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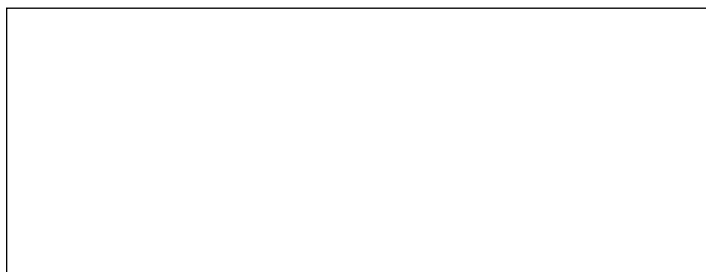

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a Special Real Property Public Hearing will be held, on March 29, 2023, at 10:00 A.M. The Public Hearing will be held, at the Woodstock Library, 761 East 160th Street, at which time and place those wishing to be heard will be given an opportunity to be heard concerning the proposed deed amendment described below.

Pursuant to Section 1802(6)(j) of the Charter, the Department of Housing Preservation and Development ("HPD") has proposed amendments, to the terms and conditions of the sale of certain real property previously conveyed by the City of New York ("City"), located in the Borough of Bronx and known as:

on the Tax Map of the City ("Premises") and, now known as the Betances V project in HPD's Senior Affordable Rental Apartments Program.

The City of New York (the "City") conveyed the Premises to do south Bronx Housing Development Fund Company, Inc. ("South Bronx HDFC") by Indenture dated March 22, 1971 (the "1971 Indenture"), subject, to the terms, covenants and conditions of an agreement between the City and South Bronx HDFC dated November 13, 1970 (the "Disposition Agreement"). South Bronx HDFC conveyed a remainder estate in the Premises, to the City by Indenture dated July 8, 1975 (the "1975 Indenture"). Subsequently, the City took title, to the Premises, pursuant to an in rem tax foreclosure deed dated August 8, 1978. By deed dated June 27, 2019, the City conveyed the Premises, to the New York City Housing Authority ("NYCHA"), and NYCHA immediately leased the Premises and the adjacent property then-known as Block 2287, Lot 26 ("Lot 26") and together with the Premises, the "Project Lots") to BG Betances Housing Development Fund Corporation ("Developer") and BG Betances L.P. ("Betances LP") and together with the Developer, the "Sponsor"), pursuant to that certain Ground Lease Agreement dated as of June 27, 2019 for a period of ninety-nine (99) years. Sponsor is developing one 152-unit affordable, supportive, senior housing building on the Project Lots (the "Project").

This submission is to request approval to:

1. Modify the 1971 Indenture to remove the restriction that subjects the Premises to "[a]ll the terms, covenants and conditions of" the Disposition Agreement, as it was not

recorded and after diligent search, cannot be found in the City's records and thus the City cannot verify compliance therewith; and

2. Modify the 1975 Indenture to remove the restriction that the Premises are to be kept "free and clear of any and all liens or encumbrances" other than the mortgage made by the South Bronx HDFC to Bankers Trust Company securing a loan made March 23, 1971 in the sum of \$2,767,900 and any covenants, easements and restrictions as of the date thereof so that current and future financing can be maintained or made for the Premises, including an HPD mortgage, and so a certain Regulatory Agreement among Sponsor, the New York City Housing Development Corporation, and HPD and any future regulatory agreements can be recorded against the Premises.

A public file containing copies of the calendar document and other public documents will be made available to Bronx Community Board 1 for public review, at the office of Community Board 1 no later than twenty (20) days prior, to the public hearing.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public scoping meeting for the Willets Point Phase 2 Development project (the Proposed Project) will be held on **Tuesday, April 4, 2023 at 4:00 P.M.** In support of the City's efforts to contain the spread of Covid-19, the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Economic and Workforce Development (DMEWD), will hold the public scoping meeting remotely (Register here: <https://willetspointphase2.com/eis>). The purpose of the scoping meeting is to provide the public with the opportunity to comment on the Draft Scope of Work proposed to be used for to develop an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Willets Point Phase 2 Development.

