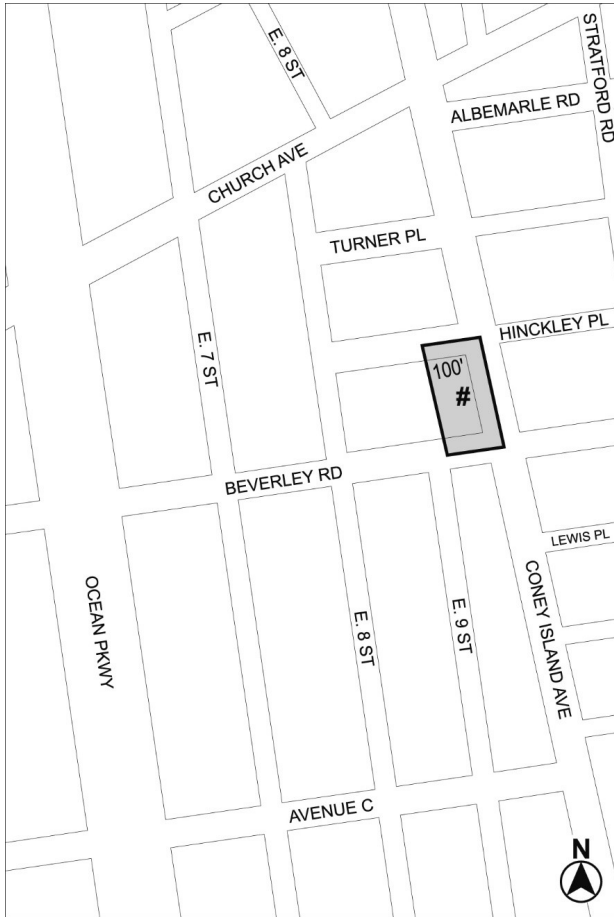

The Commissioner of the New York City Department of Transportation (DOT) is authorized to issue rules regarding parking and traffic operations in the City pursuant to Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter. The rules that DOT is seeking to amend are contained within Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York, relating to the "Traffic Rules".

In December 2019, DOT launched the Commercial Cargo Bike Pilot program. Parcel industry representatives and other local carriers participated in testing cargo bicycles with pedal-assist in the New York city market. Between May 2020 and January 2021, the number of cargo bicycle deliveries increased 109%. In January 2021 alone, there were more than 45,000 cargo bicycle deliveries proving to be an effective mode for last mile delivery.

Parcel industry representatives and other local carriers have tested cargo bicycles with pedal-assist for use in the New York city market. With a 68% projected increase in freight in the city, deliveries in the

last mile are the most costly part of the supply chain. The freight industry sees cargo bicycles with pedal-assist as an opportunity to test consolidation and smaller-scale deliveries in constrained urban spaces, with the concomitant benefits of avoiding tickets and reducing negative impacts on traffic and street safety. The pedal-assist features make cargo bicycles with pedal-assist easy to pedal even while carrying heavy loads. It is estimated that two bicycles can replace one delivery truck with CO₂ savings of approximately 14 tons/year, equivalent to 200 planted trees, or 30,872 passenger car miles traveled.

This proposed rule would broaden options for sustainable and efficient modes of parcel and goods delivery, and encourage the use of low- or no-emission vehicles for last-mile freight delivery as recently highlighted in New York City's (NYC) Delivering Green, DOT's Delivering New York and NYC Streets Plan by authorizing the last mile delivery of parcels and goods in the city by a type of pedal-assist bicycle, a "Pedal-Assist Commercial Bicycle" that may be up to 48 inches in width and have up to 4 wheels.

This rule is authorized by section 1642 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law (VTL) which authorizes DOT to adopt rules with respect to the regulation of devices moved by human power that may supersede provisions of the VTL on the same subject matter. Such authorization includes regulation of a type of electric bicycle, referred to as "pedal-assist" because they cannot operate without human power. In addition, the operation of a Pedal-Assist Commercial Bicycle as defined in these rules would not be prohibited by section 19-176.2 of the New York City Administrative Code.

