The following agenda item will be heard:

1) Flatbush Avenue BID Expansion (N 230160BDK)

An application by the Department of Small Businesses Services (SBS) pursuant to Section 25405(a) of Chapter 4, Title 25 of the New York City administrative code to expand and amend the Flatbush Avenue Business Improvement District (BID) in Brooklyn community districts 9 and 14 (CDs 9 and 14).

2) Paperific Rezoning (220470 ZMK, 220471 ZRK, 220472 ZSK)

An application by Paperific Supermarket pursuant to sections 197-c and 201 of the New York City Charter affecting 25 tax lots (of which four are applicant-owned) fronting the west side of 15th Avenue, as well as 37th and 38th streets. The applicant seeks a zoning map amendment to change the project area from M1-2, M2-1, and R6 to C4-4A and R6B districts, a zoning text amendment to establish a coterminous Mandatory Inclusionary Housing (MIH) area, and a special permit pursuant to ZR Section 74-681 to allow development over a right-of-way where elevated transit service has been discontinued. These actions would enable a five-story, 103,512 square-foot building with a 19,985 square-foot ground-floor supermarket and commercial office uses above at 1459 38th Street in Brooklyn Community District 12 (CD 12). The building's cellar would contain 63 vehicular parking spaces accessible via 37th Street.

BUILD NYC RESOURCE CORPORATION

■ PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Build NYC Resource Corporation (the "Corporation") is a not-for-profit local development corporation organized under Sections 402 and 1411 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York. In accordance with the aforesaid law, and pursuant to its certificate of incorporation, the Corporation has the power to issue non-recourse revenue bonds or notes and to make the proceeds of those bonds or notes available for projects that promote community and economic development in The City of New York (the "City"), and to thereby create jobs in the non-profit and for-profit sectors of the City's economy. The Corporation has been requested to issue such bonds and notes for the financings listed below in the approximate dollar amounts respectively indicated. As used herein, "bonds" or "notes" are the bonds or notes of the Corporation, the interest on which may be exempt from local and/or state and/or federal income taxes; and, with reference to the bond or note amounts provided herein below, "approximately" shall be deemed to mean up to such stated bond or note amount or a greater principal amount not to exceed 10% of such stated bond or note amount. All other amounts and square footage amounts and wage information shown below are approximate numbers.

Borrower Name: Associated Beth Rivkah School for Girls Inc. (the "School" or the "Borrower"), a New York religious corporation exempt from federal income taxation pursuant to section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). The School provides a pre-k-12 and post-secondary education in Judaic and general studies for girls. **Financing Amount:** \$35,000,000 in tax-exempt qualified 501(c)(3) bonds issued pursuant to section 145 of the Code and/or taxable bonds (the "Bonds"). **Project Description:** As part of a plan of financing, proceeds from the Bonds will be used to: (i) refinance \$4,339,000 outstanding balance of a taxable loan that was funded in the original amount of \$4,500,000, the proceeds of which were used to refinance prior outstanding loans and fund the purchase and maintenance of equipment, with such proceeds used for facilities located at 470 Lefferts Avenue, Brooklyn, NY, 370 Crown Street, Brooklyn, NY and 310 Crown Street, Brooklyn, NY (the "Pre-K-12 Facility"); (ii) finance the cost of constructing, renovating, equipping, and furnishing of an 80,000 square foot seven-story building located on a 32,569 square foot parcel of land at 302 Crown Street, Brooklyn, NY (which address will be changed to 451 Montgomery Street, Brooklyn, NY) (the "Post-Secondary Facility"); (iii) fund debt service reserve fund(s); (iv) fund capitalized interest; and (v) pay for certain costs related to the issuance of the Bonds. The Pre-K-12 Facility will be owned and operated by the Borrower as a pre-kindergarten through Grade 12 school for girls and the Post-Secondary Facility will be owned and operated by the Borrower as a post-secondary academic institute and related dormitory for its post-secondary students. The renovations will include the creation of 180 dormitory beds, 15 classrooms, and other related student-life facilities including lounges, a garden, and a fitness center. **Addresses:** 302 Crown Street, Brooklyn, NY 11225, 470 Lefferts Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11225, 370 Crown Street, Brooklyn, NY 11225 and 310 Crown Street, Brooklyn, NY 11225. **Type of Benefits:** Tax-exempt and/or taxable bond financing and exemption from City and State mortgage recording taxes. **Total Project Cost:** \$35,000,000. **Projected Jobs:** 179.5 full time equivalent jobs retained and 16 projected. **Hourly Wage Average and Range:** \$42.52/hour, estimated range of \$15.00/hour to \$65.00/hour.

