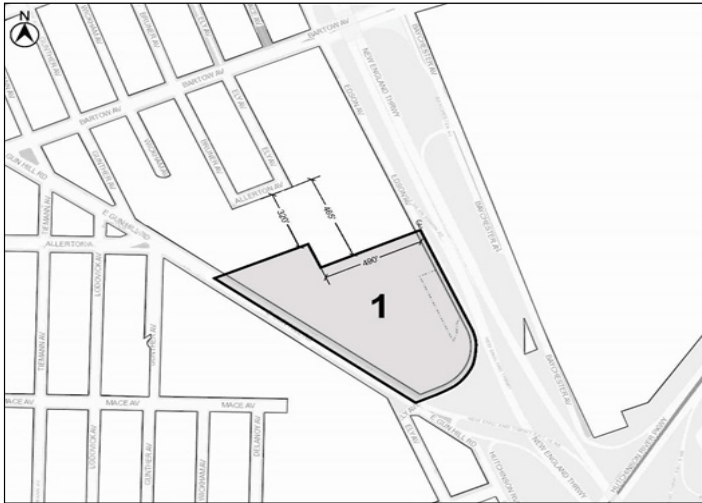

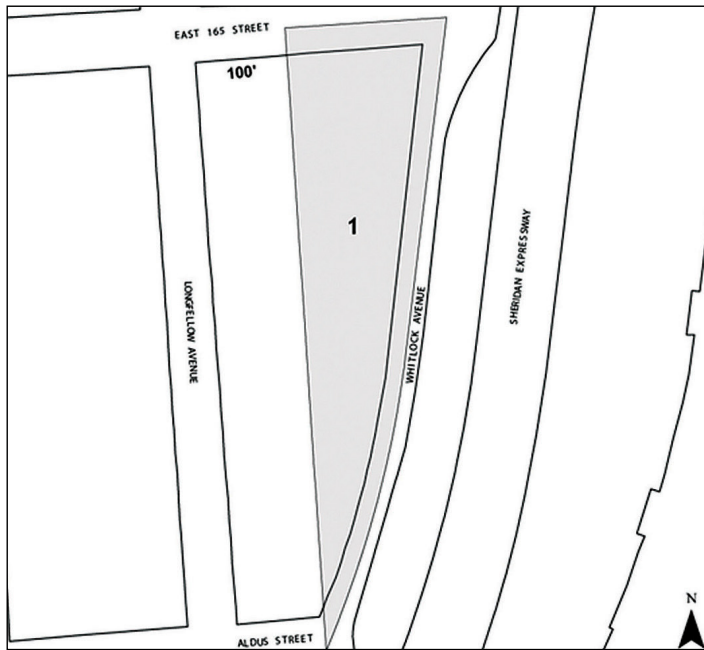

Locational restrictions

No #public plaza#, or portion thereof, shall be located within 175 feet of an existing #publicly accessible open area# or #public park# as measured along the #street line# on which the existing amenity fronts if the #public plaza# is to be located on the same side of the #street#, or as measured along the directly opposite #street line# if the #public plaza# is to be located on the other side of the #street#. Such distance shall include the width of any #street# that intersects the #street# on which the amenity fronts. However, such location restriction may be waived if the #public plaza# is located directly across the #street# from the existing #publicly accessible open area# or #public park# and if the Chairperson of the City Planning Commission finds that the location of the #public plaza# at such location would create or contribute to a pedestrian circulation network connecting the two or more open areas.

Additional provisions regarding the location of a #public plaza# are set forth in the #Special Midtown District#, the #Special Lower Manhattan District#, and the #Special Downtown Brooklyn District#.

Floor Area Bonus for Public Plazas

The maximum permitted #floor area# on a #zoning lot# may be increased, in accordance with the following regulations, where a #public plaza# is provided that meets the requirements of Section 37-70 (PUBLIC PLAZAS):

- (a) A #floor area# bonus for a #public plaza# shall ~~not~~ only be permitted for any a #development# or #enlargement# that is located within:
  - (1) outside the Historic and Commercial Core;
  - (2) outside the South Street Seaport Subdistrict; or
  - (3) beyond 50 feet of a #street line# of a designated #street#, except in C6-4 Districts, on which:
    - (i) retail continuity is required, pursuant to Section 91-41 (Regulations for Designated Retail Streets); or
    - (ii) #street wall# continuity is required, pursuant to the regulations for Type 1 or Type 2A #street walls# pursuant to Section 91-31 (Street Wall Regulations).
- (b) Within a C6-4 District, paragraph (a)(3) of this Section shall not apply to the location of a #development# or #enlargement#, however, a #floor area# bonus for a #public plaza# shall be permitted, provided that such #public plaza# is located beyond 50 feet of the designated #streets# referenced in paragraph (a) (3) of this Section.
- (b)(c) For each square foot of a #public plaza#, the basic maximum

#floor area# permitted by Section 91-22 (Floor Area Increase Regulations) may be increased, in C6-4 Districts, by six square feet, to a maximum #floor area# ratio of 12.0 and, in C5-3, C5-5 and C6-9 Districts, by ten square feet, to a maximum #floor area# ratio of 18.0.