This rule amends the current definition of pedal-assist bicycle to specify that it applies to a type of pedal-assist bicycle that may be up to 48 inches and have up to 4 wheels and that the operation of such a device in the city is lawful for delivery of goods and property in commerce. In addition, rules applicable to all bicycles would apply to pedal-assist commercial bicycles, with the addition of rules specifically for pedal-assist commercial bicycles. The proposed amendments to the Traffic Rules would be as follows:

- § 1: amends the definitions of "bicycle," and "pedal-assist bicycle" and adds a definition of "commercial bicycle" in Section 4-01 ("Words & Phrases Defined").
- § 2: amends section 4-08(a)(3)(i) to include a "Commercial Bicycle Loading Only" sign as a dedicated use sign.
- § 3: amends section 4-08(o)(3)(ii) to include Commercial Bicycle Loading Only as a prohibited area for agency-authorized parking.
- § 4: amends section 4-08(o)(4)(iii) to include Commercial Bicycle Loading Only as a prohibited area for single-use permits.
- § 5: amends 4-12(j) (1) to prohibit advertising on bicycles.
- § 6: amends section 4-12 (p)(5) to include additional pedal-assist commercial bicycle regulations.
- § 7: amends section 4-12(p) by adding a new paragraph (8) to include commercial bicycle regulations.

"Shall" and "must" denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this department, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

New material underlined.

[Deleted material is in brackets]

Section 1. Subdivision (b) of Section 4-01 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by amending two definitions and adding one definition to read as follows:

Bicycle. "Bicycle" means every two- or three-wheeled device upon which a person or persons may ride, propelled by human power through a belt, a chain or gears, with such wheels in a tandem or tricycle, except that it will not include such a device having solid tires and intended for use only on a sidewalk by pre-teenage children. For the purposes of these rules the term bicycle includes [a] pedal-assist [bicycle] commercial bicycles as defined in this section; and bicycles with electric assist as defined in section 102-c of the vehicle and traffic law.

Commercial bicycle. A bicycle used to transport property in commerce.

Pedal-assist commercial bicycle. A "pedal-assist commercial bicycle" shall mean a [bicycle] device upon which a person may ride equipped with a belt, a chain or gears, fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than seven hundred fifty watts (one horsepower) whereby such motor engages only when the operator is pedaling and the rate of speed of such bicycle is less than 20 miles per hour, and disengages or ceases to function when (i) the operator applies the brakes, (ii) the operator stops pedaling, or (iii) such bicycle achieves a speed of twenty miles per hour and which is (A) more than 36 inches

but no more than 48 inches wide and equipped with 2, 3, or 4 wheels or (B) no more than 36 inches wide and equipped with 4 wheels. A pedal-assist commercial bicycle shall not be equipped with any throttle capacity or have any additional motorized equipment affixed to it. A pedal-assist commercial bicycle shall not be more than seventy-eight (78) inches in height or more than one hundred twenty (120) inches in length, including any attached trailer. A pedal-assist commercial bicycle shall only be used to transport property in commerce. For the purposes of this definition, the term "trailer" means a device not propelled by its own power and towed by a pedal-assist commercial bicycle.

§ 2. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of Section 4-08 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(i) **Dedicated use signs.** Standing is prohibited when a dedicated use is specified by a sign, including but not limited to the following curb regulations: Commercial Vehicles Only, Truck Loading Only, Taxi Stand, Taxi Relief Stand, Authorized Vehicles Only, NYP License Plates Only, Doctor License Plates Only, For-Hire Vehicles Only, Ambulance Only, Ambulette Only, Medical Facility Only, Bus Layover Only, NYS Road Test Only, Flea Market Loading Only, Farmers Market Only, Waiting Line, Carshare Parking Only, Pedal Vehicle Charging Only, Commercial Bicycle Loading Only, or Parking Permitted.

