancing employment or to secure any benefits for which such member or household is eligible;

(B) All members eligible for Public Assistance must be in receipt of Public Assistance;

(C) Members of the household receiving Public Assistance must be in compliance with any applicable requirements related to the receipt of such Public Assistance;

(D) The household's total gross income must not exceed 200% of the federal poverty level as established annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; and

(E) The household must provide prompt notice to HRA of



any rent arrears that have accrued so that they may be addressed.

(2) HRA will determine a household's eligibility for renewal of LINC II rental assistance at the end of each year of the household's participation in the program, subject to the availability of funding. Prior to the commencement of each one-year renewal period, HRA will recalculate the household's monthly program participant contribution and the monthly rental assistance amount pursuant to subdivision (a) of section 7-06 of this chapter. The monthly program participant contribution and monthly rental assistance amount will not change during the one-year renewal period, regardless of changes in household composition or income.

**§ 7-05 The LINC III Rental Assistance Program.**

**(a) Initial and Continued Eligibility and Certification for the LINC III Program.**

(1) To be eligible for the LINC III Program, a household must meet the following eligibility requirements:

(A) The household must be in receipt of Public Assistance;

(B) The household must include a child who meets the criteria set forth in Section 369.2(c) of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations;

(C) The household must, at the time of certification and up to the time when the lease for the housing to which LINC III rental assistance will be applied is executed, include at least one member who:

(i) (A) resides in a DHS shelter and is eligible for shelter as determined by DHS pursuant to Parts 351 and 352 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations, or (B) resides in an HRA shelter; and

(ii) is currently eligible for HRA shelter under Section 452.9 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations as a victim of domestic violence within the meaning of Section 452.2(g) of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations and Section 459-a of the New York Social Services Law; and

(D) The household must, at the time of certification and up to the time of lease signing, be in compliance with Public Assistance requirements.

(2) The number of eligible households that will be certified to receive LINC III rental assistance will be limited by the amount of available funding. Subject to HRA's exercise of discretion under subdivision (a) of section 7-09 of this chapter, upon finding that a household has met the eligibility requirements set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision and that appropriate funding is available to provide LINC III rental assistance to such household, HRA and/or DHS shall issue such household a certification letter. The letter will include an expiration date and will be conditioned on the household continuing to meet the requirements of paragraph (1) of this subdivision. Priority will be given to families who have resided in a DHS Shelter or an HRA Shelter for the longest consecutive periods, families currently residing in an HRA Shelter who have reached the 180-day time limit under New York Social Services Law § 459-b and would otherwise be discharged to a DHS Shelter, and families who are currently residing in a DHS Shelter due to lack of capacity in HRA Shelters or who have been discharged from an HRA Shelter to a DHS Shelter.

(3) At the time of certification, and prior to lease signing, HRA will calculate, pursuant to subdivision (b) of section 7-06 of this chapter, the household's maximum monthly rent amount, the maximum monthly LINC III rental assistance amount and any contributions required to be made by household members not eligible for Public Assistance. The LINC III rental assistance amount and the amounts of any required contributions are subject to change during the household's participation in the LINC III program as set forth in paragraph (8) of subdivision (b) of section 7-06 of this chapter.

(4) A household's continued receipt of LINC III rental assistance is conditioned on the household continuing to meet the requirements of subparagraphs (A) and (B) of paragraph (1) of this subdivision.

(5) In no event shall HRA certify for LINC III rental assistance a household that includes the perpetrator of the domestic violence that resulted in the determination of eligibility for HRA shelter described in subparagraph (C) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) of this section.

**(b) Renewals after the First Year.**

(1) Subject to the availability of funding, a household in receipt of LINC III rental assistance will receive up to four one-year renewals of such assistance if it meets the following continued eligibility requirements:

(A) The household must be in receipt of Public Assistance;

(B) The household must include a child who meets the criteria set forth in Section 369.2(c) of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations;

(C) Where such activities are made available to the household, at least one member of the household must be participating in ongoing case management activities developed in conjunction with a case manager or employment vendor designated by DHS or HRA designed to assist the household member in obtaining, maintaining and/or enhancing employment or to secure any benefits for which such member or household is eligible;

(D) Members of the household receiving Public Assistance must be in compliance with any applicable requirements related to the receipt of such Public Assistance;

(E) The household's total gross income must not exceed 200% of the federal poverty level as established annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; and

(F) The household must provide prompt notice to HRA of any rent arrears that have accrued so that they may be addressed.

(2) HRA will determine a household's eligibility for renewal of LINC III rental assistance at the end of each year of the household's participation in the program, subject to the availability of funding. Prior to the commencement of each one-year renewal period, HRA will recalculate, pursuant to subdivision (b) of section 7-06 of this chapter, the household's maximum monthly rent amount, the maximum monthly rental assistance amount and any contributions required to be made by household members not eligible for Public Assistance. This recalculation is in addition to any recalculations required by paragraph (8) of subdivision (b) of section 7-06 of this chapter.

**§ 7-06 Maximum Rents and Calculation of Monthly Program Participant Contributions and Rental Assistance Amounts.**

**(a) LINC I and LINC II Rental Assistance Programs.**

(1) The maximum rent towards which rental assistance may be applied during the first year of any lease towards which LINC I or LINC II rental assistance is applied shall not exceed the amounts set forth in the table below, except that HRA may make exceptions on a case-by-case basis if the rent: (i) is reasonable in relation to current rents for comparable units in the private unassisted market; (ii) is not in excess of current rents for the owner's comparable non-luxury unassisted units; and (iii) does not exceed the 2014 New York City Housing Authority Section 8 Voucher Payment Standards for the same type of unit. If HRA makes such an exception, HRA shall pay the difference between the approved rent and the maximum rent amount set forth in the table below.

(2) A program participant contribution of thirty percent of the household's total gross income at the time of certification will be required and will be paid by the household directly to the landlord each month. The program participant contribution will be deducted from the maximum rent amount set forth in the table in paragraph (1) of this subdivision to determine the monthly rental assistance amount. HRA shall pay the monthly rental assistance amount directly to the landlord each month for so long as the program participant's household remains eligible and funding for the program remains available. In addition to the program participant contribution, the program participant shall be responsible for any increases in the rent permitted under paragraph (2) of subdivision (m) of section 7-09 of this chapter.

**(b) LINC III Rental Assistance Program.**

(1) Except as provided below, the maximum LINC III rental assistance amount and the maximum rent towards which LINC III rental assistance may be applied shall not exceed the amounts set forth in the table below, except that HRA may make exceptions to the maximum rent amounts on a case-by-case basis if the rent: (i) is reasonable in relation to current rents for comparable units in the private unassisted market; (ii) is not in excess of current rents for the owner's comparable non-luxury unassisted units; and (iii) does not exceed the 2014 New York City Housing Authority Section 8 Voucher Payment Standards for the same type of unit. If HRA makes such an exception, HRA shall pay the difference between the approved rent and the maximum rent amount set forth in the table below.

(2) Except as provided in paragraph (4) of this subdivision, and provided the household remains eligible for LINC III rental assistance, the LINC III rental assistance amount shall be the household's actual rent less the sum of (A) any contributions required to be made in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (6) of this subdivision and (B) the standard Public Assistance shelter allowance as set forth in Section 352.3(a)(1) of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations for the number of members in the household active for Public Assistance, provided that the LINC III rental assistance amount shall not exceed the maximum rental assistance amount for the household size as set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision. If the actual rent exceeds the sum of the LINC III rental assistance amount and the standard shelter allowance, the household shall pay directly to the landlord the amount that the actual rent exceeds such sum.

(3) If a household in receipt of LINC III rental assistance receives a Public Assistance shelter allowance less than the standard Public Assistance shelter allowance set forth in Section 352.3(a)(1) of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations, the household shall pay directly to the landlord the difference between the standard Public Assistance shelter amount and the Public Assistance shelter amount that the household receives.

(4) If the household's Public Assistance shelter allowance is reduced pursuant to New York Social Services Law § 342, the LINC III rental assistance amount will be reduced using the same rule applied to reduce the Public Assistance benefits. The household shall pay any reduction amounts directly to the landlord.

(5) If a household is in receipt of the LINC III rental assistance amount and such household's monthly rent obligation increases above the 2014 New York City Housing Authority Section 8 Voucher Payment Standards for the same type of unit after the household's second year in the LINC III rental assistance program, the household shall pay the amount of the rent increase directly to the landlord. In the event of such a rent increase, HRA may make exceptions to the maximum rental assistance amount on a case-by-case basis.

(6) A member of the household who is not in receipt of Public Assistance and who receives income, earned or unearned, must contribute a pro rata share of the rent or thirty percent of his or her gross income, whichever is less, towards rent. If a member of the household is not currently in receipt of Public Assistance, but does not acknowledge receipt of income, earned or unearned, such household member must apply for Public Assistance before the household can be certified for LINC III rental assistance. If such household member is rejected as ineligible, such household member shall be subject to the program participant contribution requirement set forth in this subdivision. Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to require a person ineligible for Public Assistance on the basis of his or her immigration status to apply for Public Assistance. An individual contributing a pro rata share of rent or thirty percent of his or her gross income shall not be counted for purposes of determining the LINC III maximum rental assistance amount as set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision but may be counted for purposes of determining the maximum rent as set forth in such paragraph, provided that the maximum rent shall not exceed the sum of the maximum rent for the household when such person is not counted and such person's required contribution. Such individual's contribution shall be deducted from the household's actual rent for the purposes of determining the LINC III rental assistance amount as set forth in paragraph (2) of this subdivision.