Written comments on the Draft Scope of Work will be accepted by the lead agency until 5:00 P.M., on Monday, April 17, 2023, at the contact address below. If you need a reasonable accommodation such as a sign language interpreter or foreign language assistance in order to participate in the meeting, please call or email the contact person below. Requests must be submitted at least ten business days before the meeting.

Directing that an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) be prepared, DMEWD issued an Environmental Assessment Statement (EAS), Positive Declaration, and Draft Scope of Work on March 1, 2023, and these documents are available for review from the contact person listed below and on the website of the Mayor's Office of Environmental Coordination at, <https://a002-ceqraccess.nyc.gov/ceqr/>. (search under CEQR Number 23DME005Q)

The Co-applicants, the Queens Development Group (QDC), the New York City Football Club (NYCFC), and the New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC), on behalf of the City of New York, are seeking land use actions to facilitate the next phase of development (Phase 2 Development) within the Special Willets Point District (SWPD, or the District) in Queens Community District 7. The proposed Phase 2 Development is the development of approximately 1,190,000 gsf of residential development (approximately 1,400 units, 100% affordable); a 250-room, 145,000-gsf hotel; approximately 60,000 gsf of local retail use; a 500,000-gsf, 25,000 seat soccer-specific stadium for NYCFC; and 470 accessory parking spaces. The Phase 2 Development would also include approximately 1.5 acres of publicly-accessible open space.

The project site for the Phase 2 Development (the "Phase 2 Site") is an approximately 17-acre portion of the SWPD, roughly bounded by 126th Street (also known as Seaver Way) on the west, Northern Boulevard and 34th Avenue on the north, 127th Street on the east, and Willets Point Boulevard and Roosevelt Avenue on the South. The District also includes sites for the Phase 1 Development, which has already been approved and is anticipated to commence construction this year, and a potential future Phase 3 Development, for which no specific development plan has been determined and no developer has been designated. Together, the Phase 1, Phase 2, and Phase 3 sites compose the Project Site, which is coterminous with the District.

The redevelopment of the District was previously considered in the 2008 *Willets Point Development Plan Final Generic EIS*, the 2013 *Willets Point Development Plan Final Supplemental EIS*, and subsequent technical memoranda.

To facilitate the Proposed Project, approvals are required pursuant to the City's Uniform Land Use Review Procedure (ULURP), including discretionary actions that are subject to New York City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR). The proposed actions are currently anticipated to consist of:

- Certain Special permits required for the Proposed Project include for the proposed stadium use (ZR 74-41), proposed hotel use (ZR 74-902), and SWPD use, bulk and parking regulations (ZR 124-60);

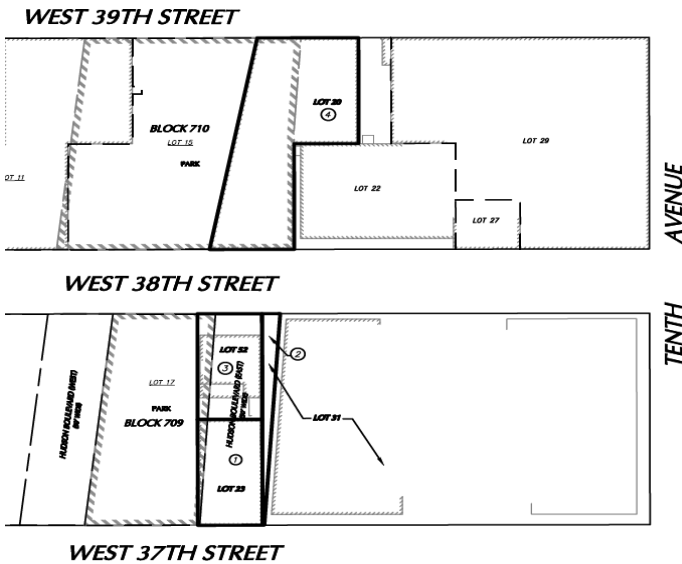

Notice of Adoption to amend rules regarding the authority the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection’s (“DCWP” or “Department”) delegates to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings and the timing of DCWP’s issuance of written decisions.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN the Commissioner of the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection by Sections 1043 and 2203(f) of the New York City Charter and Section 20-104(b) of the New York City Administrative Code, and in accordance with the requirements of Section 1043 of the New York City Charter, that the Department amends Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York.

