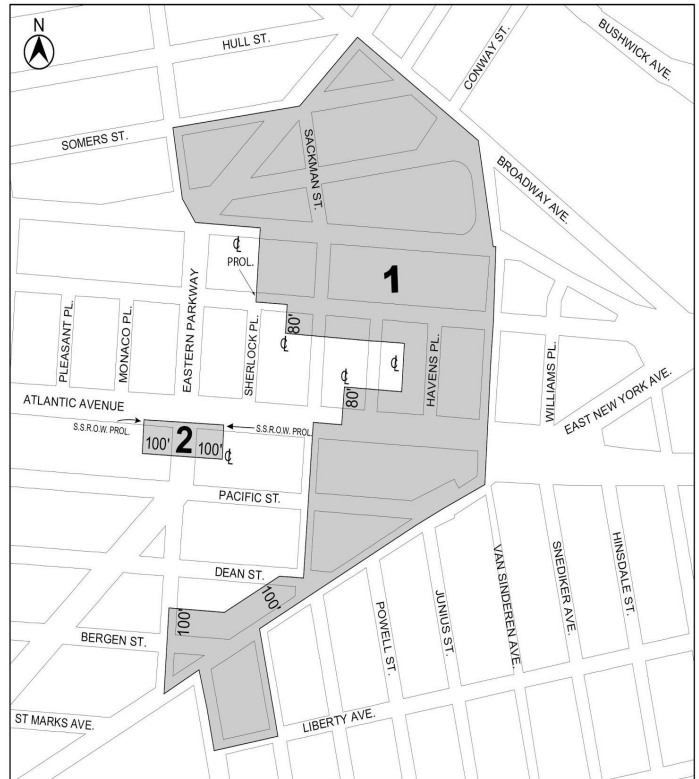

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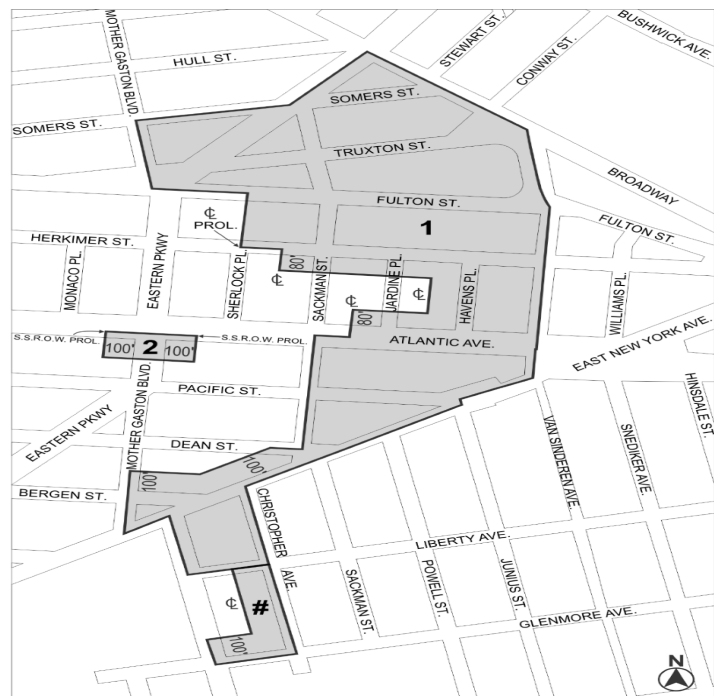