(7) When an individual ineligible for Public Assistance on the basis of his or her immigration status has income that must be taken into consideration in calculating Public Assistance pursuant to New York Social Services Law § 131-a, such individual shall be included in the household for purposes of determining the maximum rent as set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision. Such individual shall not be included in the household for purposes of determining the maximum rental assistance amount as set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision and will not be subject to the program participant contribution requirement as set forth in paragraph (6) of this subdivision.

(8) A LINC III rental assistance amount and any contributions

required by paragraph (6) of this subdivision shall be increased or reduced as a result of changes in a household's income, composition, or rent, provided that such increased or decreased rental assistance amount and contributions are calculated in accordance with the provisions of this subdivision. LINC III recipients shall promptly inform HRA of changes in income, household composition, or rent that may require an increase or decrease in the LINC III rental assistance amount and/or any required contributions. LINC III recipients will receive a notice from the City of New York of any change in their LINC III rental assistance amount and required contributions.

**§ 7-07 Right of Review.**

(a) Challenges by Shelter Residents in Receipt of a LINC II Certification Letter and by LINC II Program Participants Regarding LINC II Rental Assistance.

Shelter residents who have received a LINC II certification letter and LINC II program participants shall have the right to seek review pursuant to Part 358 of Title 18 of the New York Code, Rules and Regulations of all determinations and actions made by DHS and/or HRA pursuant to section 7-04 of this chapter.

(b) All Other Challenges.

All other challenges to determinations or actions made by DHS and/or HRA under this chapter, as well as any failures to act, or failures to act with reasonable promptness, by DHS and/or HRA in implementing the provisions of this chapter, shall be governed by the procedures set forth in section 7-08 of this chapter.

**§ 7-08 Agency Review Conference and HRA Administrative Appeal Process.**

(a) Right to HRA Administrative Review.

A shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant may request an agency review conference and/or an HRA administrative hearing to seek review of any determinations or actions for which a right to review is provided under subdivision (b) of section 7-07 of this chapter.

(b) Agency Review Conference.

(1) If a shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant requests an agency review conference, HRA shall informally review and attempt to resolve the issues raised.

(2) A shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant may request an agency review conference without also requesting an HRA administrative hearing. Requesting an agency review conference will not prevent a shelter resident or program participant from later requesting an HRA administrative hearing.

(3) Except as provided in paragraph (4) of this subdivision, an agency review conference must be requested within sixty days after the challenged determination or action, provided further that if an HRA administrative hearing is scheduled, an agency review conference must be requested reasonably in advance of the scheduled hearing date.

(4) Notwithstanding paragraph (3) of this subdivision, an agency review conference to review a failure by DHS and/or HRA to issue a certification letter pursuant to section 7-03, 7-04 or 7-05 of this chapter may be brought at any time if such household has not received such letter.

(5) A request for an agency review conference will extend the time period to request an HRA administrative hearing as set forth in paragraph (2) of subdivision (c) of this section to sixty days after the date of the agency review conference.

(c) Request for an HRA Administrative Hearing.

(1) An administrative hearing must be requested in writing. Such written request must be submitted by mail, electronic means or facsimile, or other means as HRA may set forth in an appeals notice.

(2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subdivision and paragraph (5) of subdivision (b) of this section, a request for an administrative hearing must be made within sixty days after the challenged determination or action.

(3) A request for an administrative hearing to challenge a failure by DHS and/or HRA to issue a certification letter under section 7-03, 7-04 or 7-05 of this chapter may be brought at any time if such household has not received such letter.

(d) Authorized Representative.

(1) Except where impracticable to execute a written authorization, a person or organization seeking to represent a shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant must have the shelter resident's or program participant's written authorization to represent him or her at an agency review conference or administrative hearing and to review his or her case record, provided that such written authorization is not required from an



attorney retained by such shelter resident or program participant. An employee of such attorney will be considered an authorized representative if such employee presents written authorization from the attorney or if such attorney advises HRA by telephone of such employee's authorization.

(2) Once HRA has been notified that a person or organization has been authorized to represent a shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant at an agency review conference or administrative hearing, such representative will receive copies of all correspondence sent by HRA to the shelter resident or program participant relating to the conference and hearing.

(e) Aid Continuing.

(1) If a LINC I or LINC III program participant requests an administrative appeal of a determination by HRA that rental assistance payments issued under section 7-03 or 7-05 of this chapter are to be reduced, restricted, suspended or discontinued, or that the program participant's household is not eligible for renewal pursuant to subdivision (b) of section 7-03 or subdivision (b) of section 7-05 of this chapter, such program participant shall have the right to continued receipt of LINC I or LINC III rental assistance payments at the rental assistance amount in effect at the time of the determination until the hearing decision is issued pursuant to subdivision (l) of this section, provided that:

(A) The program participant requests the administrative appeal within ten days of the mailing of the notice of such determination; and

(B) The appeal is based on a claim of incorrect computation or an incorrect factual determination.

(2) There is no right to continued rental assistance payments pursuant to this subdivision where the sole issue on appeal is one of local, State or Federal law or policy, or change in local, State or Federal law.

(3) Rental assistance payments will not continue pending the issuance of a hearing decision when:

(A) The LINC I or LINC III program participant has voluntarily waived his or her right to the continuation of such assistance in writing; or

(B) The LINC I or LINC III program participant does not appear at the administrative hearing and does not have a good reason for not appearing.

(4) If a LINC I or LINC III program participant requests an additional appeal pursuant to subdivision (m) of this section, rental assistance payments will continue uninterrupted after issuance of the hearing decision until a written decision is issued pursuant to subdivision (l) of this section.

(f) Notice.

HRA shall provide the shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant with notice of the date, time, and location of the administrative hearing no fewer than seven calendar days prior to the scheduled date of the administrative hearing, unless the issue underlying the request for an administrative hearing has been resolved and the shelter resident or program participant has withdrawn his or her hearing request.

(g) Examination of Case Record.

The shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant or his or her authorized representative has the right to examine the contents of his or her LINC program case file and all documents and records that HRA intends to use at the administrative hearing. Upon request by telephone or in writing, HRA shall provide such shelter resident or program participant with copies of all such documents, and copies of any additional documents in the possession of HRA and/or DHS that the shelter resident or program participant identifies and requests for purposes of preparing for the administrative hearing. HRA shall provide such documents at no charge reasonably in advance of the administrative hearing. If the request for such documents is made less than five business days before the administrative hearing, HRA must provide the shelter resident or program participant with copies of such documents no later than at the time of the administrative hearing.

(h) Adjournment.

The administrative hearing may be adjourned for good cause by the administrative hearing officer on his or her own motion or at the request of the shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant, HRA, or DHS.

(i) Conduct of Administrative Hearing.

(1) The administrative hearing shall be conducted by an impartial hearing officer appointed by HRA who shall have the power to administer oaths and issue subpoenas and who shall have no prior personal knowledge of the facts concerning the challenged determination or action.

(2) The administrative hearing shall be informal, all relevant and material evidence shall be admissible and the legal rules of evidence shall not apply. The administrative hearing shall be confined to the factual and legal issues raised regarding the specific determination(s) for which the administrative hearing was requested.

(3) The shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant shall have a right to be represented by counsel or other representative, to testify, to produce witnesses to testify, to offer documentary evidence, to offer evidence in opposition to the evidence presented by HRA and DHS, to request that the hearing officer issue subpoenas, and to examine any documents offered by HRA and DHS.

(4) An audio recording, an audio visual recording or written transcript of the administrative hearing shall be made.

(j) Abandonment of Request for Administrative Hearing.

(1) HRA will consider an administrative hearing request abandoned if neither the shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant nor his or her authorized representative appears at the administrative hearing, unless either the shelter resident or program participant or his or her authorized representative has:

(A) contacted HRA prior to the administrative hearing to request rescheduling of the administrative hearing; or

(B) within fifteen calendar days of the scheduled administrative hearing date, contacted HRA and provided a good cause reason for failing to appear at the administrative hearing on the scheduled date.

(2) HRA will restore the case to the calendar if the shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant or his or her authorized representative has met the requirements of paragraph (1) of this subdivision.

(k) Hearing Record.

The recording or written transcript of the hearing, all papers and requests filed in connection with the hearing, and the hearing decision collectively constitute the complete and exclusive record of the administrative hearing.

(l) Hearing Decision.

(1) The hearing officer shall render a decision based exclusively on the hearing record. The decision must be in writing and must set forth the administrative hearing issues, the relevant facts, and the applicable law, regulations and approved policy, if any, upon which the decision is based. The decision must identify the issues to be determined, make findings of fact, state the reasons for the determinations, and when appropriate, direct HRA to take specific action.