This rule was proposed and published on November 22, 2022. A public hearing was held on December 22, 2022 and two comments regarding the rule were received.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rule

The Department of Consumer and Worker Protection (“DCWP” or “Department”) amends its rules about the authority it delegates to the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (“OATH”).

Recently enacted local laws regulate relationships in the workplace, confer rights or benefits on workers and establish licensing requirements. These laws are codified in chapter 2 of title 20 of the Administrative Code. Some examples include local law 150 of 2021, which regulates and requires construction labor providers to be licensed, and local law 100 of 2021, which regulates and requires third-party food delivery services to be licensed. The Department is amending its rules to allow violations of these licensing provisions to be filed in the Hearings Division at OATH even though they relate to labor law issues, because the Hearings Division provides for more streamlined and efficient adjudications, and the adjudication of these licensing violations typically does not warrant the lengthier fact-finding process conducted by the Trials Division.

OATH extended the deadline for parties to reopen a default decision after a failure to appear at OATH from 60 days to 75 days. See 48 RCNY 6-21. The Department amends its rules to ensure the Department does not issue a written decision sooner than 75 days from issuance of an OATH recommended decision to ensure a written decision is not issued prior to the deadline for a party to reopen a proceeding at OATH.

Sections 1043, 2203(f), and 2203(h)(1) of the New York City Charter, and Sections 20-104(b), of the New York City Administrative Code authorize the Department to make these rules.

Rule Amendments

Section 1. Paragraph (1) of subdivision (c) of section 6-01 of subchapter A of chapter 6 of title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(1) all proceedings commenced to enforce a law within the Department’s jurisdiction that regulates relationships in the workplace or that confers rights or benefits on workers, including, but not limited to, the Earned Safe and Sick Time Act set forth in chapter 8 of title 20 of the Administrative Code, provisions related to Fair Work Practices set forth in chapter 12 of title 20 of the Administrative Code, provisions related to mass transit benefits set forth in chapter 9 of title 20 of the Administrative Code, provisions related to displaced grocery workers set forth in section 22-507 of the Administrative Code, provisions related to a prevailing wage for building service employees in city leased or financially assisted facilities set forth in section 6-130 of the Administrative Code, or provisions related to a living wage for employees in city financially assisted workplaces set forth in section 6-134 of the Administrative Code, except where such law licenses persons under chapter 2 of title 20 of the Administrative Code;

§ 2. Subdivision (e) of section 6-02 of subchapter A of chapter 6 of title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(e) Not less than [sixty (60)] seventy-five (75) days after the issuance of the recommended decision, the Commissioner or the Commissioner’s authorized designee will issue a written decision affirming, reversing or modifying the recommended decision, or remanding the matter back to OATH for further proceedings. Except as provided in subdivision f of this section, or with respect to written decisions that send back any part of a matter to OATH for additional proceedings, the Commissioner’s decision adopting, reversing, or modifying the recommended decision shall constitute a final agency determination. The written decision from the Commissioner or the Commissioner’s authorized designee will be based on a review of the recommended decision and may consider the trial record from OATH, written arguments submitted to the Department pursuant to subdivision d of this section, any motion papers or other written submissions filed at OATH, and any other OATH decisions bearing on the merits of the case.

Notice of Adoption

Notice of Adoption to amend rules applicable to the Home Improvement Business Trust Fund (“Trust Fund”) to provide for the payment of outstanding awards owed to consumers by licensed home improvement businesses.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN the Commissioner of the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection by Sections 1043 and 2203(f) of the New York City Charter and Section 20-104(b) of the New York City Administrative Code, and in accordance with the requirements of Section 1043 of the New York City Charter, that the Department amends Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York.