Borrower Name: Little Red School House and Elisabeth Irwin High School Inc., a New York not-for-profit corporation which is exempt from federal taxation pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), as borrower (the "Borrower"). The Borrower operates a private co-educational school for students from pre-kindergarten through Grade 12. **Financing Amount:** \$12,270,000 in tax-exempt and/or taxable bonds (the "Bonds"). The tax-exempt bonds will be issued as qualified 501(c)(3) bonds for educational facilities under Section 145 of the Code. **Project Description:** Proceeds of the Bonds will be used, along with other funds of the Borrower to: (i) refinance existing Build NYC Resource Corporation Tax-Exempt Revenue Bonds (2013 Little Red School House and Elisabeth Irwin High School Project) issued in the original principal amount of \$11,000,000 and currently outstanding principal

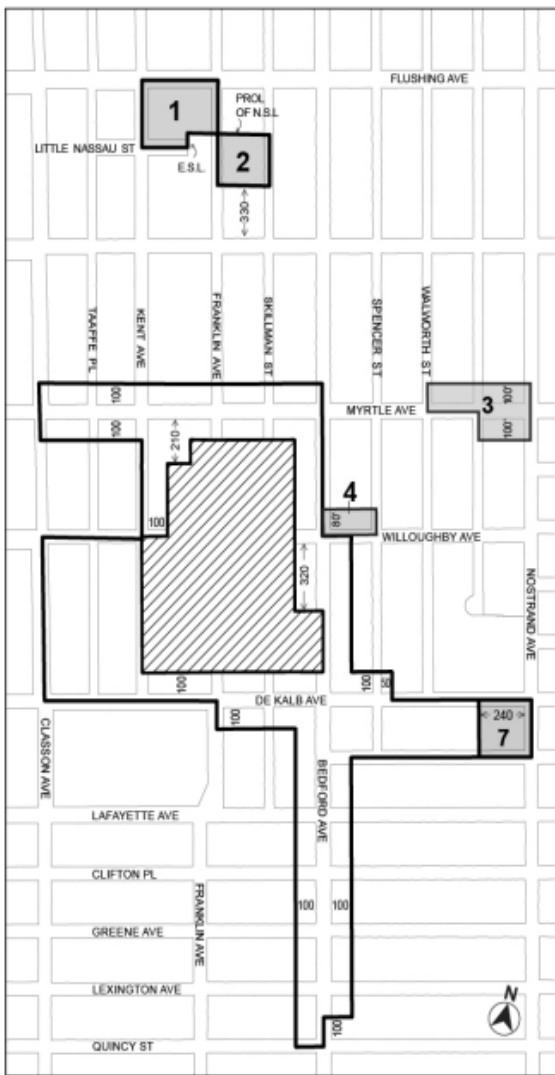

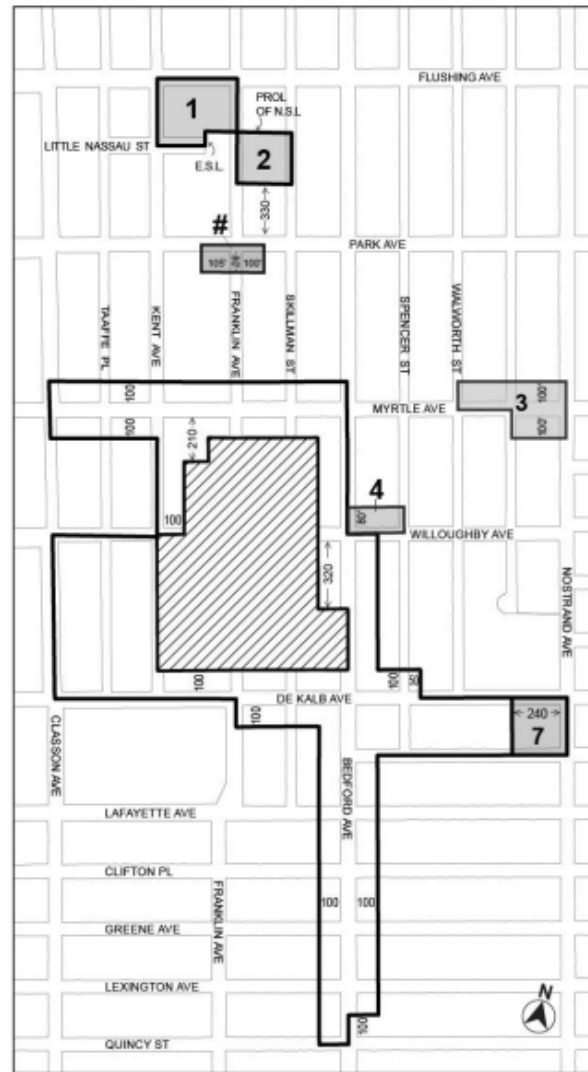

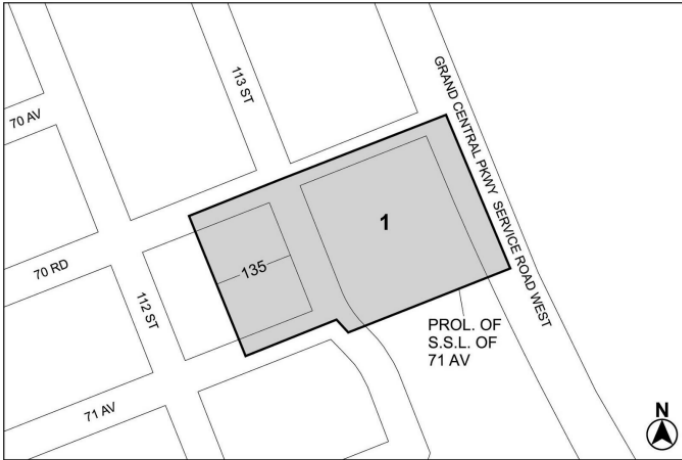

is restored and reused as a public accessible open space. The amount of such contribution shall be determined in the manner prescribed in Section 98-35 (High Line Transfer Corridor Bonus). No building permit for any #development# or #enlargement# may be issued for any #building or other structure# on the #zoning lot# that will contain #floor area# made available to the #zoning lot# as a result of the application of this Section unless and until such certification has been made.

98-423 Street wall location, minimum and maximum base heights and maximum building heights