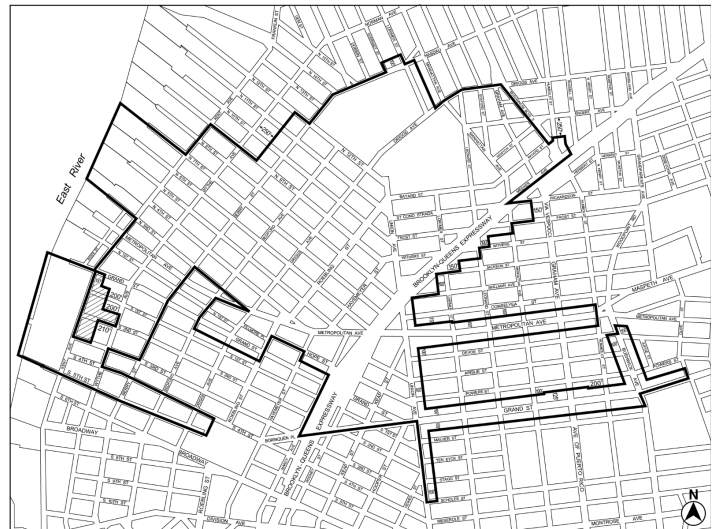

The public hearing is for the purpose of: (1) informing the public about the Project; (2) giving all interested persons an opportunity to provide comments on the General Project Plan, pursuant to Section 16 of the UDC Act; and (3), pursuant to Chapter 14 of the City Charter and Title 34, Chapter 7 of the Rules and Regulations of the City of New York, giving all interested persons an opportunity to provide comments on the granting of a revocable consent by the City of New York (the "City"), to allow the Project to span a City right-of-way.

Project Site

The proposed Project would be located primarily on property, owned by the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (“PANYNJ”), on Manhattan Tax Block 728, Lot 1 in Community District 4, and portions of it would extend over West 30th Street and West 31st Street, which are City-Owned streets.

Project Description

The Project is described in detail in the General Project Plan, available to the public as set forth below. The Project involves the design and construction of two new elevated bridges connecting the present terminus of the High Line spur, at West 30th Street and Tenth Avenue, to the privately-owned public open space at Manhattan West, a mixed-use development, located north of West 31st Street between Ninth and Tenth Avenues. The Project would create a seamless, safe pedestrian connection from Moynihan Train Hall to destinations on the Far West Side of Midtown, including Hudson Yards, the Javits Center and the Hudson River waterfront. The Project is anticipated to be completed in 2023.

The Project would be designed and built through a public-private partnership among ESD, PANYNJ, Friends of the High Line (“FHL”) and a Brookfield Properties affiliate (“Brookfield”). FHL, which will act as the grantee for the Project, is a nonprofit organization that operates the High Line and works with the surrounding community. The grantee for purposes of the GPP will be responsible for daily maintenance and cleanliness of the Project. FHL is devoted to reimagining the role public spaces play in creating connected, healthy neighborhoods and cities. Brookfield, which will act as developer of the Project, is a global commercial real estate firm and developer, and the owner of Manhattan West. Brookfield would manage the design and construction of the Project. The budget for the Project is \$50 million and will be funded by a \$20 million State grant administered by ESD and contributions of \$20 million from Brookfield and \$10 million from FHL.

Public Purpose

The purpose of the Project is to provide a new public amenity to improve public access, connectivity and pedestrian safety between Penn Station – North America’s largest transportation hub – and destinations on Manhattan’s Far West Side. The Project would create two connected public bridges linking the High Line to publicly accessible open space at Manhattan West, providing an ADA-accessible passage from the High Line spur to Ninth Avenue directly across from the Farley Office Building and Moynihan Train Hall. This new elevated pathway would provide a safe, seamless, and inviting connection for pedestrians through a heavily trafficked and uninviting area, and would improve public access, pedestrian safety and pedestrian mobility for residents, commuters, and visitors between transportation hubs to the east (Moynihan Train Hall and Pennsylvania Station) and Hudson Yards, the High Line, and Manhattan’s Far West Side. In doing so, the proposed Project would also complement and support the recent public and private investments that are transforming Manhattan’s Far West Side.

Discretionary Actions

A number of ESD discretionary actions are subject to review, pursuant to the UDC Act. These actions include awarding a \$20 million grant to FHL for the design and construction of the Project and affirming the General Project Plan. After a public hearing is held on the draft General Project Plan and a subsequent 30-day public comment period is concluded, it is expected that if appropriate, ESD will modify and/or affirm the General Project Plan and enter into a grant disbursement agreement with FHL to administer the State’s \$20 million Project grant. In addition, to effectuate the Project, as described in the General Project Plan, ESD would exercise its statutory authority to override the New York City Charter, the New York City Zoning Resolution, the New York City Administrative Code and the Rules of the City of New York to the extent they are inconsistent with the Project and the procedures for implementation of ESD projects under the UDC Act. This override includes, but is not limited to, the applicability of the Uniform Land Use Review Procedure (“ULURP”) insofar as it otherwise would be applicable to the Project, Public Design Commission review, and procedures for the issuance of revocable consents by the New York City Department of Transportation and any other local laws which are inconsistent with the design/construction of the Project and the General Project Plan. Subject to such overrides, the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code (the “Building Code”) will apply, including with respect to all construction, structures and infrastructure on the Project site.