(2) A copy of the decision, accompanied by written notice to the shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant of the right to further appeal and the procedures for requesting such appeal, will be sent to each of the parties and to their authorized representatives, if any.

(m) Additional Appeal.

(1) An appeal from a decision of a hearing officer may be made in writing to the Commissioner of HRA or his or her designee provided it is received by HRA through the procedures described in the notice accompanying the hearing decision within at least five business days after the delivery of the hearing officer's decision. The record before the Commissioner shall consist of the hearing record, the hearing officer's decision and any affidavits, documentary evidence, or written arguments that the shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant may wish to submit.

(2) The Commissioner or his or her designee shall render a written decision based on the hearing record and any additional documents submitted by the shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant and HRA or DHS.

(3) A copy of the decision, accompanied by written notice to the shelter resident or LINC I or LINC III program participant of the right to judicial review, will be sent to each of the parties and to their authorized representatives, if any.

(4) Upon issuance, the decision of the Commissioner or his or her designee made pursuant to an appeal under this section is final and binding upon HRA and must be complied with by HRA.

**§ 7-09 Additional Provisions.**

(a) A household may only receive a certification letter for one LINC program. If a household is eligible for two or more LINC programs, HRA and DHS reserve the right to determine, based on administrative and programmatic needs, which LINC program the household will be certified for. HRA and DHS also reserve the right to determine the



schedule for release of available funding for each of the LINC programs based on administrative and programmatic needs.

(b) HRA and DHS will refer households in the LINC Rental Assistance Programs to service providers who will assist them with connecting to appropriate services in their communities.

(c) HRA and DHS will evaluate available resources under the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program and will utilize these as an alternative to longer term rental assistance, if applicable, prior to determining any household's eligibility for LINC I and LINC II rental assistance.

(d) HRA shall provide moving expenses, a security deposit voucher equal to one month's rent and, if applicable, a broker's fee equal to up to one month's rent, on behalf of a household moving from shelter under one of the LINC Rental Assistance Programs.

(e) Rental assistance provided under any of the LINC Rental Assistance Programs cannot be combined with any other rent subsidies other than a Public Assistance shelter allowance provided pursuant to Section 352.3 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations.

(f) Rental assistance provided under the LINC Rental Assistance Programs shall be excluded from the household's income for the purpose of determining food stamp benefits pursuant to Part 387 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations.

(g) Households in receipt of rental assistance under the LINC Rental Assistance Programs that are unable to make their program participant contributions on account of involuntary job loss or other extenuating circumstances may be eligible for emergency rent assistance and arrears under Part 372 of Title 18 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations.

(h) HRA and DHS will not maintain waitlists for the LINC Rental Assistance Programs.

(i) Shelter residents are responsible for identifying potential housing. However, shelter staff may provide assistance to shelter residents in their housing search.

(j) A landlord who signs a lease with a household in receipt of rental assistance under any of the LINC Rental Assistance Programs is prohibited from demanding, requesting, or receiving any amount above the rent or fees as stipulated in the lease agreement regardless of any changes in household composition. A landlord who demands, requests or receives any amount above what is set forth in the lease will be barred from further participation in any HRA rental assistance programs and may be barred from other rental assistance programs administered by the City of New York. Before placing a landlord on a disqualification list, HRA will provide notice to the landlord and an opportunity for the landlord to object in writing.

(k) If a program participant leaves the apartment for which the program participant is receiving LINC I, LINC II, or LINC III rental assistance due to an eviction or move, the landlord must return any over-payment.

(l) Any residence to which LINC rental assistance is applied must pass a City inspection conducted by Housing Quality Standards inspectors employed by the New York City Department of Housing Preservation and Development, working under an agreement with HRA. Section 8 Housing Quality Standards set forth in Section 982.401 of Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations will be applied in the inspection process with respect to the physical condition of apartments. The number of persons who can occupy a particular apartment will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis with each household.

(m) As a condition of participating in the LINC Rental Assistance Programs landlords shall be required to:

(1) renew a participating household's lease for a second year at the same monthly rent as provided for in the first year provided that (a) funding for the applicable LINC Rental Assistance Program remains available, and the household has been found eligible by the City for a second year of the program, or (b) the household is able to pay its entire rent for a second year; and

(2) after the second, third and fourth years, renew a participating household's lease at the same total monthly rent provided for as in the previous year, increased by a percentage no greater than that allowed at that time for one-year leases for rent-stabilized apartments in New York City, regardless of whether the housing is subject to rent stabilization, provided that: (a) funding for the applicable program remains available and the participating household has been found eligible by the City for the applicable year of the program, or (b) the participating household is able to pay its entire rent for the applicable year.

**Notice of Promulgation Rules**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in accordance with section 1043(b) of the Charter of the City of New York ("Charter") that the Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC") promulgates rules to amend existing rules relating to the Taxi Improvement Surcharge and the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge.**

These rules are promulgated pursuant to sections 1043 and 2303 of the Charter and section 19-503 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York. These rules were not included in the Commission's regulatory agenda for this Fiscal Year.

These rules were published on September 16, 2014, for public comment in the City Record. On October 16, 2014 a public hearing was held by the TLC at its offices at 33 Beaver Street, 19<sup>th</sup> Floor, New York, NY, 10004 and the rules were adopted by the Commission at that public meeting. Pursuant to section 1043(e)(1)(c) of the Charter, these rules will go into effect 30 days following publication in the City Record.

**Statement of Basis and Purpose**

These rules amend and clarify the Taxi and Limousine Commission's

(TLC) rules regarding how the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge and the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge will be collected and paid to the TLC. These rules include notification and reporting requirements for Taxicab Passenger Enhancement Program (TPEP) and Livery Passenger Enhancement Program (LPEP) vendors.

The rules:

- Establish requirements for Medallion Owners or Agents for payment of the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge and for Street Hail Livery Licensees for the payment of the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge.
- Modify the meter equipment restriction for For-Hire vehicles to allow all Street Hail Livery vehicles to be equipped with a taximeter.
- Establish how funds contributed are allocated between the Driver and Owner portions of the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund.
- Provide collection and notification requirements for the TPEP and LPEP vendors regarding the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge and the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge respectively.
- Require the TPEP and LPEP systems to perform driver verification against TLC-provided licensee lists, and meet other technical requirements.
- Change the recipient of Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge proceeds from fares and the obligation to pay those proceeds to the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund from Street Hail Livery Bases to Street Hail Livery Licensees. This change is made because as the TLC began to move to implement collection of the Surcharge, administrative concerns indicated that Street Hail Livery Licensees should be the collectors and payors.

These rules are authorized by Section 2303 of the Charter and Section 19-503 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York.

Section 1. Subdivision (l) of section 54-17 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (l) Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge. For each Hail Trip in a Street Hail Livery, the Driver must remit the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge to the Street Hail Livery [Base] Licensee.

Section 2. Paragraph (2) of subdivision (g) of section 58-16 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (2) The Owner of any Medallion, or his or her Agent, must pay the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge to the Taxicab Improvement Fund at the time and in the manner required by the Commission.

Section 3. Subdivision (c) of section 59A-31 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (c) Meter. No For-Hire Vehicle can be equipped with a meter except a wheelchair accessible Livery which is participating in the dispatch program as described in Chapter 3 of this title or a Street Hail Livery pursuant to Section 59B-51 of this Chapter.

Section 4. Subdivision (n) of section 59B-13 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is deleted in its entirety:

[(n) Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund.]

- (1) A Street Hail Livery Base must pay the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge remitted by the Driver for each Hail Trip to the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund.
- (2) The Street Hail Livery Base must pay the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge to the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund at the time required by the Commission.
- (3) If the Street Hail Livery Base does not pay the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge to the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund at the time required, non-payment may be grounds for suspension of the Street Hail Livery Base, and/or denial of any renewal application or of any application for another TLC-issued license as well as monetary penalties.

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Section 5. Subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (ii) The TPEP must be used to provide payment processing by credit/debit/prepaid card, E-Hail Apps that provide for E-Payment, and Digital Wallet Applications by displaying on the PIM to Passengers at the end of the trip the total fare, itemizing all time-and-distance fare, tolls, surcharges, extras (including an E-Hail service fee, if applicable), the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge, taxes, and default tip of 0 percent. The TPEP must provide the Passenger with

preset tip options for amounts that are set according to the TPEP Provider's discretion, but that include at a minimum a 20 percent option, and permit Passengers to manually enter (through the PIM or their E-Hail App that provides for E-Payment or Digital Wallet Application) another tip amount or percentage at the Passenger's option. The PIM must display all information reasonably required for the Passenger to understand and complete electronic payment of the total fare due, including details for paying by split fare as described in subparagraph (iii) of this paragraph;

Section 6. Item (E) of subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (iii) The TPEP may allow Passengers to split and pay for the total fare using multiple payment sources for a single trip. If split fare is offered by the TPEP, the following requirements must be met:

\* \* \*

- (E) Only a single MTA tax, a single Taxicab Improvement Surcharge, and a single \$.06 healthcare fee are required to be captured by the TPEP for the trip, regardless of how many ways the total charges are split.