The provisions set forth in paragraph (a) of this Section shall apply to all #buildings or other structures#. Such provisions are modified for certain subareas as set forth in paragraphs (b) through (h) of this Section.

(a) For all #buildings#

(1) #Street wall# location provisions

On #wide streets#, and on #narrow streets# within 50 feet of their intersection with a #wide street#, the #street wall# shall be located on the #street line# and extend along such entire #street# frontage of the #zoning lot# up to at least the minimum base height specified in the table in this Section. On #narrow street# frontages, beyond 50 feet of their intersection with a #wide street#, the #street wall# shall be located on the #street line# and extend along at least 70 percent of the #narrow street# frontage of the #zoning lot# up to at least the minimum base height specified in the table in this Section.

Where #street walls# are required to be located on the #street line#, recesses, not to exceed three feet in depth from the #street line#, shall be permitted on the ground floor where required to provide access to the #building#. Above a height of 12 feet, up to 30 percent of the #aggregate width of street walls# may be recessed beyond the #street line#, provided any such recesses deeper than 10 feet along a #wide street#, or 15 feet along a #narrow street#, are located within an #outer court#. Furthermore, no recesses shall be permitted within 30 feet of the intersection of two #street lines# except that, to allow articulation of #street walls# at the intersection of two #street lines#, the #street wall# may be located anywhere within an area bounded by the two #street lines# and a line connecting such #street lines# at points 15 feet from their intersection.

