Notice of Adoption to add new rules requiring ticket sellers to disclose on tickets for trips involving the Statue of Liberty or Ellis Island, where applicable, that the trip does not land at Liberty Island or Ellis Island, and to prohibit ticket sellers from representing that a tour or trip includes any destination the tour or trip does not include or that consumers must pay for a tour or trip that can otherwise be taken for free.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN the Commissioner of Consumer Affairs by Sections 1043 and 2203(f) of the New York City Charter, and Sections 20-104(b), 20-558, and 20-702 of the New York City Administrative Code, and in accordance with the requirements of Section 1043 of the New York City Charter, that the Department adds Sections 2-442 and 2-443 and amends Section 6-66 of Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York.

This rule was proposed and published on August 15, 2019. A public hearing was held on September 16, 2019.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rule

The Department of Consumer Affairs (“DCA” or “Department”) is adding a new rule requiring ticket sellers to disclose on tickets for trips to the Statue of Liberty or Ellis Island that the trip will not land at Liberty Island or Ellis Island. Additionally, the Department is adding a new rule that prohibits ticket sellers from representing that a tour or trip includes any destination the tour or trip does not include or that consumers must pay for a tour or trip that can otherwise be taken for free.

The Department has learned of ticket sellers misrepresenting to consumers that a trip to the Statue of Liberty will also stop at Ellis Island or Liberty Island when the trip has no intent to do so. A disclosure on tickets for trips involving the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island will ensure that consumers receive proper information about the trip destination. Likewise, the Department has learned of ticket sellers misrepresenting the destination of trips and selling tickets for trips that are otherwise free, such as the Staten Island Ferry. This conduct is deceptive and harmful to consumers.

Finally, the Department is amending the penalty schedule for ticket sellers in Chapter 6 of Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York to add these new rules. Penalties for violations are based on Section 20-559 of the New York City Administrative Code.

Rule Amendment

Section 1. Subchapter II of Chapter 2 of Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to add the following:

§ 2-442 Required Disclosure for Trips or Tours Involving the Statue of Liberty or Ellis Island. Sellers of trips or tours involving the Statue of Liberty or Ellis Island that do not land at Liberty Island or Ellis Island may not possess or vend a ticket for such trip or tour unless the ticket contains the following disclosure, printed so as to be legible to the consumer in bold type of a size at least one-half as high and one-half as broad as the largest print on the ticket: “This trip or tour does not land at Liberty Island or Ellis Island.” If a trip or tour lands at Liberty Island but not Ellis Island, the required disclosure must read: “This trip or tour does not land at Ellis Island.” If a trip or tour lands at Ellis Island but not Liberty Island, the required disclosure must read: “This trip or tour does not land at Liberty Island.” This subdivision does not apply if the trip or tour lands at both Liberty Island and Ellis Island.

§ 2-443 Restrictions on Ticket Sellers.

- (a) A ticket seller must not represent or imply that a trip or tour includes a destination, perk, advantage, or benefit that the trip or tour does not actually include.
- (b) A ticket seller must not represent or imply that payment is required for any trip or tour that may otherwise be obtained for free, including, but not limited to, the Staten Island Ferry.

§ 2. Section 6-66 of Subchapter B of Chapter 6 of Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended as follows:

§ 6-66 Ticket Sellers Penalty Schedule.

All citations are to Title 20 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York or Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York.

Unless otherwise specified, the penalties set forth for each section of law or rule shall also apply to all subdivisions, paragraphs, subparagraphs, clauses, items, or any other provision contained therein. Each subdivision, paragraph, subparagraph, clause, item, or other provision charged in the Notice of Violation shall constitute a separate violation of the law or rule.

In certain cases, the Department may ask for license suspension or revocation, as permitted by statute. If a respondent is found in violation of multiple provisions that require a suspension period, the suspension periods shall run concurrently.

Unless otherwise specified by law, a second, third, fourth or subsequent violation means a violation by the same respondent, whether by pleading guilty, being found guilty in a decision, or entering into a settlement agreement for violating the same provision of law or rule, within two years of the prior violation(s).

The parties shall be authorized to present evidence to mitigate the license revocation or suspension period within the date range marked by two asterisks (**).

Where can I find the SAPO rules? The SAPO rules are in title 50 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What laws govern the rulemaking process? SAPO must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The Office of Citywide Events Coordination and Management (OCECM), Street Activity Permit Office (SAPO) administers New York City's permit system for street activities, block parties and fairs.

Each year SAPO issues permits to over 200 street fairs and over 5,000 other events, most of which include the use of multiple blocks over several days, the erection of structures, the vending of food, apparel and other goods and the use of amplified sound and the performance of music. Events like these require additional police officers which increases overtime costs to the City. These events also divert police officers from core crime fighting, public safety and counter terrorism duties.

To more effectively deploy police resources and control overtime costs, the New York City Police Department has requested that SAPO exercise its discretion temporarily to deny permits for additional events scheduled for calendar year 2019. The proposed rules will authorize SAPO to deny permits to these events only if the event was not held in the calendar year 2018. Events that received permits in calendar year 2018 will be eligible to receive permits again in calendar year 2019.

SAPO authority for these rules is found in section 1043 of the New York City Charter and Executive Order No. 105 of 2007.

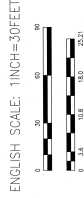