This rule was proposed and published on December 9, 2022. A public hearing was held on January 9, 2023 and one comment was received.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rule

The Department of Consumer and Worker Protection (“DCWP” or “Department”) is amending rules applicable to the Home Improvement Business Trust Fund (“Trust Fund”), which was established by 6 RCNY § 2-224 to provide for the payment of outstanding awards owed to consumers and fines owed to DCWP by licensed home improvement businesses.

The rule amends 6 RCNY § 2-224(b) to indicate that if the Trust Fund has been invaded to pay an outstanding award, the contractor’s license may be suspended or revoked, and the contractor will not be able to renew or reinstate their license until they have reimbursed the Trust Fund. The amendment also grants the Commissioner the discretion to bar such contractors from future participation in the Trust Fund where their license has been suspended.

The rule amends 6 RCNY § 2-224(c) to allow disbursements from the Trust Fund to a consumer to satisfy an arbitration award against a contractor, as well as for the amount a contractor has agreed to pay pursuant to a settlement agreement. The rule also removes the requirement that the contractor’s license be revoked prior to disbursement from the Fund.

The Department received one comment in response to the proposed rule that resulted in a change to these final rules to clarify that the Department does not conduct administrative hearings.

Sections 1043, 2203(f) and 2203(h)(1) of the New York City Charter and section 20-104 of the New York City Administrative Code authorize the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection to make these rules.

Section 1. Section 224 of Chapter 2 of Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended as follows:

§ 2-224 Home Improvement Business Trust Fund.

(a) Establishment.

A Home Improvement Business Trust Fund (hereinafter, “the Fund”) is hereby established to provide for the payment of outstanding awards to aggrieved consumers and fines owed to the Department. The Fund shall be administered by the Comptroller of the City of New York pursuant to Section 93(h) of the Charter.

(b) Participation in the Fund.

(1) Home improvement licensees may elect to participate in the Fund in lieu of furnishing a bond as required by the Home Improvement Business Law Bond Requirement which was imposed by the Commissioner on February 1, 1983, pursuant to § 20-115 of the New York City Administrative Code. The Commissioner hereby waives said bond requirement, which appears as 6 RCNY § 2-225, for any licensee who elects to participate in the Fund pursuant to the provisions of this section.

(2) Any home improvement license applicant who elects to participate in the Fund must submit to the Department a check in the amount of two hundred dollars, made payable to the New York City Department of Consumer [Affairs] and Worker Protection, before a license will be issued. Any bonded licensee may elect to participate in the Fund in lieu of continued compliance with the Bond Requirement of 6 RCNY § 2-225 by causing the Department to receive a check in the amount of two hundred dollars, made payable to the New York City Department of Consumer [Affairs] and Worker Protection, prior to the expiration or cancellation date of the licensee’s bond. All fund participants who elect to continue to participate in the Fund shall contribute two hundred dollars upon each renewal of their license. Any fund participant who elects not to continue to participate in the Fund at the time of renewal shall furnish a bond in accordance with paragraph [(4)] four of this subdivision and 6 RCNY § 2-225 before the renewal license will be issued. Failure to comply with this paragraph shall constitute a failure to comply with a lawful demand or requirement lawfully made by the Commissioner for purposes of § 20-392 of the Administrative Code.

(3) The Commissioner may, from time to time, amend this section to require such additional contributions by participants in the Fund as the Commissioner determines to be necessary to maintain an amount in the Fund which is adequate to fulfill its purposes and to counteract depletion of the Fund resulting from payments made out of the Fund pursuant to 6 RCNY § 2-224(c).

(4) Fund participants may discontinue their participation in the Fund at any time by filing a bond pursuant to the Home Improvement Business Law Bond Requirement. No participant will be entitled to a refund of any monies contributed to the Fund unless the Fund is dissolved by the Commissioner. All such refunds will be disbursed in accordance with regulations promulgated by the Commissioner and in effect at the time of such dissolution.