Section 7. Item (I) of subparagraph (v) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended, items (J) through (R) are relettered items (K) through (S), and a new item (J) is added, to read as follows:

- (v) The TPEP must be able to generate an accurate receipt for payment of fare, whether payment is made by cash, credit/debit/prepaid card, E-Hail App that provides for E-Payment, or Digital Wallet Application, and such receipt must be able to be generated for each Passenger making a payment. Upon the Passenger's request, a receipt either in hard copy form or in electronic form must be transmitted to the Passenger. The receipt must contain the following information:

- (I) itemized extras (if applicable) by extra type and amount, including the E-Hail Fee, if any;
- (J) the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge;

Section 8. Item (C) of subparagraph (xii) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by renumbering clauses (VIII) to (XI) clauses (XI) to (XIV) and adding new clauses (VIII), (IX) and (X), to read as follows:

- (xii) The TPEP must be capable of generating the following payment data, whether payment is made by cash, credit/debit/prepaid card, E-Hail App that provides for E-Payment, or Digital Wallet Application, as further described in subdivision (c) of this section:

- (C) end-of-shift data summarizing the number of fares, the total fare amount, and as applicable, the number of credit/debit/prepaid card transactions (including trips paid by E-Hail App that provides for E-Payment that are processed through the TPEP Provider's payment gateway) and the total fares of such transactions. End-of-shift data must be made available to the Taxicab Driver by printing from the Taximeter or accessing electronically, at the Taxicab Driver's preference, and must contain the following information:

- (VIII) total MTA tax collected;
- (IX) total Healthcare Fee collected;
- (X) total Taxicab Improvement Surcharge collected;

Section 9. Paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) of section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (1) The DIM must enable the TPEP to be turned on and interact with the Taximeter only upon log in which requires[:] system-initiated search of Valid TLC and DMV Licenses and system-initiated search of required training by vehicle type, as further enumerated in subdivision (l) of this section;
  - [(i) entry of an active and Valid Taxicab Driver's License number and an optional unique password set up by the Taxicab Driver; and
  - (ii) system-initiated search of an active and Valid Medallion number of the vehicle prior to log in;]

Section 10. Subparagraph (vii) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (c) of section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:



- (2) The Trip Data to be collected and transmitted must include the information set forth below. For purposes of this subdivision, all times are required to be measured to the hour, minute, and second:

- (vii) itemized charges for the trip (itemized by time-and-distance fare, tolls, surcharges, extras, the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge and taxes) from the Taximeter, E-Hail App service fee (if the Passenger is charged such a service fee by the E-Hail App and the fare is also paid for using that App's E-Payment feature), and tip amount for credit/debit/prepaid card, E-Hail Apps that provides for E-Payment, and Digital Wallet Applications;

- (1) The Passenger Information Monitor must have the following features:

- (iv) The PIM must display all information reasonably required for the Passenger to understand and complete electronic payment of the total fare (and as applied to split fare, if available) by credit/debit/prepaid card, E-Hail App that provides for E-Payment, or Digital Wallet Application as required in subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (2) of this subdivision, and must continuously display the running total fare inclusive of the time-and-distance fare and all extras, the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge, tolls, and surcharges as well as the option for the Passenger to view the itemization of that running total fare by time-and-distance fare, extras, tolls, and surcharges, and the rate code currently in effect.

Section 12. Subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (d) of section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (2) Required features relating to PIM content are as follows:

- (iii) Payment Processing Information. The PIM must be used to process payment by credit/debit/prepaid card, E-Hail App that provides for E-Payment, or Digital Wallet Application by displaying to Passengers at the end of the trip the total fare, itemizing all time-and-distance fare, tolls, surcharges, extras, the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge, taxes, and for fares paid by credit/debit/prepaid cards, E-Hail Apps that provide for E-Payment, or Digital Wallet Applications (to the extent that the TPEP Provider processes the payment), default tip of 0 percent with tip options as specified in subparagraph (a)(2)(ii) of this section. The PIM must display all content required to meet the requirements of subdivision (a) of this section, including, if the TPEP permits, enabling the splitting of fares.

Section 13. Paragraphs (2) and (3) of subdivision (1) of section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended, paragraph (4) is renumbered paragraph (6) and is amended, paragraph (5) is renumbered paragraph (8), paragraph (6) is renumbered paragraph (9) and paragraph (7) is renumbered paragraph (10), and new paragraphs (4), (5) and (7) are added, to read as follows:

- (1) *TPEP and Taximeter Functionality.* The TPEP must enable the following functionality with regard to components of the TPEP and the Taximeter:

- (2) The TPEP must check the Taxicab Driver's training status against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing a Taxicab Driver to engage an Accessible Taxicab via the DIM. Taxicab Drivers that have not completed the appropriate training specified by the Commission must not be able to engage the TPEP and Taximeter via the DIM in an Accessible Taxicab;
- (3) The TPEP must check the Taxicab Medallion's status against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the Taxicab Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If a Taxicab Medallion is not Valid and active, the Taxicab Driver must not be able to engage the TPEP and Taximeter via the DIM;
- (4) The TPEP must check the Taxicab vehicle's DMV License status against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the Taxicab Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If a Taxicab vehicle's DMV License is not Valid and active, the Taxicab Driver must not be able to engage the TPEP and Taximeter via the DIM;

- (5) The TPEP must check the Taxicab Driver's License against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the Taxicab Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If the Taxicab Driver's License is not Valid and active, the TPEP must not allow the Taxicab Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM.

- [4] (6) The TPEP must check the Taxicab Driver's License before allowing the Taxicab Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If the Taxicab Driver's License is already logged in to another TPEP or LPEP supplied by that TPEP Provider, the TPEP must not allow the Taxicab Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM.

- (7) The TPEP must check the Taxicab Driver's DMV License status against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the Taxicab Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If a Taxicab Driver's DMV License is not Valid and active, the Taxicab Driver must not be able to engage the TPEP and Taximeter via the DIM;

Section 14. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (n) of section 75-25 Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (1) TPEP Providers must develop and maintain an application programming interface enabling developers of E-Hail Apps that provides for E-Payment and Digital Wallet Applications to integrate their apps directly into the TPEP data collection and transaction processing systems. Integration into the TPEP data collection and transaction processing systems includes but is not limited to:
  - (i) Providing access for E-Hail Apps that provide for E-Payment and Digital Wallet Applications to itemized fare data including time-and-distance fare, tolls, surcharges, extras, the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge, and taxes from the TPEP and Taximeter, when the trip has been completed and the Taxicab Driver has disengaged the Taximeter;

Section 15. Section 75-25 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new subdivision (r) to read as follows:

- (r) *Taxicab Improvement Surcharge Handling.* In addition to recording and displaying the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge on PIM screens, in end-of-shift reporting, on receipts, and in trip data as enumerated in subdivisions (a), (c), and (d) of this section, the TPEP Provider must provide the following to assist medallion owners and agents in paying the amounts of Taxicab Improvement Surcharges they owe:

- (1) Quarterly Statement Generation. Each quarter, TPEP Providers must produce two statements for each medallion that indicate the portions of the Taxicab Improvement Surcharges owed to each of the Improvement Funds for the previous quarter according to the proportions described in 58-16(g): a statement indicating the amounts owed to the Taxicab Driver Improvement Fund, and a statement indicating the amounts owed to the Taxicab Owner Improvement Fund. These statements must conform to a standardized format and layout prescribed by the Commission and must be generated according to the following schedule:

- (i) A draft of each Taxicab Improvement Surcharge Statement must be made available via the web portal to the Medallion owner or agent on the 5<sup>th</sup> of the month following the quarter's end;
- (ii) Medallion owners and agents must be able to review each of their Taxicab Improvement Surcharge Statements during a 15 day challenge period and raise any discrepancies with their TPEP Provider for correction. TPEP Providers must make corrections, as appropriate; and
- (iii) The amounts owed must be finalized following the 15 day challenge period and statements regenerated, if necessary, on the 20<sup>th</sup> of the month following the quarter's end;

- (2) Reconciliation File. Upon finalization of the amounts owed according to the schedule enumerated in paragraph (1) of this subdivision, the TPEP Provider must produce and transmit a reconciliation file to the Commission that summarizes the amounts owed to the Taxicab Driver Improvement Fund and the Taxicab Owner Improvement Fund for each medallion for the previous quarter. The reconciliation file must conform to a standardized format and layout prescribed by the Commission, and must be transmitted by secure FTP transfer according to a procedure prescribed by the Commission.

Section 16. Section 82-17 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York



is amended by adding a new subdivision (g) to read as follows:

(g) Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund.

- (1) A Street Hail Livery Licensee must pay the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge remitted by the Driver for each Hail Trip to the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund.
- (2) The Street Hail Livery Licensee must pay the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge to the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund at the time and in the manner required by the Commission.
- (3) If the Street Hail Livery Licensee does not pay the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge to the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund at the time required, non-payment may be grounds for suspension of the Street Hail Livery License, and/or denial of any renewal application or of any application for another TLC-issued license as well as monetary penalties.
- (4) Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge. The Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge will be allocated as follows:
  - (i) Drivers: 5 cents from the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge on each Hail Trip in a Street Hail Livery will be paid into a portion of the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund which will be allocated to Drivers of Accessible Street Hail Liveries.
  - (ii) Owners of Street Hail Livery License: 25 cents from the Street Hail Livery Improvement Surcharge on each Hail Trip in a Street Hail Livery will be paid into a portion of the Street Hail Livery Improvement Fund which will be used to make grants to persons required to place a vehicle into use that is required to be accessible under Section 82-06 (b)(2) of these Rules.