The General Project Plan, which contains a detailed description of the Project, is on file at the office of ESD, 633 Third Avenue, New York, NY 10017, and is available for inspection by the general public between the hours of 9:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday, public holidays excluded.

What authorizes the Department to make these amendments? Section 390-j of the New York State Social Services Law, as enacted by Chapter 513 of the Laws of 2016, requires the Department to adopt rules pertaining to the issuance of performance summary cards to child care programs. Sections 1043 and 556 of the New York City Charter ("Charter") authorize the Department to make these proposed amendments.

Where can I find the Department's rules? The rules of the Department can be found in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What laws govern the rulemaking process? This notice is made according to the requirements of Charter §1043.

Statement of Basis and Purpose

Background

Pursuant to recent amendments to Social Services Law Section 390-j enacted by Chapter 513 of the Laws of 2016, the Department is required to issue performance summary cards to child care programs and to adopt related regulations. The Department enacted such regulations in a new Chapter 3 ("Performance Summary Cards and Penalties for Child Care Programs") of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, effective Jan. 28, 2018.

The Proposed Amendments

The Department is proposing to amend Chapter 3 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York to modify the contents of the performance summary card. The revised performance summary card will more effectively communicate important information summarizing the child care program's performance. Numerous fields that were part of the initial card are being removed to improve clarity. The data that is no longer being displayed will still be available on the Department's website and the revised card will provide information on how to access the website.

Facility and Program Violations

The Department proposes to present violations in two categories: facility maintenance violations and program operations violations, to provide parents with information about the nature of the violations that a child care program has received. The amended rule adds definitions for both categories of violations.

Lower and Higher Risk Violations

The Department proposes to distinguish violations within each category based on risk level. "Lower risk violations" would be all violations of the Health Code or a Department rule with a fixed penalty of \$200, which is the minimum penalty set forth in the Health Code. "Higher risk violations" would be all violations that have a fixed penalty over \$200. The majority of the Department's relevant penalties for this proposal are set forth in Chapter 7 (titled "Adjudicatory Hearings and Violation Fines and Penalties") of the Department rules in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York.

Excellent, Satisfactory, or Needs Improvement Rating

In order to clarify and make more meaningful the information to be presented to the public, the Department proposes to have the performance summary cards display ratings of Excellent, Satisfactory, or Needs Improvement for each category of violations, based on the number of violations a program received in that category and the risk level of those violations. The thresholds for these ratings are specified in the proposed rule.

This proposal was included in the Department's FY2022 Regulatory. The proposed changes are as follows:

Underlined language is new.
[Language in brackets is to be deleted.]

Section 1. Chapter 3 ("Performance Summary Cards and Penalties for Child Care Programs") of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§ 3-01 Scope and applicability.

This Chapter applies to any child care program holding a permit to operate in New York City pursuant to Article 47 of the Health Code ("Health Code") located in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York.

§ 3-02 Definitions.

When used in this Chapter, the following terms have the following meanings:

[Adjudicated violations.] "Adjudicated violation[s]" means a cited violation[s] of the Health Code or Department rules sustained following a hearing or default, pursuant to a decision by a hearing officer at the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings ("OATH"), or pursuant to a settlement agreement between the Department and a child care program, to the extent that such decision or settlement agreement remains in effect. "Adjudicated violation[s]" also [means] includes any cited violation[s] for which a hearing has not been held but for which the hearing date has been rescheduled at the request of the child care program more than one time.

"Facility maintenance violation" means a violation of the Health Code or Department rules related to the physical space of the child care, reflecting an environmental hazard or other physical deficiency in the real property covered by the permit, including but not limited to a violation of requirements related to internal and external spaces, physical plant, equipment and structural maintenance, sanitation, egress, fire and general safety, lighting, ventilation, plumbing, food safety or pest control.

"Higher risk violation" means a violation, other than a violation of this Chapter, with a penalty amount fixed by the Health Code or Department rules at over \$200.

[Initial inspection.] "Initial inspection" means an inspection conducted other than for the purpose of ascertaining whether a prior violation has been abated, or [of responding] in response to [the receipt of] a complaint.

"Lower risk violation" means a violation with a penalty amount fixed by the Health Code or Department rules at \$200, or a violation of this Chapter.

