NYS DEC and Con Edison Support NYC Fleet Electrification

In February 2020, Mayor de Blasio committed NYC to [achieving an all-electric fleet by 2040](#). NYC already operates the largest plug-in fleet (over 3,000 units) and plug-in network (over 1,070 units) in NY State.

Electrifying a fleet as large and complex as NYC's fleet will require enormous focus and commitment. It will also require partnership and resources. In today's newsletter, we recognize the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and Con Edison for supporting our transition towards an all-electric fleet in NYC.

NYS DEC has been supporting the purchase of plug-in and all-electric fleet vehicles with offset grants. To date, DCAS has received \$187,500. These grants ease the transition to electric vehicles by off-setting the increase in purchase price, and enable the City to more quickly realize the fuel and maintenance savings from EVs.

On September 8, DCAS and [Con Edison announced the first round of Power Ready grants](#) to support the expansion of our electric charging network. Con Edison has granted the first \$250,125 of a possible \$1.3 million to support our expansion of fast charging. DCAS will have at least 100 fast chargers in use by the end of the year with 90 already in operation.

DCAS also participates in Con Edison's SmartCharge program which incentivizes electric vehicle charging during non-peak hours. The City has received \$163,000 in support from this program since 2017.

DCAS appreciates and recognizes the continuing partnership of NYS DEC and Con Edison. We look forward to expanding these efforts as we pursue an all-electric fleet. We will recognize additional partnership efforts in future newsletters. Thanks to Brent Taylor, Sherry Lee, Jon Ells, and Henry Cornejo for their work on these grant projects from within DCAS.