- (3) The LPEP must be able to generate an accurate receipt for payment of fare, whether payment is made by cash, credit, debit, or prepaid card, and such receipt must be offered to the Passenger. Upon the Passenger's request, a receipt either in hard copy form or in electronic form must be transmitted to the Passenger. The receipt must contain the following information:

Section 19. Subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (9) of subdivision (a) of section 83-31 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (9) The LPEP must be capable of generating the following data, whether payment is made by cash, credit, debit, or prepaid cards:

- (iii) end-of-shift data summarizing the number of fares, the total fare amount, and as applicable, the number of credit, debit and prepaid card transactions and the total fares of such transactions. End-of-shift data must be made available to the Street Hail Livery Driver by printing from the Taximeter or accessing electronically, at the Street Hail Livery Driver's preference, and must contain the following information:
  - (I) Permit number;
  - (II) SHL Driver's License number;
  - (III) shift start date and time;
  - (IV) shift end date and time;

- (b) Driver Information Monitor and Text Messaging. The LPEP must include a Driver Information Monitor (DIM) that is securely mounted in the driver-seat area with the following capabilities either itself or in conjunction with the other components of the LPEP:

- (1) The DIM must enable the LPEP to be turned on and interact with the Taximeter only upon log in which requires: system-initiated search of Valid TLC and DMV Licenses and system-initiated search of required training by vehicle type, as further enumerated in subdivision (l) of this section;
  - (i) entry of an active and Valid TLC-issued Driver's License number and an optional unique password set up by the Street Hail Livery Driver;
  - (ii) system-initiated search of an active and Valid Street Hail Livery License number of the vehicle prior to log in; and
  - (iii) system-initiated search of an active and Valid Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) Driver's License.]

Section 21. Paragraph (6) of subdivision (b) of section 83-31 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (6) As provided in subparagraphs (i) through (vi) below, the DIM must enable the Street Hail Livery Driver to indicate whether each trip originated as a Hail Trip or a Dispatch. Such indication must be recorded as a part of the Trip Data as required in subparagraph (xxiv) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (c) of this section and must be used to determine whether or not the MTA Tax and/or the SHL Improvement Surcharge should be included in the fare on the Taximeter.
  - (i) For trips using Rate Codes 1, 2, 4, and 6, the LPEP must record the trip as originating as a Hail Trip and the Taximeter must default to including the MTA Tax and the SHL Improvement Surcharge for any of these rate codes input by the Street Hail Livery Driver unless the Street Hail Livery Driver affirmatively indicates via the DIM that the trip originated as a Dispatch.
  - (ii) For trips using Rate Codes 1, 2, 4, and 6, the DIM must allow the Street Hail Livery Driver to indicate that a particular trip originated as a Dispatch by the selection of a series of buttons by the Driver. If the Driver indicates that the trip originated as a Dispatch, the Taximeter must not include the MTA Tax or the SHL Improvement Surcharge for any of these rate codes input by the Street Hail Livery Driver.
  - (iii) For trips using Rate Code 3, the LPEP must record the trip as originating as a Hail Trip and the Taximeter must default to including the SHL Improvement Surcharge, but not including the MTA Tax. The DIM must allow the Street Hail Livery Driver to indicate that a particular trip originated as a Dispatch by the selection of a series of buttons by the Driver. If the Driver indicates that the trip originated as a

Dispatch, the Taximeter must also not include the SHL Improvement Surcharge for Rate Code 3.

- (iv) For trips using Rate Code 5 (out of town negotiated fare or dispatched trips with a binding fare quote from a base), the LPEP must record the trip as originating as a Dispatched Trip and the Taximeter must default to not including the MTA Tax or the SHL Improvement Surcharge.
- (v) For trips using Rate Code 5 (out of town negotiated fare or dispatched trips with a binding fare quote from a base), the DIM must allow the Street Hail Livery Driver to indicate that a particular trip originated as a Hail Trip by the selection of a series of buttons by the Driver. The DIM must then include the SHL Improvement Surcharge, and prompt the Driver to indicate whether or not an MTA Tax should be included on that Hail Trip.
- (vi) The selections described above must be [made at the beginning of the trip, prior to engaging the Taximeter and displaying the Prologue on the PIM] editable by the Driver at any point during the trip prior to disengaging the meter.

Section 23. Subparagraph (v) of paragraph (2) and subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (4) of subdivision (d) of section 83-31 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended to read as follow:

- (2) An LPEP with a screen but without a Passenger Information Monitor must have the following features:

- (v) The screen must display to Passengers at the end of the trip the total fare, itemizing all fare, tolls, surcharges, extras, the SHL Improvement Surcharge (if applicable), taxes, and for fares paid by credit/debit/prepaid card, tip options as specified in subparagraph (i) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of this section, and permit Passengers to manually enter another tip amount or percentage at their option; and

- (4) Required features relating to PIM content are as follows:

- (iii) Payment Processing Information. The PIM must be used to process payment by credit, debit, or prepaid card by displaying to Passengers at the end of the trip the total fare, itemizing all time-and-distance fare, tolls, surcharges, extras, the SHL Improvement Surcharge (if applicable), taxes, and for fares paid by credit/debit/prepaid cards, default tip of 0 percent with tip options as specified in subparagraph (a)(2)(i) of this section. The PIM must display all content required to meet the requirements of subdivision (a) of this section.

Section 24. Section 83-31 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by relettering subdivision (l) subdivision (m) and adding a new subdivision (l), to read as follows:

- (l) LPEP and Taximeter Functionality. The LPEP must enable the following functionality with regard to components of the LPEP and the Taximeter:
  - (1) The LPEP may require the SHL Driver to enter both a user name and unique password via the DIM in order to engage the LPEP and Taximeter. The LPEP must enable an SHL Driver to login by pulling the SHL Driver's information from a smartcard for authentication when this technology becomes available;
  - (2) The LPEP must check the SHL Driver's training status against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing a SHL Driver to engage an SHL via the DIM. SHL Drivers that have not completed the appropriate training specified by the Commission must not be able to engage the LPEP and Taximeter via the DIM in an Accessible SHL;
  - (3) The LPEP must check the SHL Permit's status against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the

SHL Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If an SHL Permit is not Valid and active, the SHL Driver must not be able to engage the LPEP and Taximeter via the DIM;

- (4) The LPEP must check the SHL vehicle's DMV License status against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the SHL Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If an SHL vehicle's DMV License is not Valid and active, the SHL Driver must not be able to engage the LPEP and Taximeter via the DIM;
- (5) The LPEP must check the SHL Driver's License against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the SHL Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If the SHL Driver's License is not Valid and active, the LPEP must not allow the SHL Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM.
- (6) The LPEP must check the SHL Driver's License before allowing the SHL Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If the SHL Driver's License is already logged in to another LPEP or TPEP supplied by that LPEP Provider, the LPEP must not allow the SHL Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM.
- (7) The LPEP must check the SHL Driver's DMV License status against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the SHL Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If a SHL Driver's DMV License is not Valid and active, the SHL Driver must not be able to engage the LPEP and Taximeter via the DIM;
- (8) The LPEP must check the SHL Driver's License against the TLC-published Current Licensee lists before allowing the SHL Driver to log into the Taximeter via the DIM. If the SHL Driver's License has a designation that only allows them to operate Accessible SHLs, the SHL Driver must not be able to engage the LPEP and Taximeter via the DIM in a non-Accessible SHL;
- (9) When Taximeters are able to support electronic linkage to the LPEP, the LPEP must be programmed to only recognize and activate when connected to the Taximeter with which it was installed as approved by the Commission, in order to prevent unauthorized individuals from modifying or exchanging the Taximeter in any way. If a Taximeter is replaced, the LPEP must be reprogrammed by the LPEP Provider at an authorized maintenance facility to recognize the new Taximeter.
- (10) The LPEP must automatically log a SHL Driver out of the LPEP in the following situations:
  - (i) After a 60 minute period of inactivity when the SHL's engine is off; and
  - (ii) If another SHL Driver logs into the LPEP where the previous SHL Driver is still logged in to that same LPEP.
- (11) The Taximeter, DIM, PIM, AVL, and credit card processing unit must all be connected and functioning in order for the LPEP to engage. If any one of them is disconnected or not functioning (other than a network connectivity issue with the credit card processing unit, which is covered by the store and forward requirements outlined in paragraph (7) of subdivision (a) of this section), the LPEP must notify the SHL Driver that the LPEP needs to be serviced. If the LPEP is not repaired within 48 hours of the notification to the SHL Driver, the LPEP must not allow any SHL Driver to engage the Taximeter and pick up a Passenger until the LPEP is repaired.

