



Publicly- Shared Fleets










Two-wheelers are becoming increasingly popular

East River Bridges Bike Counters (1985-2023)



Over the past year:

- > 1 M Revel moped trips
- 1.7 M shared e-scooter trips
- > 28 M Citi Bike trips

East River Bridges:

- 6.13% increase from 2022
- 14.57% increase over 5-yr

Dodging mopeds on the Brooklyn Bridge

James Groenier, 22: I was on the Manhattan approach to the Brooklyn Bridge, and there was a moped driver that very aggressively went around me. On the bridge, that driver took the yellow dividing line as if it was their own lane. Tons of cyclists had to dodge and weave because that moped driver was taking up both lanes. That same day, there was another moped that approached and I had to get off my bike and stand next to the concrete barrier because they were not giving me space and probably going about 30 miles an hour. There's usually a cop that sits on the Manhattan approach. I stopped and asked the officer, "Hey, that moped almost caused a dozen cyclists to get hit. He was not supposed to be on the bridge. What are you guys doing to stop this?: He said, "As long as they can fit past the bollards, they're allowed on the bridge." That is false and not the law, but I wasn't gonna argue.











Fatalities linked to motorized micromobility have gone up



Many moped operators are not taking the necessary steps to operate their devices legally


- Large number of mopeds are not DMVregistered as required by law
- May be operating mopeds without VIN or license plate
- These moped riders may not have a driver's license or insurance
- 85% of vehicles "beating" DOT Speed and Red Light cameras are motorized two-wheelers without license plates

Is it a e-bike or a moped?

- Shops have been branding mopeds as e-bikes
- Some shops offering both street legal and non-street legal mopeds
- There is no DMV registration requirement at the point of sale





A growing number of food delivery workers are shifting to gas mopeds

DOT research conducted in spring-summer 2023:

- Manhattan is primarily served by e-bikes
- Mopeds are popular in the outer boroughs
 - 44% of surveyees riding mopeds work in Brooklyn
- Gas mopeds are preferred over electric mopeds
 - 62% of surveyees on mopeds drove gaspowered ones
- 9 out of 10 devices sold in a Queens bike shop are mopeds, in contrast with last year when 9 out of 10 sales were for e-bikes

Results: DOT's Delivery Worker Battery Survey






What's powering this mode shift?

- Less available battery charging options:
 - Informal charging hubs are shutting down
 - Landlords are banning storage and charging of e-bikes
- Fire safety concerns: 239 fires in 2023
- After LL39, fewer e-bike/batteries in stores:
 - Bike shops have less e-bike inventory
 - No UL-certified batteries for Arrow bikes
- Confusion over new battery laws: Workers believed new laws would outlaw e-bikes
- Ability to travel longer distances





Key areas of work

Evolve Street Designs

- Pilot-test street designs to safely accommodate bikes, ebikes, and standing e-scooters in bike lanes
- Pilot public e-bike charging solutions
- Explore micromobility storage options

Bridge Data Gaps

- Undertake data collection & analysis to bridge gaps in information
- Establish a network across the city of computer vision sensors
- Process historical data

Advance Safety Policy

- Promote training and educational material on safer operation of e-micromobility
- Advocate for requiring moped registration at point of sale
- Engage 3rd-party delivery apps and other stakeholders in promoting public and worker safety