[Permit.] "Permit" means a permit issued by the Department[,] pursuant to Article 47 of the [24 RCNY] Health Code [Article 47].

[Permit suspension.] "Permit suspension" means a suspension of a child care program's permit to operate due to a violation of the Health Code or any rule promulgated by the Department, other than a suspension [based on a cited violation] that is subsequently [dismissed] vacated.

"Program operations violation" means a violation of the Health Code or Department rules related to permitting, written safety plan, staff qualifications, clearances, training, child supervision, child and staff health requirements, personal hygiene, child development policies, performance summary cards, records or documentation, Department inspections, or any other violation of the Health Code or Department rules that does not constitute a facility maintenance violation.

[Public health hazard. "Public health hazard" has the same meaning as "imminent or public health hazard," as such term is defined in 24 RCNY Health Code Article 47.]

[Site.] "Site" means the location, specified in a permit, where child care services are provided.

[Teaching staff.] "Teaching staff" means the education[al] directors, group teachers, [and] assistant teachers, and teacher aides of a child care program.

§ 3-03 Performance summary cards.

(a) ***

(b) A performance summary card issued [in 2018, or issued at any time] to a child care program [that has held a permit to operate at a site for less than one year] shall include the following information, as known as of the date such card is issued:

(1) the number of full years the child care program has been permitted to operate at the site, except that [for a child care program that has been permitted to operate at a site for] more than 10 years of operation[, such number] shall be indicated by "10+" and less than one year of operation shall be indicated by "<1";

(2) ***

(6) ***

(c) A performance summary card issued [after 2018] to a child care program that has held a permit to operate at a site for at least one year shall also include[, as of the date such card is issued,] the following information[, as known as of the date such card is issued] for the prior calendar year:

(1) the number of full years the child care program has held a permit to operate at that site, except that for a child care program that has been permitted to operate at a site for more than 10 years, such number shall be indicated by "10+";

(2) the number of children permitted to be cared for by the child care program at the site at any time;

(3) the number of teaching staff employed by the child care program at the site;

(4) the number of permit suspensions of the child care program's permit at the site during the previous three years;

(5)(1) the total number of [public health hazard] facility maintenance violations based on the prior calendar year's initial inspection(s) at the site and adjudicated [in the previous year] by OATH, to be reflected by the following ratings:

- (A) "Excellent" means having no such violations;
- (B) "Satisfactory" means having no more than two lower risk violations and no higher risk violations; and
- (C) "Needs improvement" means having more than two lower risk level violations or one or more higher risk level violation; and

[6](2) [the average number of public health hazard violations per inspection at the site adjudicated in the previous year] the total number of program operations violations based on the prior calendar year's initial inspection(s) at the site and adjudicated by OATH, to be reflected by the following ratings:

- (A) "Excellent" means having no such violations;
- (B) "Satisfactory" means having no more than two lower risk violations and no higher risk violations; and
- (C) "Needs improvement" means having more than two lower risk level violations or one or more higher risk level violations.

(7) the average number of violations of the Health Code or rules of the Department, other than public health hazard violations, at the site adjudicated in the previous year;

(8) the Citywide averages for the numbers of violations specified in paragraphs (6) and (7) of this subdivision for all child care programs, as calculated by the Department for the prior calendar year; and

(9) information on how to find the child care program's inspection record for the site online.]

§ 3-04 Posting.

(g)(f) If a child care program's performance summary card is damaged or stolen, the child care program shall immediately contact the Department to request a replacement card.

§ 3-05 Updated performance summary cards.

Upon request from a child care program based on a change to the number of adjudicated violations for the prior calendar year that would change either of the program's ratings, the Department shall provide such program with an updated performance summary card. The Department may also provide an updated performance summary card to reflect a new permit suspension. Updated performance summary cards shall reflect a child care program's adjudicated violations that were cited by the Department in the prior calendar year [adjudicated in the 12 months prior to the date of issuance] and permit suspensions imposed in the 36 months prior to the date of issuance. [The issuance of an updated performance summary card shall not require the Department to provide revised Citywide averages for the numbers of violations specified in §§ 3-03(c)(5) and (6).] Upon receipt of an updated performance summary card, the child care program shall post the updated card and dispose of the prior performance summary card in a manner that prevents its reuse.