§ 3. Subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (o) of Section 4-08 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(ii) **Parking not permitted.** Parking with and display of agency-authorized permits in the windshield of a vehicle or, where applicable, a permit affixed to the vehicle by the department or an agency authorized by the department is not permitted at:

- (A) "No Standing" areas[.],
- (B) "No Stopping" areas[.],
- (C) Fire hydrants[.],
- (D) Bus stops[.],
- (E) Areas on the roadway side of a vehicle stopped, standing, or parked at the curb (i.e., Double parking) [.] ,
- (F) Driveways[.],
- (G) Bridges and highways[.],
- (H) Areas where a traffic hazard would be created[.],
- (I) Carshare parking space(s) [.] , and
- (J) "Commercial Bicycle Loading Only" zones.

§4. Subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (4) of subdivision (o) of Section 4-08 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(iii) **Parking not permitted.** Parking with single issue permits is not permitted at:

- (A) "No Standing" areas,
- (B) "No Stopping" areas,
- (C) Fire hydrants,
- (D) Bus stops,
- (E) Double parking,
- (F) Driveways,
- (G) On bridges and highways,
- (H) In carshare parking space(s), [and]
- (I) Areas where a traffic hazard would be created[.] , and
- (J) "Commercial Bicycle Loading Only" zones.

§5. Paragraph (1) of subdivision (j) of Section 4-12 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(1) *Restrictions.* No person shall operate, stand, or park a vehicle or bicycle on any street or roadway for the purpose of commercial advertising. Advertising notices relating to the business for which a vehicle is used may be put upon a motor vehicle when such vehicle is in use for normal delivery or business purposes, and not merely or mainly for the purpose of commercial advertising, provided that no portion of any such notice shall be reflectorized, illuminated, or animated, and provided that no such notice shall be put upon the top of the vehicle and that no special body or other object shall be put upon vehicles for commercial advertising purposes. Advertisements may be put upon

vehicles licensed by the New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission in accordance with the Commission's rules.

§6. Paragraph 5 of subdivision (p) of Section 4-12 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(5) Additional requirements for pedal-assist commercial bicycles.

[A] (i) No person shall operate or park a pedal-assist commercial bicycle on any public highway in the city of New York unless such bicycle has permanently affixed in a prominent location on the electric motor of the bicycle or elsewhere on the bicycle a legible original label of the manufacturer of the bicycle and/or of the electric motor containing the maximum motor-assisted speed and motor wattage of the bicycle.

[B] (ii) All pedal-assist commercial bicycles and their operators must comply with the provisions of Article 34 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law relating to the operation of bicycles, except as provided in Section 4-02(e) of these rules.

[C] (iii) A pedal-assist commercial bicycle that has been modified in any of the following ways shall not be considered a pedal-assist commercial bicycle and may not be operated or parked on any public highway:

- [1] A. Any modification that increases the output of such bicycle to seven hundred fifty watts or greater;
- [2] B. Any modification that prevents the motor from disengaging when (i) the operator applies the brakes , (ii) the operator stops pedaling, or (iii) the bicycle achieves a speed of twenty miles per hour; or
- [3] C. Any modification that accelerates the speed of the pedal-assist commercial bicycle motor by means other than pedaling.

(iv) A pedal-assist commercial bicycle may not be parked on a sidewalk, while attended or unattended, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged commercially in loading and unloading property.

§7. Subdivision (p) of Section 4-12 of Chapter 4 of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new paragraph (8) to read as follows:

(8) Additional requirements for commercial bicycles.

(i) Commercial bicycles must display a color contrasting identification label on both sides of each bicycle indicating the name or symbol of the business in which such bicycle is used and if more than 1 bicycle is used a unique ID number assigned by the business.

(ii) Commercial bicycles may park or stand in commercial bicycle loading only zones when actively engaged commercially in loading or unloading property and for the duration of the posted sign.