(5) Participation in the Fund does not relieve a licensee of any obligation to pay awards, [or] fines, [imposed by the Department or] judgments, or arbitration awards rendered against a licensee [by a court of competent jurisdiction], or agreed upon settlement amounts. [In the event that a contractor’s license is suspended, revoked, surrendered or the contractor fails to renew its license, and] If the Fund is invaded to pay an award, fine, [or] judgment [that was], or arbitration award rendered against such contractor, or a settlement amount pursuant to the provisions herein, no license shall be issued or reinstated to such contractor or to any home improvement business in which such contractor is an officer, shareholder, partner or principal, unless the amount(s) paid out of the Fund on behalf of such contractor is reimbursed by such contractor in full. If the Fund is invaded pursuant to the provisions herein to pay an award, fine, judgment, or arbitration award rendered against a contractor, or a settlement amount, the Department may suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew such contractor’s license unless the amount(s) paid out of the Fund on behalf of such contractor is reimbursed by such contractor in full.

(6) In the event that a home improvement contractor’s license is suspended, revoked, surrendered or the contractor fails to renew its license and the Fund invaded to pay an award, fine, [or]

judgment [that was], or arbitration award rendered against such contractor, or a settlement amount pursuant to the provisions herein, the Commissioner or his or her designee shall have discretion to exclude such contractor, or any home improvement business in which such contractor is a principal, from future participation in the Fund. The Commissioner or his or her designee may, in his or her discretion, require such home improvement contractor to comply with the Home Improvement Business Law Bond Requirement.

[(7) All participants who have elected to participate in the Fund prior to August 1, 1991 shall contribute an additional one hundred fifty dollars to the Fund before September 1, 1991. The Commissioner, in his or her discretion, may require any Fund participant who fails to comply with this paragraph to furnish a bond in accordance with Regulation 11. Failure to comply with this paragraph shall constitute a failure to comply with a lawful demand or requirement lawfully made by the Commissioner for purposes of § 20-392 of the Administrative Code.]

(c) Invasion of the Fund.

(1) The Commissioner may require that disbursements be made from the Fund to pay outstanding [awards] amounts to consumers and Departmental fines when:

(i) the Department has [conducted] (a) issued or received an administrative hearing decision that [results in] found that a home improvement contractor [is in violation of] violated a law, ordinance or regulation enforced by the Department; (b) settled a summons or petition that charged a home improvement contractor with the violation of a law, ordinance, or regulation enforced by the Department; (c) resolved a consumer complaint filed against a home improvement contractor with a settlement agreement; or (d) received written notice of a judgment, arbitration award, or settlement agreement against a home improvement contractor that relates to activities for which a license is required; and

(ii) [the contractor is ordered by] the Department [to] has demanded that the home improvement contractor pay an [award] amount in restitution to a consumer [, a Departmental fine or to satisfy a judgment or arbitration award] as set forth in the decision, settlement, judgment, or arbitration award required by subparagraph (i) of this paragraph; and

(iii) the contractor has failed to pay such [award] amount in restitution to a consumer, a Departmental award or fine or satisfy a judgment or arbitration award, within 30 days of the date of the Department’s [order] demand for payment or as required by the terms of the settlement agreement; and

(iv) [the Department has revoked the contractor’s license or the contractor has surrendered or failed to renew said license after the Department’s order.

(v) [Notwithstanding the above, if a contractor has filed a petition for relief under any chapter of Title 11 of the United States Code, the Department may waive the requirements set forth in subparagraphs [(b), (c) and (d)] (ii) or (iii) of this paragraph and (1) [and] require disbursements to be made from the Fund.

(2) Disbursements will not be made from the Fund to pay an award, fine, [or] judgment, arbitration award, or settlement amount that is rendered against: a licensee who has furnished a bond, pursuant to the Bond Requirement of 6 RCNY § 2-225; or home improvement contractor who was never licensed by the Department or a participant in the Fund.

(3) Disbursements from the Fund will be made at the discretion of the Commissioner or his or her designee and shall be limited to no more than twenty-five thousand dollars for all awards, fines, [and] judgments, arbitration awards, or settlement amounts, arising out of a single home improvement contract.

(4) The Commissioner or his or her designee may order that partial payment of awards, fines, [or] judgments, arbitration awards, or settlement amounts be made from the Fund.

(5) Nothing contained herein shall be construed to limit the rights and remedies of any party, including the Department, to pursue a cause of action against a home improvement contractor who is a participant in the Fund.