2. SUBJECT: Extended Painted Sidewalk

A. Anticipated contents: Amend various sections of the Traffic Rules, including but not limited to:

- In Section 4-01, add a new definition for “extended painted sidewalk” as a closed area marked by a double solid line or bound by a double solid line and the curb that is only intended to provide additional sidewalk, median, or refuge space for pedestrians.
- In Section 4-04, clarify that “extended painted sidewalk” must be treated as sidewalk for the purposes of traffic operations and not as the “roadway”, i.e. pedestrians have the right of way to enter and stand in them at all times, etc., and provide any special rules or restrictions as to activities conducted there within.
- In Section 4-07, clarify that no vehicle is to cross a double solid line (double solid already defined in MUTCD 3B.04.30, but ambiguously defined as a lane line, i.e. between travel lanes, not explicitly at the edge of the roadway).
- In Section 4-08(e), clarify that no vehicle shall be parked/standing/stopping in an “extended painted sidewalk”, since they are considered sidewalk.

B. Reason: To provide a clear definition of term “extended painted sidewalk” and to define the prohibited activities within them.

C. Objectives: To prevent any operation of a vehicle, including parking, standing, and stopping, in areas marked by a double solid line or bound by a double solid line and the curb or edge of traveled way that is intended to provide additional sidewalk, median, or refuge space and to empower enforcement activities against such operations.

D. Legal basis: Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter.

E. Other relevant laws: Federal Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices section 3B.04.30

F. Types of individuals and entities likely to be affected: General public.

G. Approximate schedule: Third Quarter of FY 2022.

3. SUBJECT: Loading Zone

A. Anticipated contents: Amend Section 4-01 of the Traffic Rules by adding a new definition for “loading zone” to clarify that no person shall stand or park a vehicle in such zone except temporarily for the purpose of and while expeditiously receiving or discharging passengers or loading or unloading property to or from the curb, as well as conducting residential or commercial deliveries.

B. Reason: The Freight Unit is in the process of expanding the Neighborhood Loading

Zone (NLZ) program. The current NLZ toolkit requires two signs to communicate what types of activities are allowed in the zone (“No Parking” signage accompanied by a pedestrian level signage). However, research findings have revealed that this two-sign system is not always effective in conveying what activities are allowed leading to non-compliance.

C. Objectives: This proposed rule will provide a clear, consistent, and flexible loading zone regulation providing a broader application and use in DOT’s toolbox, replacing a restrictive parking regulation with a positive loading regulation. Provide clear indication of the purpose of expeditious pick-up and drop-off of goods and passengers from commercial vehicle, for-hire vehicles and personal vehicles using dedicated use signage and curb regulation (e.g. car share).

D. Legal basis for the proposed rule: Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter.

F. Types of individuals and entities likely to be affected: Commercial vehicle drivers, Taxi/For-hire vehicle drivers and all other licensed drivers of personal vehicles.

4. SUBJECT: Unmarked Crosswalks and Uncontrolled T-intersections

A. Anticipated contents: Amend Section 4-01(b) of the Traffic Rules to add crossings at T-intersections to the “unmarked crosswalk” definition and amend Section 4-08(f)(7) to prohibit parking at unmarked and at uncontrolled T-intersections.

B. Reason: Currently, it is illegal for pedestrians to cross at T-intersections without marked crosswalks and it is legal for vehicles to park alongside pedestrian ramps at such intersections. These regulations limit accessibility. Also, parked cars block pedestrian ramps that DOT is required to install to comply with ADA requirements, making them unusable for people with disabilities.

C. Objectives: Prohibit vehicles from blocking pedestrian crossing points at T-intersections and enhance safety and accessibility for pedestrians.

D. Legal basis: Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter.

E. Other relevant laws: American for Disabilities Act and NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law

F. Types of individuals and entities likely to be affected: Pedestrians and people with disabilities. Motor vehicle operators.

5. SUBJECT: Definition of Commercial Vehicles

A. Anticipated contents: Amend Section 4-01 of the Traffic Rules to create sub-categories or a hierarchy of commercial vehicle types that help define their function on NYC street.

