














Morningside Park | C. 122nd Street Stairs-Existing Conditions











A. Perimeter wall 1890's

Morningside Park | Timeline of walls in Morningside Park




Overgrown swale on the left. 1966 cheekwall was built on top of pre-1964 cheekwall wall but also overlapping the treads, narrowing the stairways.



Morningside Park | C. 122nd Street Stairs-Evolution




1966 wall overlaps treads by 1-3 granite blocks. Existing wall is 16" wide. No coping allows water in the joints and poor base is causing granite blocks to separate.



No change in original 13'-0" stair width.

(1964 drawing shows proposed change to the stairs to make them orthagonal. This was never built. The stairs are still an irregular curve.) 

Existing width- 16"




1966 Reconstruction of retaining wall at 122nd St. stairs: Granite block wall, built on top of existing "rubble wall".











Morningside Park | C. 122nd Street Stairs, Proposed Reconstruction






Morningside Park | C. 122nd Street Stairs-Proposed sloped cheekwall north






Rustic granite coping example




Existing granite block- to be cut thinner and re-used as facade, both sides, in the same layout as existing pattern




Handrail previously approved by LPC for Morningside Park