Section 25. Section 83-31 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new subdivision (n) to read as follows:

- (n) SHL Improvement Surcharge Handling. In addition to recording and displaying the SHL Improvement Surcharge on PIMs and/or screens, in end-of-shift reporting, on receipts, and in trip data as enumerated in sections 83-31(a), (c), and (d) above, the LPEP Provider must provide the following to assist SHL Licensees in paying the amounts of SHL Improvement Surcharges they owe:
  - (1) Quarterly Statement Generation. Each quarter, LPEP Providers must produce two statements for each SHL permit that indicate the portions of the SHL Improvement Surcharges owed to each of the Improvement Funds for the previous quarter according to the proportions described in 59B-13(n)(4): a statement indicating the amounts owed to the SHL Driver Improvement Fund, and a statement indicating the amounts owed to the SHL Owner Improvement Fund. These statements must conform to a standardized format and layout prescribed by the Commission and must be generated according to the following schedule:
    - (i) A draft of each SHL Improvement Surcharge Statement must be made available via the web portal on the 5<sup>th</sup> of the month following the quarter's end;

- (ii) SHL Licensees must be able to review each of their SHL Improvement Surcharge Statements during a 15 day challenge period and raise any discrepancies with their LPEP Provider for correction. LPEP Providers must make corrections, as appropriate; and
- (iii) The amounts owed must be finalized following the 15 day challenge period and statements regenerated, if necessary, on the 20th of the month following the quarter's end.

according to the schedule enumerated in paragraph (1) of this subdivision, the LPEP Provider must produce and transmit a reconciliation file to the Commission that summarizes the amounts owed to the SHL Driver Improvement Fund and the SHL Owner Improvement Fund for each SHL permit for the previous quarter. The reconciliation file must conform to a standardized format and layout prescribed by the Commission, and must be transmitted by secure FTP transfer according to a procedure prescribed by the Commission.

(2) Reconciliation File. Upon finalization of the amounts owed

This publication gives notice that the City of New York (the City) has conducted an evaluation of several proposals under the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) grant, as required by Executive Order 11988 in accordance with HUD regulations 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. This evaluation is made to determine the potential affect that proposed activities in the floodplain will have on the human environment. Through the "Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013" (Public Law 113-2, January 29), the City's initial allocation of CDBG-DR funds is \$1,772,820,000. Of this total, the City has allocated \$648 million in funding for assistance to address the various unmet housing needs. The focus of this notice is the NYC Build-It-Back: Multi-Family Building Rehabilitation Program, which will be administered by the Department of Housing Preservation & Development (HPD). Of the initial \$648 million of CDBG-DR funds allocated to housing, \$215 million would be provided to HPD for the rehabilitation of multifamily buildings (5+ units) and 3-4 unit buildings that are not owner-occupied. **Proposed Action in the Floodplain:**

Under the Multifamily Building Rehabilitation Program, actions may include rehabilitation and resiliency measures such as repair to structure and grounds; elevation of facilities including electrical, mechanical, plumbing and elevator equipment to the extent practicable; and in the event of substantial damage and substantial improvement, modifying structures to elevate residential use above the base flood elevation. Additionally, eligible homeowners could seek reimbursement for pre-award costs associated with reconstruction, rehabilitation and demolition work. Specific project descriptions for the properties which are subject to this notice are contained below:

**128-11 Newport Avenue, Queens** - This property is a four-story, 47-unit cooperative complex with a parking garage. The property sustained damages to portions of its interior and exterior space along with first-floor units and common area. There is significant damage to mechanical equipment including the boiler and laundry room facilities. Reimbursement is proposed for work already completed to the common area space, which includes sidewalk repair, footings and water supply line replacement, resident mailboxes, meter base and safety switch replacement, boiler control panel, pressurized water tank, and the safety and mixing valve. The proposed repair scope for the common area includes aluminum window replacements, storefront aluminum door and frame, exterior door replacement, drywall, electrical rewiring, alarm and valve riser, backflow preventer, wood window replacement, complete boiler room repair, HP pump, and simplex condensate return pump. Reimbursement is also proposed for individual unit owners for repairs already completed including debris removal and mold remediation, electrical rewiring, replacing fixtures, flooring, drywall, doors, tiling, plumbing, heating systems, appliances, and repainting.

**156-51 78th Street, Queens** - This property is a three-unit, three-story townhouse which received extensive damage to the property's boiler, hot water heater, and sheet rock. All Sandy-related damages have been completed to date. Reimbursement is proposed for repairs including vinyl fence replacement, motorized valve replacement, water heater replacement, circulator pump installation, tile floor covering, drywall hanging, electrical rewiring, cabinetry work and deck planking.

**601 Brightwater Court, Brooklyn** - This property is a one-story, two-bedroom condominium that has sustained damages to portions of its basement and lobby area from flooding and window exteriors from heavy winds. Repairs are almost completed. Reimbursement is proposed for completed repairs, including window reglazing and aluminum window replacements.

**2838 West 36th Street, Brooklyn** - This property is a first floor unit in a three-story building that received seven feet of flood water. The unit sustained extensive damages to the floors, walls, and living spaces. While the owner has made a few repairs, more are needed in the kitchen and bathroom areas. Proposed repairs include aluminum window replacement, bathroom sink & vanity repair, and panelboard replacements. Reimbursement may be provided for already completed repairs, including engineered wood flooring installment, drywall hanging, extensive paint work, electrical rewiring, circuit breaker replacement, ceramic tile installing, shower tile replacement, and cabinetry work.

**4662 Bedford Avenue, Brooklyn** - This property is a second floor unit in a building that received two feet of flood water in the basement, which affected the owner's storage room and boiler and water heater. All repairs to the property have been completed and the owner is seeking reimbursement for the replacement of drywall, electrical rewiring, water heater repair, boiler replacement, and repair to the thermal expansion tank and circulator pump.

**722 Banner Avenue, Brooklyn** - This property was originally under construction and remains incomplete. The basement was completely submerged by floodwaters, and water reached almost two feet on the first floor. Damages include corrosion and structural damages to supporting beams and pipe, as well as prefabricated stairs and stored construction materials. The roof and exterior were damaged by wind and wind driven rain. The owner is seeking reimbursement for minor repairs completed after the storm, including electrical, drywall, ceramic tile, roof repairs, and cleaning. Repair scope may include I-beam repair, electrical work, piping, motors, sump pumps, drywall, tile floor, doors, painting, one bathroom, plumbing, and additional cleaning. The mitigation scope for common areas may include dry flood-proofing measures to elevate building systems and wet flood-proofing measures to prevent water intrusion. Other mitigation items may include measures such as backup building systems and flood barriers, as cost feasible.

**180 Christopher Street, Manhattan** - This 46-unit supportive

housing rental building sustained damages to the basement and first floor level due to flooding. Damage also occurred to the building's mechanical systems and roof. Reimbursement is proposed for repair work that has already been completed and financing for repair work and resiliency measures are also proposed.

**456 West 23rd Street, Manhattan** - This property is a ten-unit building that sustained damage due to three feet of floodwaters in the basement. Reimbursement is being considered for piping replacement and painting. The repair scope may include boiler replacement, doors, valves, painting, sump pumps, drywall, insulation, and tile. The mitigation scope for common areas may include dry flood-proofing measures to elevate building systems and wet flood-proofing measures to prevent water intrusion. Other mitigation items may include measures such as backup building systems and flood barriers, as cost feasible.

**2279, 2301, 2311, and 2333 5th Avenue, Manhattan** - This development consists of four buildings with a total of 624 condominium units. The structures sustained both interior and exterior damages as well as damages to the grounds from floodwaters and winds. Reimbursement is being considered for completed repairs and additional funding is being sought for repair and resiliency work including restoration of the external grounds, mechanical and electrical systems, security systems, community room and common space, and roof fans.

**Public Explanation of a Proposed Activity in the 100-Year Floodplain:**

The City has carried out the procedures required by Executive Order 11988 on Flood Plain Management including the consideration of a no-action alternative, to avoid adverse effects and incompatible development in the floodplain. *The no-action alternative would not achieve the City's goals of restoring the health and safety of hurricane-damaged multi-family housing for its residents, nor would it promote planning and implementation of resilience measures to mitigate damage from future weather extremes.* Residents would continue to be displaced from their homes located in the floodplain, live in damaged, unsafe, and unsanitary housing within the hurricane-damaged neighborhoods or seek shelter elsewhere. Poor structural integrity of hurricane-damaged buildings within the floodplain would put residents at a greater risk should a flood event occur, especially if buildings do not meet current elevation requirements. Storm debris fields on the properties of residential buildings would potentially remain unaddressed, also posing a threat to public health and water quality.

The City has considered alternatives and mitigation measures to be taken to minimize adverse impacts and to restore and preserve natural and beneficial values of the floodplain. It therefore proposes to support the projects because there is no practicable alternative to develop the projects totally outside the floodplain. To minimize potential harm to the floodplain, HPD will require that the projects implement the following mitigation measures:

- 1) Property owners will be required to purchase and maintain flood insurance for the life of the property or the term of federal assistance; and
- 2) All alterations and repair work must comply with the NYC Department of Buildings requirements for flood-resistant construction (Appendix G of the 2008 Building Code) and resiliency/mitigation measures described above will be implemented as practicable.