8. SUBJECT: Cyclists Allowed to Follow Pedestrian Control Signals

- A. Anticipated contents: Amend Section 4-12(p) of the Traffic Rules allowing cyclists to follow pedestrian control signals when crossing an intersection, except where otherwise indicated by traffic control devices, and provided that the cyclist yields to pedestrians in the crosswalk.
- B. Reason: Formalizing existing behavior where cyclists are following pedestrian signals that provide a safe crossing ahead of turning drivers. In 2018, DOT conducted a seven-month pilot program to allow cyclists to follow the pedestrian signal at 50 designated intersections. The vast majority of the crashes occurring at these intersections during the study period were unrelated to the use of the pedestrian signal by cyclists. Based on the experience of this pilot program, allowing bicyclists to also benefit from head start provided by pedestrian signal will enhance safety for bicyclists and reduce stressful interactions at intersections without increasing the burden to any pedestrian.
- C. Objectives: To provide consistency between the NYC Administrative Code and the Traffic Rules.

9. SUBJECT: Cyclists Allowed to Turn on Red Signal Indication

- A. Anticipated contents: Amend Section 4-12(p) of the Traffic Rules allowing cyclists to turn onto an intersecting street during a steady red traffic control indication, except where otherwise indicated by traffic control devices, and provided that the cyclist stops their bicycle first and yields to pedestrians in the crosswalk and, if merging into a travel lane, yields to oncoming traffic on the intersecting street. A cyclist may not turn across opposing lanes of traffic.
- B. Reason: Formalizing existing behavior and providing cyclists an opportunity to turn ahead of turning traffic allowing them to avoid the blind spot of turning vehicles and the "hook" type of crash, one of the most common threats to cyclists at intersections.
- C. Objectives: To allow safe cycling behaviors by allowing an action that makes cycling safer by moving cyclists away from turning vehicles.
- D. Legal basis: Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter.
- E. Other relevant laws: NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law Section 1111.

10. SUBJECT: Cyclists Allowed to Proceed Through Red Signal Indication or Stop Sign at "Top of the T" Locations

- A. Anticipated contents: Amend Section 4-12(p) of the Traffic Rules allowing cyclists to proceed through red signal indication or Stop sign at "top of the T" locations, except where otherwise indicated by traffic control devices, and provided that the cyclist stops their bicycle first and yields to pedestrians in the crosswalk. A "top of the T" location is a location at an intersection that does not have an intersecting street.
- B. Reason: Formalizing existing behavior where there is no history of crashes. It allows cyclists to maintain momentum which saves energy and reduces trip time, making cycling more attractive.
- C. Objectives: To allow safe cycling behaviors by allowing an action that makes cycling more appealing and requiring less strength and energy.
- D. Legal basis: Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter.
- E. Other relevant laws: None.

11. SUBJECT: Update Carshare Rules

During the State of Emergency, and, to the extent such laws and rules may be suspended consistent with State law, the following laws and regulations related to procurement are suspended with respect to any procurement of goods, services or construction when the Commissioner of Correction determines in writing that the procurement is necessary to respond, to the emergency: Chapter 13 of the New York City Charter; Title 9 of the Rules of the City of New York (Procurement Policy Board Rules); and Sections 6-101 through 6-107.1, 6-108.1 through 6-121, and 6-124 through 6-129 of the New York City Administrative Code. Nothing herein shall preclude the DOC from complying with any portions of such laws or rules, to the extent that the Commissioner determines that compliance will not interfere with the agency's emergency response and the DOC shall follow the process in Section 315 of the New York City Charter unless the Commissioner determines in writing that doing so will interfere with the agency's response.

§ 3. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately.

I hereby direct, in accordance with section 25 of the Executive Law, section 61(2) of the New York Civil Service Law, and subdivision 5.1.1 of section 1 of rule 5 of the Department of Citywide Administrative Services' Personnel Rules and Regulations of the City of New York, that the City Cleanup Corps and staff from any agency, as designated by their Agency Head, shall assist the Commissioner of Emergency Management to carry out the directives set forth in this Order. The Commissioner of Emergency Management is further directed to take all necessary steps required to carry out the directives set forth in the Order.