(iii) Commercial bicycles may park or stand in the parking lane on a street wherever commercial vehicles may park or stand including commercial vehicle metered parking or truck loading zones and shall be exempt from paying parking meter fees. Bicycles must be parked perpendicular to the curb provided there is space for the passage of a vehicle between the bicycle and the center of the street.

This report is issued pursuant to Sections 3020 and 854 (h) of the New York City Charter and Section 25- 318 of the Administrative Code of

the City of New York, which require a report from the Landmarks Preservation Commission for certain plans for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or demolition of any improvement or proposed improvement which is owned by the City or is to be constructed upon property owned by the City and is or is to be located on a landmark site or in a historic district or which contains an interior landmark.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission, at the Public Meeting of March 28, 2023, following the Public Hearing of the same date, voted to issue a positive report for the proposed work, as put forward in your application completed on March 2, 2023.

The proposal consists of work within an area of landscaping, adjacent to a pathway, in the northeastern section of the park, including installing asphalt paving and concrete curbing contiguous with the existing pathway and, on the new paving, installing a modular public restroom, measuring approximately 9'x5.5'x 9' and including horizontal bands of louvers near the bottom and top of the walls, flat panels throughout the remainder of the walls, vertical support posts, and a flat roof with an integrated fascia, all featuring grey painted metalwork, as well as nonilluminated painted or applied signage "Public Restroom" at the fascia and a handwashing station assembly at one of the walls; and the installation of two gray toned, brushed metal mechanical cabinets, measuring 26"x70"x45" and 17"x30"x50", and associated concrete bases at one of the walls, within the surrounding landscaping, as described and shown in a digital presentation titled "Citywide Prefabricated Public Toilet Pilot "Portland Loo." dated March 28, 2023, and prepared by the NYC Parks; and consisting of twenty-two slides, featuring photographs, photomontages, and drawings, all of which were presented as components of the application at the Public Hearing and Public Meeting.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission noted that Grand Concourse Historic District Designation Report describes Joyce Kilmer Park as a park, established c. 1926.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission found that the placement of the enclosure and cabinets will not eliminate or damage any significant historic or architectural features of the park; that the installations will be located away from the monuments and other design focal points of the park; that given their size, neutral color and design, the installations will not disrupt any prominent vistas and will have a subordinate presence; that the cabinets will be set within landscaping, away from the pathways and screened by plantings, helping them recede from view; that the small amount of proposed paving will provide a level base for the enclosure and be well scaled to the structure, and will be consistent with other paving extensions at pathways in terms of placement, material, details and finish; and that the work will not diminish the special architectural and historic character of the park, streetscape or the Grand Concourse Historic District. Based on these findings, the Commission determined the work to be appropriate to the building and the historic district and voted to is a positive report.