This notice is required by Section 2(a)(4) of Executive Order 11988 for Floodplain Management and is implemented by HUD Regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. All interested persons, groups and agencies are invited to submit written comments regarding the proposed use of federal funds to support activities located in a floodplain. Written comments should be sent to HPD at 100 Gold Street, New York, NY 10038, Attn: Patrick Blanchfield, AICP, Director of Environmental Planning, Office of Development, Room 9I-7. Comments may also be submitted electronically to [nepa\\_env@hpd.nyc.gov](mailto:nepa_env@hpd.nyc.gov). The minimum 7 calendar day comment period will begin the day after the publication and end on the 8th day after the publication. All comments should be received by HPD on or before October 31, 2014.

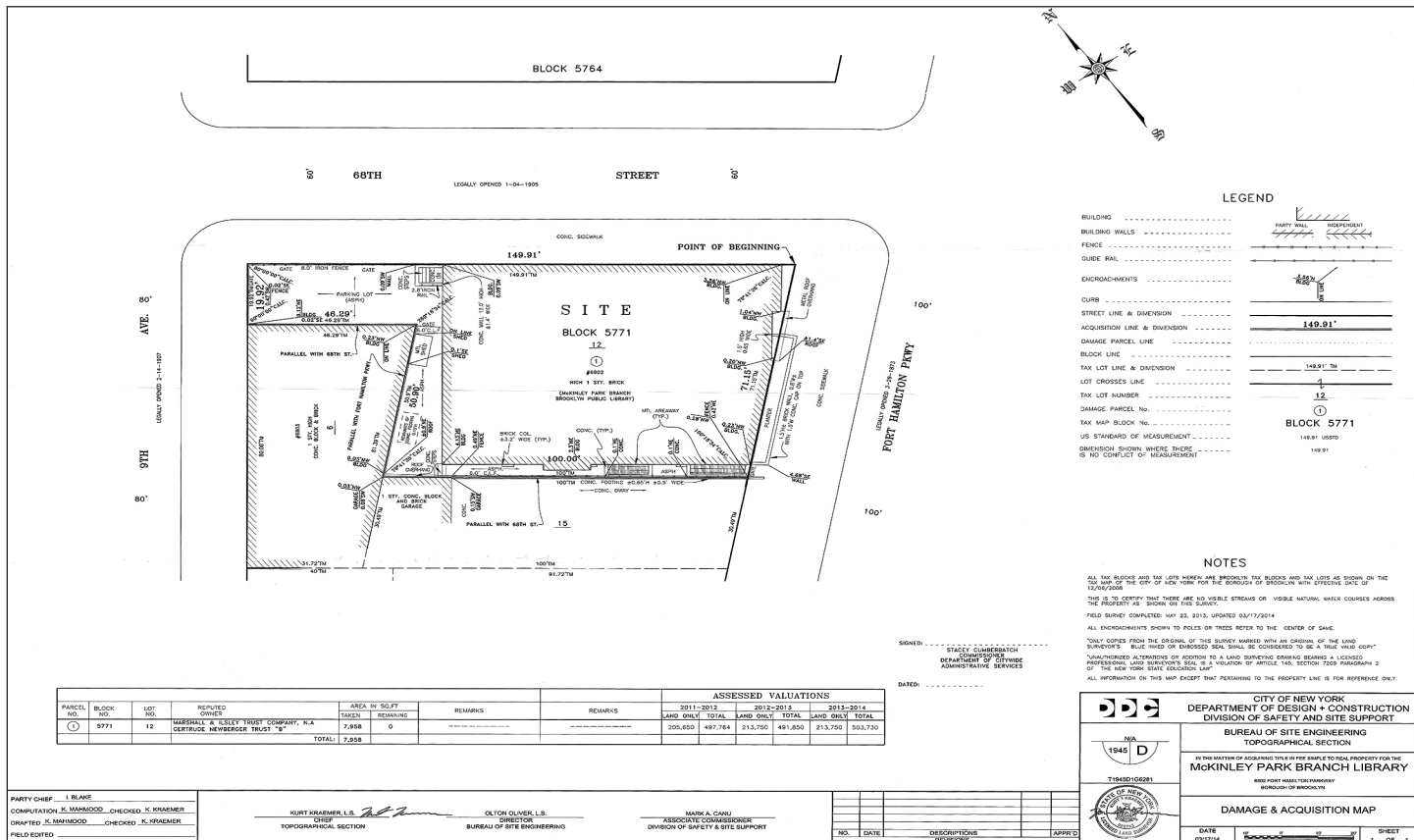

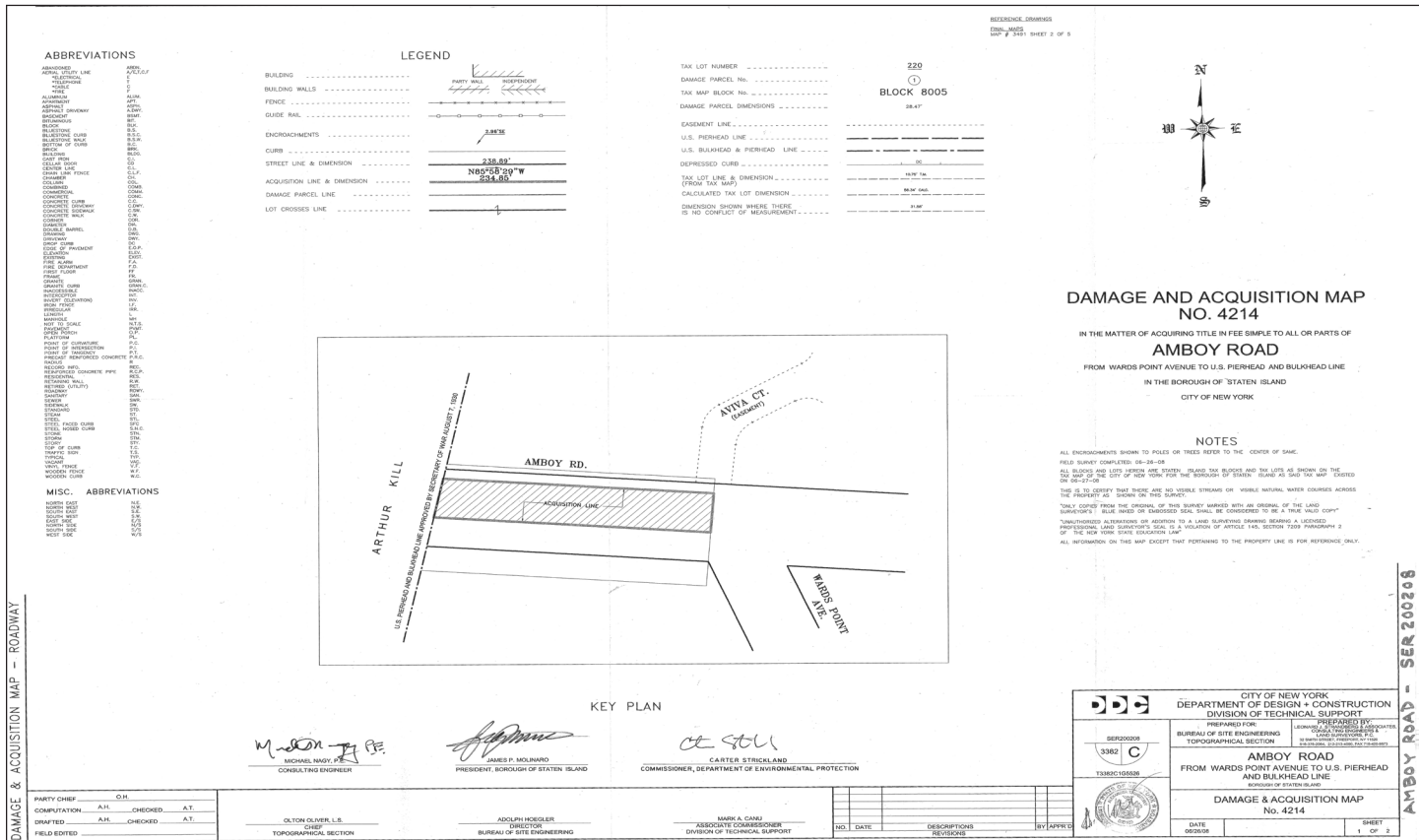

COURT NOTICE MAP FOR MCKINLEY PARK BRANCH LIBRARY



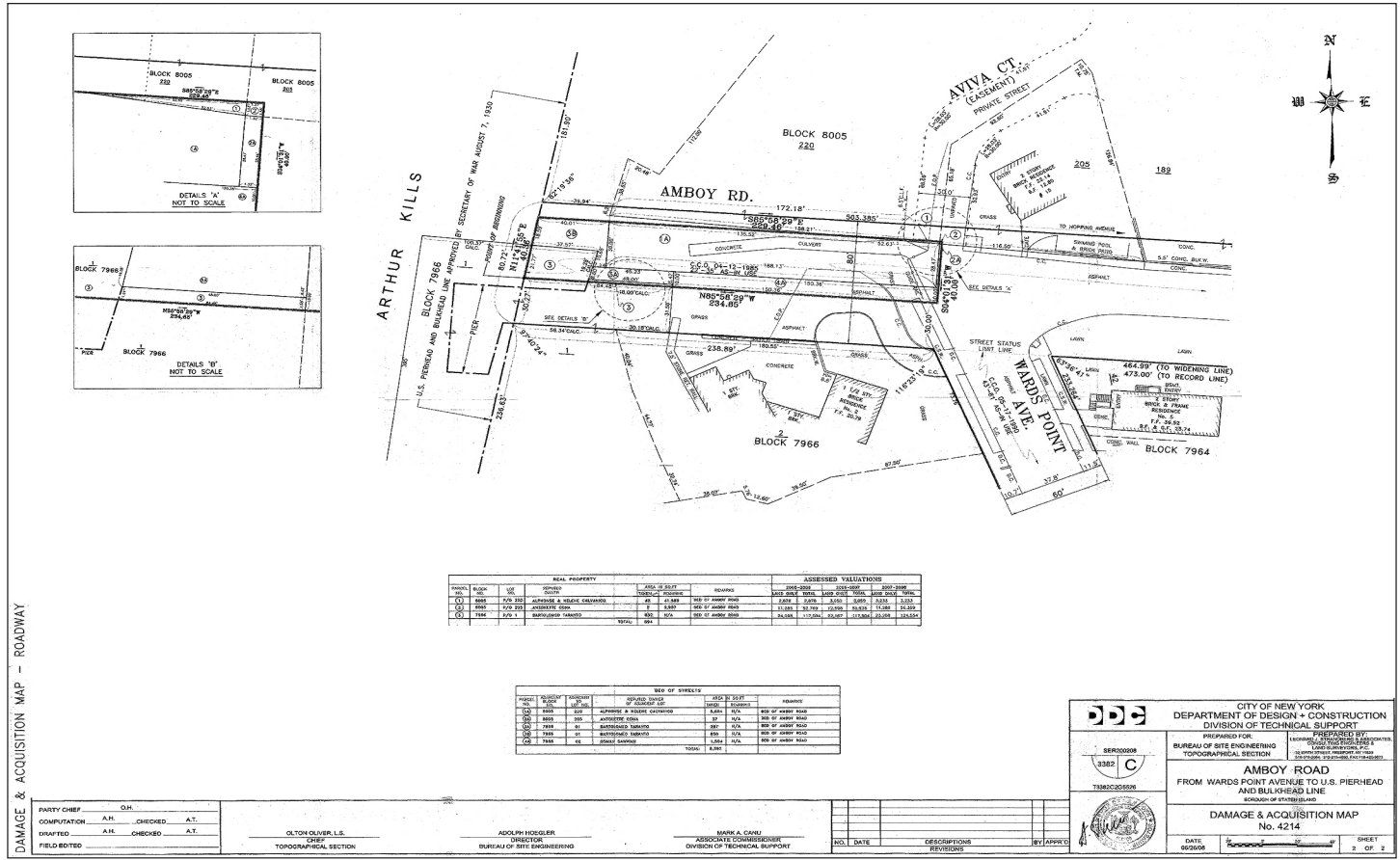

# READER'S GUIDE

The City Record (CR) is published each business day and includes notices of proposed New York City procurement actions, contract awards, and other procurement-related information. Solicitation notices for most procurements valued at or above \$100,000 for information technology and for construction and construction related services, above \$50,000 for other services, and above \$25,000 for other goods are published for at least one day. Other types of procurements, such as sole source, require notice in The City Record for five consecutive days. Unless otherwise specified, the agencies and offices listed are open for business Monday through Friday from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays.

## NOTICE TO ALL NEW YORK CITY CONTRACTORS

The New York State Constitution ensures that all laborers, workers or mechanics employed by a contractor or subcontractor doing public work are to be paid the same wage rate that prevails in the trade where the public work is being done. Additionally, New York State Labor Law §§ 220 and 230 provide that a contractor or subcontractor doing public work in construction or building service must pay its employees no less than the prevailing wage. Section 6-109 (the Living Wage Law) of the New York City Administrative Code also provides for a "living wage", as well as prevailing wage, to be paid to workers employed by City contractors in certain occupations. The Comptroller of the City of New York is mandated to enforce prevailing wage. Contact the NYC Comptroller's Office at [www.comptroller.nyc.gov](http://www.comptroller.nyc.gov), and click on Prevailing Wage Schedules to view rates.

## CONSTRUCTION/CONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR CONSTRUCTION-RELATED SERVICES

The City of New York is committed to achieving excellence in the design and construction of its capital program, and building on the tradition of innovation in architecture and engineering that has contributed to the City's prestige as a global destination.

## VENDOR ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

New York City procures approximately \$17 billion worth of goods, services, construction and construction-related services every year. The NYC Procurement Policy Board Rules require that agencies primarily solicit from established mailing lists called bidder/proposer lists. Registration for these lists is free of charge. To register for these lists, prospective suppliers should fill out and submit the NYC-FMS Vendor Enrollment application, which can be found online at [www.nyc.gov/selltonyc](http://www.nyc.gov/selltonyc). To request a paper copy of the application, or if you are uncertain whether you have already submitted an application, call the Vendor Enrollment Center at (212) 857-1680.

## SELLING TO GOVERNMENT TRAINING WORKSHOP

New and experienced vendors are encouraged to register for a free training course on how to do business with New York City. "Selling to Government" workshops are conducted by the Department of Small Business Services at 110 William Street, New York, NY 10038. Sessions are convened on the second Tuesday of each month from 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. For more information, and to register, call (212) 618-8845 or visit [www.nyc.gov/html/sbs/nycbiz](http://www.nyc.gov/html/sbs/nycbiz) and click on Summary of Services, followed by Selling to Government.