§ 3. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified, at an earlier date.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 248
September 24, 2021

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2021, the federal monitor in the Nunez use-of-force class action litigation stated steps must be taken immediately to address the conditions in the New York City jails; and

WHEREAS, excessive staff absenteeism among correction officers and supervising officers has contributed to a rise in unrest and disorder, and creates a serious risk, to the necessary maintenance and delivery of sanitary conditions; access to basic services including showers, meals, visitation, religious services, commissary, and recreation; and prompt processing, at intake; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Correction's (DOC's) staffing shortages are affecting health operations, including the availability of escorts to bring patients, to the clinic and of DOC personnel to staff the clinics; and

WHEREAS, this Order is given to address the effects of excessive staff absenteeism and in order to address the conditions, at DOC facilities;

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2021, I issued Emergency Executive Order No. 241 and declared a state of emergency to exist within the correction facilities operated by the DOC, and such declaration remains in effect; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant, to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited, to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct that Emergency Executive Order No. 239, dated September 14, 2021 and last extended by Emergency Executive Order No. 244 shall be superseded in its entirety by the provisions of section 2 of this Order.

§ 2. a. The program set forth in this section shall be known as the “Key to NYC” program.

b. I hereby order that, except as provided in subdivision c of this section, a covered entity shall not permit a patron, full- or part-time employee, intern, volunteer, or contractor to enter a covered premises without displaying proof of vaccination and identification bearing the same identifying information as the proof of vaccination.

c. I hereby order that the following individuals are exempted from this section, and therefore may enter a covered premises without displaying proof of vaccination, provided that such individuals wear a face mask, at all times when they are unable to maintain six (6) feet of distance from other individuals inside the covered premises:

(1) Individuals entering for a quick and limited purpose (for example, using the restroom, placing or picking up an order or service, changing clothes in a locker room, or performing necessary repairs);

(2) A nonresident performing artist not regularly employed by the covered entity, or a nonresident individual accompanying such a performing artist, while the performing artist or individual is in a covered premises for the purposes of such artist’s performance, except that a performing artist is not required to wear a face mask while performing;

(3) A nonresident professional, athlete/sports team that is not based in New York City (i.e., not a New York City “home team”), or a nonresident individual accompanying such professional, athlete/sports team, who enters a covered premises as part of their regular employment for purposes of the professional, athlete/sports team competition, except that such a professional, athlete is not required to wear a face mask while playing in a competition;

(4) An individual 12 years of age or older who enters a covered premises to participate in a school or after-school program offered by any pre-kindergarten through grade twelve public or non-public school, the Department of Youth & Community Development, or another City agency; and

(5) An individual who enters for the purposes of voting or, pursuant to law, assisting or accompanying a voter or observing the election.

d. I hereby direct each covered entity to develop and keep a written record describing the covered entity’s protocol for implementing and enforcing the requirements of this section. Such written record shall be available for inspection upon a request of a City official as allowed by law.

e. I hereby direct each covered entity to post a sign in a conspicuous place that is viewable by prospective patrons prior to entering the establishment. The sign must alert patrons, to the vaccination requirement in this section and inform them that employees and patrons are required to be vaccinated. The Department for Health and Mental Hygiene (“DOHMH”) shall determine the text of such sign and provide a template on its website that a covered entity may use. A covered entity may use the sign available online, at nyc.gov/keytoNYC, or use its own sign, provided its sign must be no smaller than 8.5 inches by 11 inches, with text provided by DOHMH in, at least 14-point font.

f. For the purposes of this Order:

(1) “Contractor” means the owner or employee of any business that a covered entity has hired to perform work within a covered premise.

(2) “Covered entity” means any entity that operates one or more covered premises, except that it shall not include pre-kindergarten through grade twelve (12) public and non-public schools and programs, houses of worship, childcare programs, senior centers, community centers, or as otherwise indicated by this Order.

(3) “Covered premises” means any of the following locations, except as provided in subparagraph (iv) of this paragraph:

(i) **Indoor Entertainment and Recreational Settings, and Certain Event and Meeting Spaces** including indoor portions of the following locations, regardless of the activity, at such locations: movie theaters, music or concert venues, adult entertainment, casinos, botanical gardens, commercial event and party venues, museums, aquariums, zoos, professional sports arenas and indoor stadiums, convention centers and exhibition halls, hotel meeting and event spaces, performing arts theaters, bowling alleys, arcades, indoor play areas, pool and billiard halls, and other recreational game centers;

(ii) **Indoor Food Services**, including indoor portions of food service establishments offering food and drink, including all indoor dining

areas of food service establishments that receive letter grades as described in section 81.51 of the Health Code; businesses operating indoor seating areas of food courts; catering food service establishments that provide food indoors on its premises; and any indoor portions of an establishment that is regulated by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets offering food for on-premises indoor consumption. The requirements of this Order shall not apply to any establishment offering food or drink exclusively for off-premises or outdoor consumption, or to a food service establishment providing only charitable food services, such as soup kitchens;

(iii) **Indoor Gyms and Fitness Settings**, including indoor portions of standalone and hotel gyms and fitness centers, gyms and fitness centers in higher education institutions, yoga/Pilates/barre/dance studios, boxing/kickboxing gyms, fitness boot camps, indoor pools, CrossFit or other plyometric boxes, and other facilities used for conducting group fitness classes.

