Pursuant to the power vested in me as Commissioner of Finance by sections 389(b) and 1043 of the New York Charter, section 237 subdivision 3 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law and section 19-203 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, I hereby promulgate the within amendment to the Rules Relating to Parking Violations. This amendment was published in proposed form in the City Record on May 3, 2004. A hearing for public comment was held on June 3, 2004.

Section 1. Paragraph (3) of the definition of “notice of violation (summons)” contained in section 39-01 of chapter 39 of title 19 of the Official Compilation of Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(3) For purposes of this definition, authorized issuing agents shall also include special patrolmen appointed by the police commissioner pursuant to subdivision (c) of §14-106 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York to do special duty at Parkchester South Condominium, at the New York City Hunts Point Terminal Market in the borough of the Bronx, [and at] Stuyvesant Town in the borough of Manhattan, and various facilities under the jurisdiction of the Department of Citywide Administrative Services.

BASIS AND PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT

The definition of "Notice of Violation (summons)" contained in section 39-01 of the Rules relating to Parking Violations is amended to give authorization to issue notices of parking violations to the Special Patrolmen of New York City Department of Citywide Administrative Services ("DCAS")

DCAS has requested such authorization in order to cite vehicles parked in the agency's authorized parking areas. DCAS has seven parking lots throughout the City used by the authorized vehicles. Although these lots are City property and can be patrolled by the Police Department and the Parking Enforcement Districts agents, they do not routinely patrol or cite vehicles unless a complaint is received from DCAS. The amendment will allow for more efficient noticing of unauthorized vehicles by permitting DCAS Special Patrolmen to issue notices of violation without the necessity of contacting the Police Department.