The Commission authorized the issuance of a Commission Binding Report upon receipt, review and approval of signed and sealed Department of Building filing drawings showing the approved design. Subsequently, on July 11, 2023, the Commission staff received drawings labeled P-001.00, C201.AA, C501.00A, P-001.00, P-101.00 and P-501.00, dated July 7, 2023, and prepared by Raymond J. Palmayres P.E., G001.00, L101A.00, L201A.00, A101.00, and A201.00, dated April 26, 2023, and prepared by Marlisa Wise, R.A., V101A.00, and S001.00, S101.00, dated May 25, 2023, and prepared by Ghassan Hanaidy, P.E., and noted that they include the replacement of a metal drinking fountain at existing paving located south of the location of the proposed bathroom with a new metal drinking fountain featuring a different design. With regard to this work, the Commission found that the drinking fountain will be simply designed and typical in size and its presence will not detract from any significant architectural or historic features of the historic district. Additionally, the Commission found that the design reviewed by the Commission has been maintained. On this basis, Commission Binding Report 24-00272 is being issued.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission has reviewed a proposal for restorative work at all facades, including, at the north (East 161st Street), south (East 158th Street), east (Grand Concourse), and west (Walton Avenue) facades, cleaning the facades with a low pressure water rinse; replacing deteriorated limestone units with new limestone units; repointing deteriorated mortar joints; performing Dutchman repairs at select areas of the limestone facade, as well as at the frieze at the eighth floor; rebuilding the parapet walls adjacent to the main and penthouse roofs to their existing height and depth, in conjunction with temporarily removing and reinstalling the limestone cladding on the outward facing sides of the parapets; at the interior courtyard facades, replacing deteriorated brickwork; replacing deteriorated steel lintels; installing new expansion joints at select locations; and replacing select limestone sills, in-kind; at the main, penthouse, and bulkhead roofs, replacing flat roofing with a resin-based roofing assembly; at the third floor courtyard roof, replacing flat roofing with a zinc-coated copper roof; and extending an existing chimney at the main roof to a height of 26' above the finished roof and clad in buff brick; and interior alterations at the first, eighth, and ninth floors, as shown by a mock-up, inspected by staff on March 24, 2023; historic and existing condition photographs; drawings LPC-01 through LPC-10, dated (revised) January 25, 2023, prepared by CTA Architects; drawings T-000.00, EN-100.00, DM-100.00, A-101.00 through A-105.00, A-201.00 through A-208.00, and A-700.00 through A-709.00, dated June 16, 2023, and prepared by Daniel Joseph Allen, R.A.; drawings EN-001.00, M-001.00, M-100.00, M-101.00, E-001.00, E-101.00, E-102.00, P-001.00, P-100.00, and P-200.00, dated (revised) June 16, 2023, and prepared by Albert Collado, P.E.; and drawings S-001.00, S-101.00, S-102.00, S-201.00 through S-204.00, and S-500.00 through S-505.00, dated June 16, 2023, and prepared by Victoria Goriza Ponce De Leon, P.E., all submitted as components of the application.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission notes that the Bronx County Courthouse Designation Report describes 851 Grand Concourse as a neo-Classical style courthouse, designed by Joseph H. Freedlander and Max L. Hausle, and built in 1931-33; and that the building's style, scale, materials, and details are among the features that contribute to the special architectural and historic character of the Grand Concourse Historic District.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission finds that the work is in accordance with the provisions set forth in Title 63 of the Rules of the City of New York, Section 2-11 for Repair, Restoration, Replacement, and Re-creation of Building Facades and Related Exterior Elements, including Section 2-11(c)(1) for cleaning or removal of paint and

coatings; Section 2-11(c)(3) for pointing mortar joints; Section 2-11(c)(4) for repair of natural or cast stone; and Section 2-11(d)(1)(i) for in-kind material replacement; and Section 2-21 for Installation of Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning and other Mechanical Equipment, including Section 2-21(g)(1) for installation of HVAC and other mechanical equipment on rooftops and terraces.

Based on these findings, the Commission determined that the work is appropriate to the building and to the Grand Concourse Historic District. The work, therefore, is approved.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission finds that the small size, neutral finish, simple design, and mounting height of the proposed poletop antennas and transmitter boxes will help them to be discreet installations at the upper portions of the light poles; that the installations will not call attention to themselves and will not detract from the streetscape; that the conduit run will be the thinnest possible diameter and will be finished to blend with the light pole shaft, so as not to call undue attention to itself; that the handhole will be small in size, simple in design, and finished to match the adjacent concrete pavers; and that any concrete sidewalks to be excavated will be replaced with new concrete to match the tint and scoring of the adjacent concrete paving. Based on these findings, the proposed work is determined to be appropriate to this scenic landmark. Therefore, the work is approved.