(6) Nothing contained herein shall be construed to create a right of any person to a portion of any of the Fund, except in the case of an award duly made by the Commissioner pursuant to the provisions herein.

(7) Nothing contained herein shall be construed to provide for the payment of awards or judgments rendered against Fund participants in personal injury actions.

(d) Accounting. The Commissioner shall, by January 31 of each year, cause an accounting to be made of all of the Fund’s activities during the preceding calendar year.

MAYOR'S OFFICE OF RISK MANAGEMENT AND COMPLIANCE
AND MAYOR'S OFFICE OF MUNICIPAL SERVICES ASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, Section 8(a) of the City Charter confers responsibility upon the Mayor for the "effectiveness and integrity of city government operations" and provides for the Mayor to "establish and maintain such policies and procedures as are necessary and appropriate to accomplish this responsibility..."; and

WHEREAS, Section 8(f) of the Charter authorizes the Mayor, "by executive order, at any time, [to] create or abolish bureaus, divisions or positions within the executive office of the mayor as he or she may deem necessary to fulfill mayoral duties"; and

WHEREAS, this Administration is dedicated to improving efficiency and accountability in government operations and to maintaining an effective internal control environment, including policies, procedures, and actions to enable the assessment and management of the internal and external risks associated with achieving the Administration's objectives; and

WHEREAS, ongoing activity monitoring in the course of normal operations, including independent monitoring conducted by internal and external audit and oversight bodies, is an integral component of an effective internal control environment; and

WHEREAS, an effective internal control environment includes policies, procedures, and specific actions to ensure that the findings and recommendations of audits and other internal and external reviews are promptly addressed and resolved;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. There shall be a Mayor's Office of Risk Management and Compliance, which shall be headed by a Director, appointed by the Mayor. The Director of the Mayor's Office of Risk Management and Compliance shall report to the Chief Counsel to the Mayor and City Hall. The Director shall be responsible for:

- a. Developing and recommending strategies, policies, procedures, and techniques to assess and manage financial, operational, and reputational risks proactively in City agencies and offices;
- b. Assessing risk and recommending measures to address risks identified in specific agency and City programs, activities, and issues, working with the relevant City officials and agencies to implement approved recommendations;
- c. Assisting agencies in developing effective internal control environments, including by recommending policies, procedures, and actions to assess and manage risks that bear the potential for significant monetary loss or risk to achieving agency objectives;
- d. Establishing standards for the conduct of internal audits by City agencies and the communication of findings to other

agencies, including the Department of Investigation, as needed;

- e. Serving as or designating a liaison between City agencies and external audit entities conducting performance audits of those agencies or one or more of their programs or activities, including but not limited to all such audits, special reports, and other engagements performed by the Office of the New York City Comptroller or the Office of the New York State Comptroller;
- f. Tracking agency implementation of audit recommendations;
- g. Providing guidance to and coordinating with the Mayor's Office of Municipal Services assessment; and
- h. Performing such other duties as may be directed by the Mayor.

§ 2. There shall be a Mayor's Office of Municipal Services Assessment, which shall be headed by a Director, appointed by the Mayor. The Director of the Mayor's Office of Municipal Services Assessment shall report to the Deputy Mayor for Public Safety or to a designee of the Deputy Mayor for Public Safety. In consultation with the Director of the Mayor's Office of Risk Management and Compliance, the Director of the Mayor's Office of Municipal Services Assessment shall be responsible for:

- a. Assisting City agencies to monitor and assess the delivery of services to the public and other key stakeholders to ensure that services are delivered in a professional, equitable, efficient, and effective manner;
- b. Identifying deficiencies in the delivery of services through observations, analysis, audits, and other means;
- c. Working with City agencies to improve their responses to community complaints;
- d. Recommending corrective actions to improve City agencies' performance and the delivery of services;
- e. Monitoring and reporting on implementation and effectiveness of corrective actions taken to improve agency performance and the delivery of services; and
- f. Performing such other duties as may be directed by the Mayor.

