Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) Program: Payment Standards

Good news! Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHVs) can provide extra help in neighborhoods with high rents.

That's right. EHVs can pay more in many high-rent neighborhoods where housing may be difficult to find—without an increase in cost to the voucher holder. For example, EHVs may help pay for 1-bedroom apartments that rent for up to \$2,506 in Rego Park, Queens, and 2-bedroom apartments that rent for up to \$3,791 in Park Slope, Brooklyn.

See the map of New York City on the next page. The neighborhoods shaded blue are where EHVs can pay higher rents.

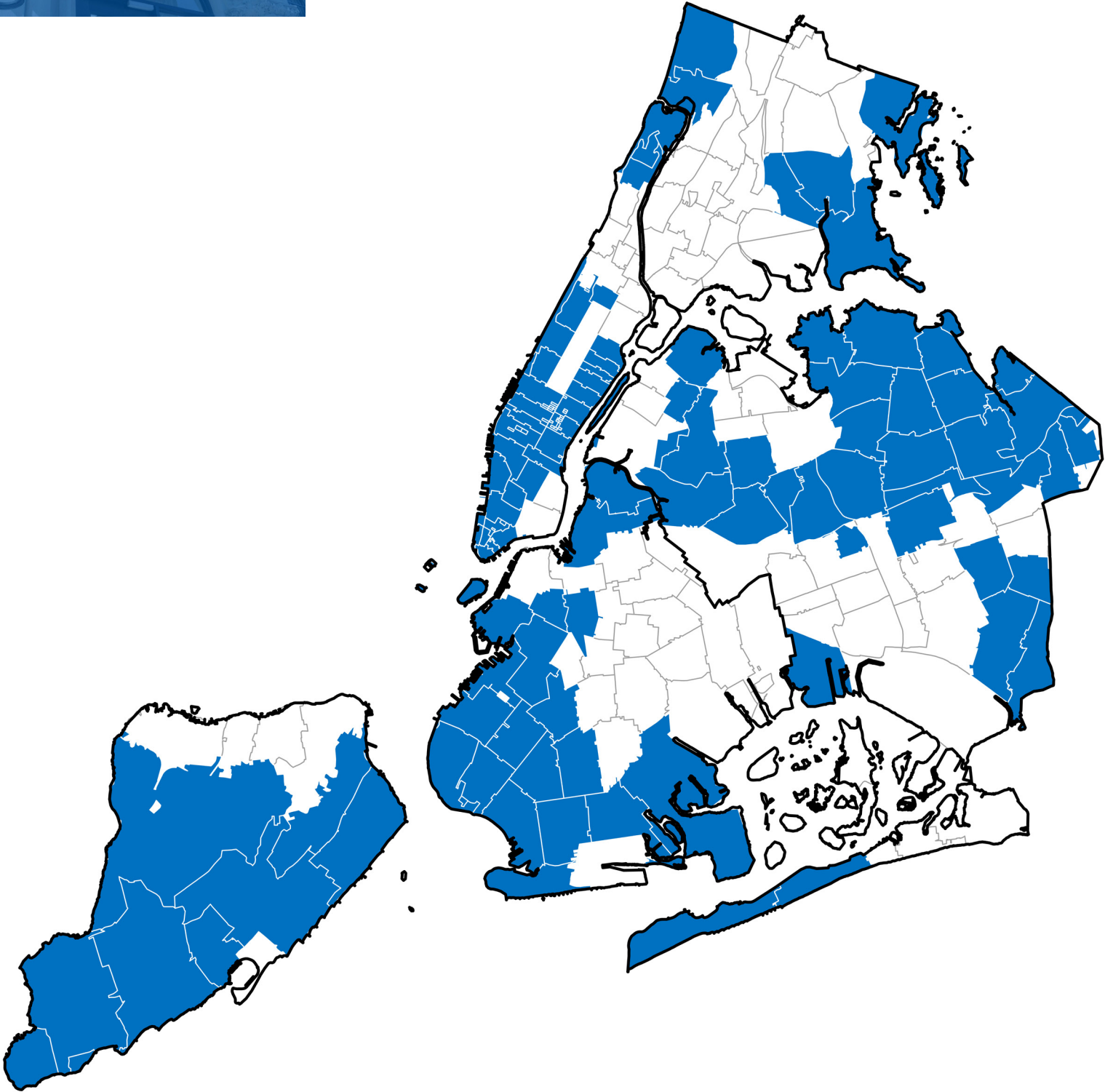