removing a granite horse trough, inscribed with the name of Frederick J. De Peyster, from on top of wood boards at the sidewalk, as described and as shown on a four page presentation labeled "Relocation of a Horse Trough 233 Butler Street," including existing conditions photographs, dated July 17, 2023, and prepared by NYC Parks, all submitted as components of the application.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission notes that the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) Brooklyn Office, Shelter, and Garage Designation Report describes 233 Butler Street as a neo-Romanesque-style animal shelter with Classical features, designed by Renwick, Aspinwall, and Tucker, and built in 1913, and expanded in 1922. The Commission also notes that a granite watering trough ("The Edith G. Bowdoin Drinking Fountain") was installed at the sidewalk in 1913, and that a similar granite trough, inscribed with the name of Frederick J. De Peyster, was placed on the sidewalk on wood boards between 2017 and 2019, without being installed.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission finds that the horse trough to be removed is not original to the site or a significant later alteration and its removal will not affect any significant architectural features of the individual landmark or its site. Based on these findings, the Commission determined the work to be appropriate to the streetscape. Therefore, the work is approved.

This report is issued in conjunction with Staff Advisory Report 23-11948 for the reinstallation of the horse trough, inscribed with the name of Frederick J. De Peyster, within Central Park; and that no work is proposed for the horse trough which was installed in 1913.

To the Mayor, the Council, and the Department of NYC Parks and Recreation,

This report is issued pursuant to Section 25-318 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, which requires a report from the Landmarks Preservation Commission for plans for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or demolition of any improvement or proposed improvement which is owned by the City or is to be constructed upon property owned by the City and is or is to be located on a landmark site or in a historic district or which contains an interior landmark.

At the Public Meeting of February 28, 2023, following the Public Hearing of the same date, the Landmarks Preservation Commission voted to issue a report for the proposed work, as put forward in your application completed on February 2, 2023.

The proposed work consists of modification to the Upper Vale, within the northeast section of the park, including the removal of three (3) concrete fountain basins and concrete steps within the center of this section of the park, rubble stone walls at the northern and southern perimeters of the section, and select trees in various locations throughout this section of the park; the construction of a one-story multi-use building ("Northern Pavilion"), built into a hillside near the north end of this section of the park and featuring an angled footprint, granite cladding, gray painted single doors, and a horizontal band of unpainted wood windows and a wood fascia immediately below the roofline, with a wood and metal canopy, featuring planters (a green roof), and gray painted guardrails at the roof of the building, as well as the construction of an arbor, featuring metal posts, wood beams, and granite clad footings, near the south end of the section; selectively removing asphalt pathways and installing new curvilinear pathways, including a pathway dividing this section of the park into three areas/zones ("open lawn," "natural exploration area," and "pollinator garden") and a pathway with the new pathway sections featuring granite paving beneath the arbor and adjacent to the new building and poured asphalt paving throughout the remainder of the pathway sections; within the center section (natural exploration area), installing a curvilinear pathway of square wooden pavers ("black locust lumber"), engineered wood fiber paving/ground cover, and naturalistic furnishing and play equipment, featuring sand, wood stumps and logs boulders, and a hand pump system; installing granite seating walls, retaining walls and curbing, timber curbing, and a few boulders adjacent to portions of the granite and asphalt pathways, including granite walls with wood leaning rails beneath the arbor and granite walls with a black painted metal handrail adjacent to a sloped section of pathway; the installation of 4' tall mesh fencing at the west side of the lawn area and fully encircling the meadow ("pollinator garden"), as well as installing green and black painted wood and metal benches ("Central Park Settees"), black painted metal waste receptacles, and a black painted water fountain/bottle filler adjacent to the pathways; and planting trees and other landscaping work in select locations throughout this section of the park. The proposal was shown in a digital slide presentation, titled "Upper Vale Reconstruction," dated February 28, 2023, and consisting of 51 slides of drawings and photos, prepared by the Prospect Park Alliance, all presented at the Public Hearing and Public Meeting.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission noted that the Prospect Park Scenic Landmark Designation Report describes Prospect Park as a primarily naturalistic style park designed in 1866-73 by Frederick Law Olmsted and Calvert Vaux. The Commission also noted that a

playground was built within this section of the park in accordance with Olmsted and Vaux designs circa 1870; that the area was redesigned as a rose garden, with lily basins, featuring stone copings, by McKim, Mead and White in the early 20th century; and that the area was redesigned in the 1960s to feature concrete basins and stone perimeter walls.