§ 3. Each City agency shall work with and provide full cooperation and assistance to the Mayor's Office of Risk Management and Compliance and the Mayor's Office of Municipal Assessment, including providing necessary data and other information upon request.

§ 4. Each City agency shall designate a liaison who shall coordinate with the Director of the Mayor's Office of Risk Management and Compliance and the Mayor's Office of Municipal Assessment to carry out the provisions of this Order.

§ 5. Executive Order No. 48, dated February 22, 2000, subdivisions a, b, c, and g are hereby revoked. Subdivisions d, e, and f remain in full force and effect.

February 16, 2023

PROCUREMENTS FROM MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2022, New York State enacted legislation (Chapter 569 of 2022) that increased to \$1,000,000 the dollar threshold for making noncompetitive small purchases of goods, services and construction from City-certified Minority and Women-

Owned Businesses ("M/WBEs") to address the continuing effects of discrimination against M/WBEs in the market where the City conducts its procurements; and

WHEREAS, the City has established and implemented procedures to secure meaningful M/WBE participation and is committed to making New York City a more equitable and inclusive business environment for all vendors, including M/WBEs, to operate; and

WHEREAS, studies by the National Bureau of Economic Research and other institutions suggest that the economic and health effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have had a persistent and disproportionately negative impact on M/WBEs; and

WHEREAS, these studies also suggest that the negative impact is greater with respect to some ethnic and gender categories of M/WBEs than with respect to others; and

WHEREAS, a review of data regarding contract awards to City-certified M/WBEs through the M/WBE Noncompetitive Small Purchase method authorized by section 311(i) of the New York City Charter continues to show an inequity in the distribution of contract awards across the various ethnic and gender categories of M/WBEs; and

WHEREAS, the City continues to establish and implement initiatives to increase equity by providing the most underutilized ethnic and gender categories of M/WBEs with more City contracting opportunities using the M/WBE Noncompetitive Small Purchase method;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. In order to achieve the goals of the City's M/WBE program, all mayoral agencies, as such term is defined in section 3301 in the New York City Charter, shall, whenever practicable, use their power under section 311(i) of the New York City Charter to procure goods, services and construction for amounts not exceeding \$1,000,000 from businesses certified as M/WBEs pursuant to section 1304 of the New York City Charter without a formal competitive process.

§ 2. All mayoral agencies shall, whenever practicable, use their discretion under section 311(i) of the New York City Charter to limit the pool of solicited vendors for goods, services and construction for amounts not exceeding \$500,000 to Black American M/WBEs, Hispanic American M/WBEs, Native American M/WBEs and Asian American WBEs. The Mayor's Office of Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises ("OM/WBE") shall issue guidance on the process of prioritizing, where practicable, these most underutilized categories of M/WBEs for such solicitations.

§ 3. There shall be a Chief Business Diversity Officer who, in consultation with the Mayor's Office of Contract Services ("MOCS") and the New York City Department of Small Business Services, shall periodically review agency procurement data provided by MOCS and relevant research (a) to determine any changes in the ethnic or gender categories of M/WBEs be prioritized in accordance with the process described in section 2; (b) to identify meaningful progress towards addressing overall disparities in procurement across the City; and (c) to make any necessary adjustments to City policies based on such review.

§ 4. Nothing in this Order is intended to create a private cause of action.

§ 5. Executive Order No. 59, dated July 28, 2020, is hereby REVOKED.

§ 6. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.

The Chief Public Realm Officer shall: (a) serve as a central point of contact for external partners that work with the City to improve public spaces; (b) lead inter-agency coordination and collaboration to advance policies and projects that improve public spaces throughout New York City; and (c) drive reform and innovation in the City's public realm strategy to improve the user experience and pilot new ways to create beautiful, vibrant public spaces.

§ 3. Cooperation. All mayoral agencies shall cooperate with the Chief Public Realm Officer in the performance of the duties described in Section 2. Upon request of the Chief Public Realm Officer, mayoral agencies shall designate a liaison to work with the Chief Public Realm Officer. The Chief Public Realm Officer shall convene and coordinate agency liaisons as necessary to accomplish their duties.

§ 4. This Order shall take effect immediately.
