How To Purchase Naloxone in NYC



Visit a **retailer that sells over-the-counter (OTC)** medications to purchase naloxone without a prescription. (OTC naloxone availability may vary by retailer.)



Visit a **pharmacy** and ask about purchasing naloxone with health insurance. (You will not need a prescription, but the pharmacy may need to order your naloxone.)

If a pharmacy is enrolled in the Naloxone Co-payment Assistance Program (N-CAP), up to \$40 of your insurance copayment can be covered. For more information about N-CAP, visit bit.ly/n-cap.

A Guide to Naloxone Access in NYC



Naloxone is a safe medication that can reverse an opioid overdose. It is legal for anyone to carry and use naloxone in New York State.

How To Get Naloxone for Free in NYC



Visit an **opioid overdose prevention program (OOPP)** — a community-based organization registered to distribute naloxone to community members — to get free naloxone.



Attend a **virtual training** held by the NYC Health Department and get a free naloxone kit by mail.



Visit a **pharmacy participating in the Free Naloxone in NYC Pharmacies Program** and ask the pharmacist for a free naloxone kit (no ID or health insurance required).



Visit a **public health vending machine** to get free naloxone, as well as other health and wellness supplies, conveniently and anonymously.