With regards to this proposal, a quorum of Commissioners voted to approve the overall concept of the proposal as presented, but recommended that the Public Design Commission ask the applicants to explore and restudy aspects of the design.

All of the Commissioners supported redesigning this section of the park, without replicating the existing or historic designs, finding that this section of the park has changed over time, that the prior designs were not successful, that the existing design is unwelcoming, that existing tree growth divides the area into three sections, that selectively removing nonhistoric trees and shrubs will help restore views, and that providing accessibility will serve the changing needs of the public.

A plurality of Commissioners also expressed support for the majority of the landscape work as presented, finding that the open plan with the inclusion of naturalistic play equipment and meadows, will be consistent with Olmsted's intentions for this section of the park.

However, several of the Commissioners expressed concerns about specific aspects of the landscape design, including that the division of the proposed design into three zones may overly divide the areas and be inconsistent with the historically unified designs for this section of the park, and recommended that that design be refined to work as a single entity, maintaining a dialogue between the present and the past designs.

Some of the Commissioners also found that the proposed fencing of the meadow would diminish the historic axial experience, while one Commissioner noted that maintaining the meadow may not be feasible without fencing, and one Commissioner recommended not planting any new trees in locations which would further divide the spaces, thereby preserving views and vistas.

Additionally, some of the Commissioners noted that the proposed arbor was not fully designed and had questions about its height and materials palette and recommended that the design of the arbor be lighter and not feature a mix of materials, and one Commissioner recommended that the proposed fencing be made more consistent in design with the fencing to be used within the adjoining Lower Vale.

All of Commissioners had concerns about aspects of the proposed building's design, with a few of the Commissioners also recommending restudying its placement.

Most of the Commissioners found the design of the building to be too heavy, with some specifically finding the building's design intrusive and suggesting that the building have a more picturesque and simpler design, that the angularity of the canopy be redesigned to feature a gentle arc, and that the orange color be toned down, helping the design to relate better to the surrounding landscaping and to soften the presence of the structure.

A few of the Commissioners indicated that the design should more closely follow one of the two common design approaches of existing structures in the park by either blending more into the landscape as a discreet element or by featuring a more timely, contemporary design, which would strongly contrast with the landscape.

Some of the Commissioners also found the upper and lower halves of the structure stylistically divergent and rigidly stacked and recommended a looser approach, with a more artistic and integrated design.

Additionally, one of the Commissioners recommended that the canopy feature all timber, rather than a mix of materials.

Finally, some of the Commissioners recommended that the building be set further back into the landscaping and/or that alternative nearby locations for the building be considered, while other Commissioners found its placement in the hillside appropriate.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission has reviewed a proposal for installing a salvaged, historic granite horse trough, within landscaping, immediately east of the southern end of West Drive, within the park, as described and shown in a presentation labeled "Relocation of a Horse Trough Central Park", including existing condition photographs; photomontages; a written statement dated June 24, 2023, and prepared by Sybil Young of the City of New York Department of Parks and Recreation; an email, dated May 3, 2023, and prepared by Sybil Young, all submitted as components of this application.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission notes that the Central Park Designation Report describes the Central Park Scenic Landmark as an English Romantic style public park designed in 1857-58 by Frederick Law Olmsted and Calvert Vaux. The Commission also notes that the original siting of the historic granite trough to be installed is not currently known.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission finds that the basic design, material, age, and finish of the trough will be in keeping with the types of horse troughs historically found within the park; and that that its presence and placement, adjacent to a main roadway, will not detract from any significant architectural or historic features of the park.
