The Notice of Examination is amended to extend the last day of the Application Period from November 26, 2024 to December 30, 2024. Candidates who previously applied do not need to apply again.

WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES:

Benefits Opportunity Specialists under supervision, with some latitude for independent judgement and decision making and in accordance with agency policies and procedures, federal, State, and local laws, regulations, and policies, provide economic support and other economic opportunity services and supportive services to persons in need and ensure household needs are met. All Benefits Opportunity Specialists perform related work.

Special Working Conditions:

Benefits Opportunity Specialists may be required to work various shifts including nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays. Benefits Opportunity Specialists may also be required, depending on program requirements, to perform routine field work requiring travel on public transportation or by car within the five boroughs of New York City. Examples of field work include performing home visits, escorting a client/applicant to a social service or medical appointment, or accompanying a client/applicant to view housing units for potential rental.

THE SALARY:

The current minimum salary is \$47,708 per annum. This rate is subject to change.

HOW TO QUALIFY:

You are responsible for determining whether or not you meet the education and experience requirements for this examination prior to submitting your application. If you are found "Not Qualified," your application fee will not be refunded and you will not receive a score.

As per Section 54(2) of the Civil Service Law, the education requirement needed to qualify must be met by November 26, 2025. The experience requirement needed to qualify must be met by November 26, 2024.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

- A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university; or
- 2. A four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent, and two years of full-time, satisfactory experience in social/human services, call centers, customer service or a related setting performing the following:
 - a. Interviewing, determining eligibility for, and/or providing client benefits and services; or
 - b. Interviewing, determining eligibility for, and/or providing employment planning and counseling services including job development, skill assessment, and employment placement or other economic opportunity programming; **or**
- economic opportunity programming; **or**3. Education and/or experience equivalent to "1" or "2" above. College credit from an accredited college or university can be substituted for experience on the basis of 30 semester credits for six months of

experience. However, all candidates must have at least a four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent.

The high school diploma or its educational equivalent must be approved by a State's Department of Education or a recognized accrediting organization. The college or university must be accredited by regional, national, professional, or specialized agencies recognized as accrediting bodies by the U.S. Secretary of Education and by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA).

If you were educated outside the United States, you must have your foreign education evaluated to determine its equivalence to education obtained in the United States. This is required only if you need credit for your foreign education in this examination. For more information see the Foreign Education Evaluation Guide in the Required Information section.

During the Education and Experience Exam (EEE), you may answer questions about your experience. If your experience was on a part-time basis working less than 35 hours per week, you will need to convert your part-time experience to full-time experience using the formula below. (number of hours worked per week/35) x (number of months worked)

For example, if you worked at a job for 21 hours per week for 12 months, you would make the following calculation: $21/35 \times 12 = 7.2$ months.

You have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (December 30, 2024) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience and Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in the Online Application System (OASys). Once you Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys, you will not be permitted to submit new or additional information on your Education and Experience Exam online.

Residency: City residency is not required for this position.

English Requirement:

You must be able to understand and be understood in English.

Proof of Identity:

Under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, you must be able to prove your identity and your right to obtain employment in the United States prior to employment with an agency under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner, Department of Citywide Administrative Services.

HOW TO APPLY:

If you believe you meet the requirements in the "How to Qualify" section, apply using the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen application instructions for electronically submitting your application, payment, and completing any required information. A unique and valid email address is required to apply online. Several internet service providers, including but not limited to Google, Yahoo!, AOL, Outlook.com, and Mail.com offer free email addresses. All new OASys accounts require verification before a candidate can apply to ensure the accuracy of candidate information. Verification is instantaneous for most accounts and you will receive a confirmation email with instructions to activate your account. For any account creation issues, you will receive onscreen prompts to contact DCAS. This review may require up to two (2) business days to be reviewed and resolved. Please keep this information and the application period deadline in mind when creating your account.

The following methods of payment are acceptable: major credit card, bank card associated with a bank account, or a prepaid debit card with a credit card logo which you may purchase online or at various retail outlets. If you are receiving or participating in certain forms of public assistance/benefits/programs, or are a veteran, you may qualify to have the application fee waived. - 1. **Application for Examination:** Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.
- 2. Education and Experience Exam: Fill out all the required sections displayed onscreen (if applicable). You will have until midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (December 30, 2024) to clearly specify in detail all of your relevant education and experience on your Education and Experience Exam and submit it in the Online Application System (OASys). If you do not Final Submit your Education and Experience Exam in OASys by midnight Eastern time on the last day of the Application Period (December 30, 2024), your examination will be considered incomplete, you will not receive a score, you will not be invited to subsequent portions of this examination (if applicable), and your application fee will not be refunded.
- 3. Foreign Education Evaluation Guide (Required only if you need credit for your foreign education in this examination): If you were educated outside the United States, you must have your foreign education evaluated to determine its equivalence to education obtained in the United States. THE TEST:

Your score will be determined by an Education and Experience Exam. You will receive a score of 70 points for meeting the education and experience requirements listed above. After these requirements are met, you will receive additional credit up to a maximum of 100 points on the following basis:

THE TEST RESULTS:

If you pass the Education and Experience Exam, your name will be placed in final score order on an eligible list, you will be given a list number, and you will be notified by email of your test results. The eligible list determines the order by which candidates will be considered for appointment. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for appointment if your name is reached on the eligible list. Once a list has been established, it will typically remain active for four years. If you believe that your test part was rated incorrectly, you may submit an appeal of your score to DCAS, Committee on Manifest Errors, through the Online Application System (OASys). Your appeal must give specific reasons why your score should be higher. Your appeal may result in a higher or lower rating.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Selective Certification for Special Experience:

If you have the experience listed in one or more of the areas listed below, you may be considered for appointment to positions requiring this experience through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this experience. Follow the onscreen instructions when completing your Education and Experience Exam to indicate your interest in such Selective Certification and Final Submit it in the Online Application System (OASys).

- 1. Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Municipal Government Experience (MGE): At least three (3) months of full-time satisfactory experience working within a municipal government, which provides services for a city with over 1 million in population, providing economic support and other economic opportunity services and supportive services to persons in need.
- 2. Selective Certification for Positions in Adult Protective Services (PSA): At least three (3) months of full-time satisfactory experience working with the elderly, blind, and disabled special population.
- Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Call Center Experience (CCX): At least three (3)
 months of full-time satisfactory experience working within a call center utilizing call center software
 systems or request management software.
- 4. Selective Certification for Positions Requiring Customer Relationship Management Experience (CRM): At least three (3) months of full-time satisfactory experience working in the customer service field.

Selective Certification for Foreign Language and/or American Sign Language: If you can speak Arabic (ARA), Bengali (BEN), Chinese (Cantonese) (CAN), Chinese (Mandarin) (MAN), Haitian/Creole (CRE), Korean (KOR), Pular (PUL), Russian (RUS), Spanish (SPA), Urdu (URD), Wolof (WOL), Yiddish (YDD) and/or you know American Sign Language (ASL), you may be considered for appointment to positions requiring this ability through a process called Selective Certification. If you pass a qualifying test, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this ability. Follow the onscreen instructions when completing the Education and Experience Exam to indicate your interest in such Selective Certification and Final Submit it in the Online Application System (OASys).