For #developments# that occupy the entire #block# frontage of a #street# and provide a continuous sidewalk widening along such #street line#, the boundary of the sidewalk widening shall be considered to be the #street line# for the purposes of this Section.

The #street wall# location provisions of this Section shall not apply along that portion of any #street# frontage:

- (i) over which the #High Line# passes;
- (ii) occupied by existing #buildings# to remain, unless such #buildings# are vertically #enlarged#; or
- (iii) between the #High Line# and a #side lot line#, where such frontage measures less than 20 feet.

(2) Maximum #building# heights

(i) For C6-2A and C6-3A Districts

In C6-2A and C6-3A Districts, the maximum base height, maximum #building# height and the maximum number of #stories# shall be as set forth in Section 23-662 (Maximum height of buildings and setback regulations) for the residential equivalent of an R8A and R9A District, respectively. For #buildings# meeting the criteria set forth in paragraph (a) of Section 23-664 (Modified height and setback regulations for certain Inclusionary Housing buildings or affordable independent residences for seniors), such maximum heights and number of #stories# may be modified in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (b) of Section 23-664 for such districts' applicable residential equivalent. Separate maximum #building# heights are

set forth within such Sections for #Quality Housing buildings# with #qualifying ground floors# and for those with #non-qualifying ground floors#.

(ii) For all other districts

All portions of #buildings or other structures# that exceed the applicable maximum base height specified in the table in this Section shall provide a setback at a height not lower than the applicable minimum base height. A setback with a depth of at least 10 feet shall be provided from any #street wall# fronting on a #wide street#, and a setback with a depth of at least 15 feet shall be provided from any #street wall# fronting on a #narrow street#, except such dimensions may include the depth of permitted recesses in the #street wall#.

No #building or other structure# shall exceed the maximum #building# height specified in the table in this Section.

* * *

(c) Subareas C, F and G

In Subareas C, F and G, for #zoning lots# with #wide# and #narrow street# frontage, no #street wall# is required beyond 50 feet of a #wide street#. Furthermore, for any #development# or #enlargement# that occupies at least one corner of the Tenth Avenue #block# front and extends along the Tenth Avenue frontage of the #zoning lot# for at least 170 feet, exclusive of existing #buildings# to remain, a lowered #street wall# shall be provided for any #building# that exceeds 45 feet in height. Such lowered #street wall# shall have a maximum height of 45 feet and a minimum height of 35 feet and extend along the Tenth Avenue frontage for a width not less than 25 percent and not more than 30 percent of the #aggregate width of street walls# facing Tenth Avenue. Such lowered #street wall# portion of the Tenth Avenue frontage shall be located at the intersection of Tenth Avenue and a #narrow street#. Such lowered #street wall# shall extend along such #narrow# #street line# for a distance of at least 50 feet from Tenth Avenue. Beyond 50 feet of Tenth Avenue, excluding the #High Line frontage# of a #building#, such portion of the #building# shall not exceed a height of 45 feet.

The provisions of this Section, relating to the location and height of the lowered #street wall# portion of the Tenth Avenue frontage of a #building# are illustrated in Diagram 1 (Street Wall and High Line Frontage Regulations in Subareas C, F and G) in Appendix C of this Chapter.

In Subarea C, for #zoning lots# with Tenth Avenue frontage between West 24th Street and West 28th Street, the maximum #building# height shall be 125 feet.

In Subarea C, for any #enlargement# on a #zoning lot# that is subject to the provisions of Section 98-242 (Located partially within Subarea C and partially within M1-5 Districts) and located in a Historic District designated by the Landmarks Preservation Commission, the minimum base height shall be the height of the existing #street wall# of the #building# to be #enlarged# and no #street wall# shall be required above such minimum base height.

What authorizes DOT to make this rule? Sections 1043 and 2903(a) of the New York City Charter (City Charter) authorize DOT to make this proposed rule. This proposed rule was included in DOT’s regulatory agenda.