## PRE-QUALIFIED LISTS

New York City procurement policy permits agencies to develop and solicit from pre-qualified lists of vendors, under prescribed circumstances. When an agency decides to develop a pre-qualified list, criteria for pre-qualification must be clearly explained in the solicitation and notice of the opportunity to pre-qualify for that solicitation must be published in at least five issues of the CR. Information and qualification questionnaires for inclusion on such lists may be obtained directly from the Agency Chief Contracting Officer at each agency (see Vendor Information Manual). A completed qualification questionnaire may be submitted to an Agency Chief Contracting Officer at any time, unless otherwise indicated, and action (approval or denial) shall be taken by the agency within 90 days from the date of submission. Any denial or revocation of pre-qualified status can be appealed to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (OATH). Section 3-10 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules describes the criteria for the general use of pre-qualified lists. For information regarding specific pre-qualified lists, please visit [www.nyc.gov/selltonyc](http://www.nyc.gov/selltonyc).

## NON-MAYORAL ENTITIES

The following agencies are not subject to Procurement Policy Board Rules and do not follow all of the above procedures: City University, Department of Education, Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Health & Hospitals Corporation, and the Housing Authority. Suppliers interested in applying for inclusion on bidders lists for Non-Mayoral entities should contact these

entities directly at the addresses given in the Vendor Information Manual.

## PUBLIC ACCESS CENTER

The Public Access Center is available to suppliers and the public as a central source for supplier-related information through on-line computer access. The Center is located at 253 Broadway, 9th floor, in lower Manhattan, and is open Monday through Friday from 9:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., except on legal holidays. For more information, contact the Mayor's Office of Contract Services at (212) 341-0933 or visit [www.nyc.gov/mocs](http://www.nyc.gov/mocs).

## ATTENTION: NEW YORK CITY MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

Join the growing number of Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) that are competing for New York City's business. In order to become certified for the program, your company must substantiate that it: (1) is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned, operated and controlled by a minority or woman and (2) is either located in New York City or has a significant tie to New York City's business community. To obtain a copy of the certification application and to learn more about this program, contact the Department of Small Business Services at (212) 513-6311 or visit [www.nyc.gov/sbs](http://www.nyc.gov/sbs) and click on M/WBE Certification and Access.

## PROMPT PAYMENT

It is the policy of the City of New York to pay its bills promptly. The Procurement Policy Board Rules generally require that the City pay its bills within 30 days after the receipt of a proper invoice. The City pays interest on all late invoices. However, there are certain types of payments that are not eligible for interest; these are listed in Section 4-06 of the Procurement Policy Board Rules. The Comptroller and OMB determine the interest rate on late payments twice a year: in January and in July.

## HOW TO READ CR PROCUREMENT NOTICES

Procurement notices in the CR are arranged by alphabetically listed Agencies, and within Agency, by Division if any. The notices for each Agency (or Division) are further divided into three subsections: Solicitations, Awards; and Lists & Miscellaneous notices. Each of these subsections separately lists notices pertaining to Goods, Services, or Construction.

Notices of Public Hearings on Contract Awards appear at the end of the Procurement Section.

At the end of each Agency (or Division) listing is a paragraph giving the specific address to contact to secure, examine and/or to submit bid or proposal documents, forms, plans, specifications, and other information, as well as where bids will be publicly opened and read. This address should be used for the purpose specified unless a different one is given in the individual notice. In that event, the directions in the individual notice should be followed.
