Communicating with the Neighborhood

As DDC constructs and improves public buildings and infrastructure, the OFFICE OF COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND NOTIFICATION communicates with residents, businesses, and institutions.

COMMUNITY CONSTRUCTION LIAISONS speak directly with the public and distribute project notices. We recognize construction projects are inconvenient but we will work with everyone to help address local concerns.