(iv) “Covered premises” do not include houses of worship or locations in a residential or office building the use of which is limited to residents, owners, or tenants of that building.

(4) “Indoor portion” means any part of a covered premises with a roof or overhang that is enclosed by, at least three walls, except that the following will not be considered an indoor portion: (1) a structure on the sidewalk or roadway if it is entirely open on the side facing the sidewalk; and (2) an outdoor dining structure for individual parties, such as a plastic dome, if it has adequate ventilation to allow for air circulation.

(5) “Nonresident” means any individual who is not a resident of New York City.

(6) “Patron” means any individual 12 years of age or older who patronizes, enters, attends an event, or purchases goods or services within a covered premise.

(7) “Identification” means an official document bearing the name of the individual and a photo or date of birth. Examples of acceptable identification include but are not limited to: driver’s license, non-driver government ID card, IDNYC, passport, and school ID card.

(8) “Proof of vaccination” means proof of receipt of, at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine authorized for emergency use or licensed for use by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration or authorized for emergency use by the World Health Organization. Such proof may be established by:

(i) A CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card or an official immunization record from the jurisdiction, state, or country where the vaccine was administered or a digital or physical photo of such a card or record, reflecting the person’s name, vaccine brand, and date administered; or

(ii) A New York City COVID Safe Pass (available to download on Apple and Android smartphone devices);

(iii) A New York State Excelsior Pass;

(iv) CLEAR’s digital vaccine card; or

(v) any other method specified by the Commissioner of Health and Mental Hygiene as sufficient to demonstrate proof of vaccination.

g. I hereby direct that each instance that a covered entity fails to check an individual’s vaccination status shall constitute a separate violation of this section.

h. I hereby direct the City’s Commission on Human Rights to publish guidance to assist covered entities in complying with this section in an equitable manner consistent with applicable provisions of the New York City Human Rights Law.

i. I hereby direct, in accordance with section 25 of the Executive Law, that staff from any agency designated by the Commissioner of Health and Mental Hygiene shall enforce the directives set forth in this section.

j. (1) I hereby direct that any person or entity who is determined to have violated the requirements of the Key to NYC program shall be subject to a fine, penalty and forfeiture of not less than \$1,000. If the person or entity is determined to have committed a subsequent violation of this section within twelve months of the initial violation for which a penalty was assessed, such person or entity shall be subject to a fine, penalty and forfeiture of not less than \$2,000. For every violation thereafter, such person or entity shall be subject to a fine, penalty and forfeiture of not less than \$5,000 if the person or entity committed the violation within twelve months of the violation for which the second penalty was assessed. This section may be enforced, pursuant to sections 3.05, 3.07, or 3.11 of the Health Code and sections 558 and 562 of the Charter.

(2) I hereby suspend: (i) Appendix 7-A of Chapter 7 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, to the extent it would limit a violation of this section to be punished with a standard penalty of \$1,000 or a default penalty of \$2,000; and (ii) section 7-08 of such Chapter 7 and section 3.11 of the Health Code, to the extent such provisions would limit the default penalty amount that may be imposed for a violation of this section to \$2,000.

k. Covered entities shall comply with further guidelines issued by DOHMH to further the intent of this section and increase the number of vaccinated individuals in the City.

l. Section 20-1271 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York is modified by adding the following provision, to the definition of "just cause:" Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter, a fast food employer shall be deemed to have just cause when a fast food employee has failed, to provide proof of vaccination required by an emergency executive order issued in response, to the COVID-19 pandemic and shall not be required to follow progressive discipline procedures prior to terminating the employee, provided that the employee shall have 30 days from the date when the employer notified the employee of the requirement to submit such proof and the employee shall be placed on leave following such notification until such proof is provided. This provision shall not excuse the employer from the responsibility, to provide a reasonable accommodation where required by law.

§ 3. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
