- Avoid Placing Items on Radiators: Never hang clothing, towels, or other materials on radiators, as this can increase the risk of fire.
- Portable Heaters Are Prohibited: Portable heaters are not allowed in office spaces. Use only building-approved heating systems to ensure safety.
- If your workspace is too cold: Contact the building engineer to troubleshoot the issue and ensure proper heating in the area.

Clutter-Free Office Space:

- Organize Around Heat Sources: Store materials like paper, cardboard, and flammable items away from radiators and heaters.
- Clear Pathways: Ensure hallways, emergency exits, and workspaces remain free of clutter to allow for safe movement and access.

Stay Vigilant:

In cold weather, radiators and heaters are essential, but their safety must be a priority. By following these guidelines, we can keep our office spaces safe and warm.