(e)(d) When a #public plaza# that meets the requirements for a #floor area# bonus is located on a #zoning lot# divided by a district boundary, the bonusable #floor area# may be credited to either portion of the #zoning lot#, notwithstanding the location of the #public plaza# or the date of the creation of the #zoning lot#. The amount of bonusable #floor area# permitted on either portion of the #zoning lot# shall not exceed the maximum amount of #floor area# permitted on such portion if it were a separate #zoning lot# subject to all other provisions of Article VII, Chapter 7.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION** by Section 1043 (c) of the New York City Charter and Sections 24-178 and 24-105 of the New York City Administrative Code, that the Department of Environmental Protection has amended the penalty schedule for violations of Title 24, Chapter 1 of the Administrative Code, also known as the Air Pollution Control Code (Air Code). These amendments were proposed and published in the *City Record* on March 22, 2017, and no comments were received. A public hearing was held on April 26, 2017. No testimony was given at the hearing.

#### Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rule

On May 11, 2016, Chapter 43 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York, establishing a penalty schedule for violations of the Air Code, took effect. It has since been discovered that there is an error in the penalty schedule.

Administrative Code Section 24-169, which prohibits the use, purchase, sale, offer, storage or transport of fuel with excess sulfur content, is listed in the penalty schedule with the incorrect subdivision. The schedule should include § 24-169(a) and § 24-169(b) but not § 24-169(c), which is not a charging section. The amounts of the penalties are set forth correctly, and remain unchanged.

Consistent with the above, DEP promulgates the following amendment, to be found at 15 RCNY Chapter 43.

The text of the Rule follows.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN THE COMMISSIONER OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION** by Section 1043 (c) of the New York City Charter and Sections 24-178 and 24-105 and Sections 24-257, and 24-204 of the New York City Administrative Code, that the Department of Environmental Protection has amended the Air Code, and Noise Code Penalty Schedules by replacing outdated citations to the rules of the Office of Administrative Trials & Hearings (OATH). These amendments were proposed and published in the *City Record* on March 27, 2017 and no comments were received. A public hearing was not required.

**Statement of Basis and Purpose**

On August 7, 2016, OATH made changes to its rules, which are found at Title 48, of the Rules of the City of New York (RCNY). OATH has repealed the Air Code, and Noise Code Penalty Schedules from its rules, and these penalty schedules have been promulgated by DEP as 15 RCNY 43-01 *et seq.* (Air), and 15 RCNY 47-01 *et seq.* (Noise). When DEP promulgated these penalty schedules in its rules, outdated references to sections of OATH's rules were carried over. The proposed rules replace these outdated references.

Consistent with the above, DEP promulgates the following amendments, to be found at 15 RCNY Chapters 43 and 47.

The text of the Rule follows.

Section 1. The opening paragraph of Section 43-02 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§ 43-02 Air Code Penalty Schedule

When a respondent is found in violation of any of the following provisions of the New York City Administrative Code, Rules of the City of New York, or New York Codes, Rules and Regulations, any civil penalties [recommended] imposed by a Hearing Officer under 48 RCNY § [3-57(a)] 6-17(a) and/or any default penalties imposed under 48 RCNY § [3-81(a)] 6-20(b) in accordance with § 1049-a(d)(1) (d) of the Charter, and/or any civil penalties imposed for admissions of violation(s) under 48 RCNY § [3-32] 6-09(a), or late admissions under 48 RCNY § [3-81(b)] 3-17, will be imposed in accordance with the following penalty schedule:

Section 2. Sections 47-01 and 47-02 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended to read as follows:

§47-01 General

Whenever a respondent is found in violation of any of the following provisions of the New York City Administrative Code, or Rules of the City of New York, any civil penalties [recommended] imposed by a Hearing Officer pursuant to 48 RCNY §[3-57(a)] 6-17(a) and/or any default penalties imposed pursuant to 48 RCNY §[3-81(a)] 6-20(b) in accordance with §1049-a(d)(1)(d) of the New York City Charter and/or any civil penalties imposed for admissions of violation(s) pursuant to 48 RCNY §[3-32] 6-09(a) or late admissions pursuant to 48 RCNY §[3-81(b)] 3-17 will be imposed pursuant to the penalty schedules set forth below.

§47-02 Noise Code Penalty Schedule

All Citations are to the NYC Administrative Code unless otherwise indicated.

A stipulation penalty is imposed if there is a "Y" (Yes) in the Stipulation column in the Penalty Schedule rather than a "N" (No), and

if a stipulation is offered and accepted at a hearing.

Definition of 2nd and/or 3rd and/or 4th offense: By the same respondent of the same provision of law, order, rule or regulation as the previous violation and, if the respondent is the owner, agent, lessee or other person in control of the premises with respect to which the violation occurred, at the same premises as the previous violation (all violations committed within two years).

Pursuant to 48 RCNY §[3-81(b)] 3-17, a late admit fee of \$30.00 will be added to all the below listed penalties for a failure to submit a payment by mail, as per 48 RCNY §3-32, within 30 days of the mailing date of the default order issued against respondent.