Where can I find DOT’s rules? DOT’s rules are in Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? DOT must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The Commissioner of the New York City Department of Transportation (DOT) is authorized to issue rules regarding parking and traffic operations in the City pursuant to Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter. The rules that DOT is seeking to amend are contained within Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York, relating to its “Traffic Rules.”

The growth of e-commerce deliveries and for-hire vehicle trips throughout the city has changed the way New Yorkers use curbs. Nearly 90% of goods in New York City are delivered by trucks and, with the growth of e-commerce and demand for frequent home deliveries, the amount of goods that move through NYC is estimated to grow by 68% in the next 20 years. As demand for the City’s limited curb space continues to grow, trucks, delivery vehicles, cargo bikes, and personal vehicles need safe ways to access the curbs without blocking traffic, including bus routes and bike lanes. These proposed rules would provide dedicated curb space for loading and unloading activities during daytime and evening hours, which would help to reduce double parking as well as other unwanted standing behaviors, creating a safer and more efficient environment for all road users. For example, Neighborhood Loading Zones (NLZ), a program that provides curb space for commercial deliveries, active loading and unloading, and pick-up and drop-off activity, reduces double parking by up to 70% while creating a safer and more efficient environment.

The proposed rule would update Section 4-08 of the Traffic Rules for the purpose of establishing “Loading Only” dedicated use signage. The signage would make clear to the public that the purpose of a “Loading Only” zone is for the expeditious pick-up and drop-off of goods and passengers from commercial vehicles, for-hire vehicles, and personal vehicles. The signage would also include a set time limit for the vehicle to utilize the space. Vehicles displaying agency-authorized or single use permits would also be prohibited from utilizing the dedicated space.

Specifically, the proposed amendments are as follows:

- Section 4-08(a)(3)(i) would be amended to include “Loading Only” as a dedicated use sign.
- Section 4-08(c) would be amended to define “Loading Only” zones with a detailed description of the intended use of the regulation.
- Section 4-08(o)(3)(ii) would be amended to include “Loading Only” as a prohibited area for agency-authorized parking.
- Section 4-08(o)(4)(iii) would be amended to include “Loading Only” as a prohibited area for single-use permits.

New material is underlined.

[Deleted material is in brackets.]

Section 1. Subparagraph (i) of Paragraph (3) of Subdivision (a) of Section 4-08 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(i) Dedicated use signs. Standing is prohibited when a dedicated use is specified by a sign, including but not limited to the following curb regulations: Commercial Vehicles Only, Truck Loading Only, Taxi Stand, Taxi Relief Stand, Authorized Vehicles Only, NYP License Plates Only, Doctor License Plates Only, For-Hire Vehicles Only, Ambulance Only, Ambulette Only, Medical Facility Only, Bus Layover Only, NYS Road Test Only, Flea Market Loading Only, Farmers Market Only, Waiting Line, Carshare Parking Only, Electric Vehicle Charging Only, Loading Only, or Parking Permitted.

§ 2. Subdivision (c) of Section 4-08 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new paragraph (10) to read as follows:

(10) Loading only zone. During the time specified on the posted authorized sign, no person shall stand or park a vehicle in such zone, except for the purpose of expeditiously receiving or discharging passengers or actively engaging in loading or unloading goods for the purpose of making pickups or deliveries to or from the curb.

§ 3. Subparagraph (ii) of Paragraph (3) of Subdivision (o) of Section 4-08 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(ii) *Parking not permitted.* Parking with and display of agency-authorized permits in the windshield of a vehicle or, where applicable, a permit affixed to the vehicle by the department or any agency authorized by the department is not permitted at:

- (A) "No Standing" areas.
- (B) "No Stopping" areas.
- (C) Fire hydrants.
- (D) Bus stops.
- (E) Areas on the roadway side of a vehicle stopped, standing, or parked at the curb (i.e., Double parking).
- (F) Driveways.
- (G) Bridges and highways.
- (H) Areas where a traffic hazard would be created.
