

BALLFIELD REPAIRS AND UPGRADES: SCOPE

- Replacing the padding around the field perimeter and light poles
- Replacing the turf and its component parts (recycle if possible, per BPCA guidelines)
- Additional netting to protect seating / observation areas
- New batting cages and outfield fencing
- Weatherproofing of the dugout roofing
- Repairing the two backstops

- Removing the existing, unusable water cannons and replacing them with misters
- Removing existing bioswale (due to maintenance considerations) and replacing it with additional square footage of turf
- · Removing five trees (for player safety) and reducing the mulch bed
- Replacing existing pavers along the Ball Fields' pedestrian path and between dugouts with new permeable pavers

Ensuring work is complete for Downtown Little League's Opening Day and preceding practices (ideally by March 1), and the fields remain open through the weekend after Thanksgiving.

We will provide regular updates to DLL leadership.





1. Barnett Newman Triangle Plaza Presentation -Resolution







1. Site of triangle at Church, 6th Ave and White street converge







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Project Overview

Purpose and Need

- Protect the Seaport neighborhood from projected Sea Level Rise in 2100
- Achieve a Design Flood Elevation of 11 ft (NAVD88)
- Mitigate impacts from extreme precipitation and the urban heat island effect
- Project is necessary to protect the Seaport from environmental hazards that would cause major disruptions and ultimately render the area unusable

Additional Goals and Objectives


- Use innovative design and engineering strategies to integrate flood protection into a public esplanade and historic district

Flood Alignment Update | Two Project Zones



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
Flood Alignment Update | Flood Alignments Considered

Flood Alignment Update | Height of Intervention




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
