- Two-year NOFO

- Description: Learn about how an SSI or SSDI beneficiary's benefit is affected
 when returning to work, including SSI budgeting, SSI's break-even point, what
 happens when an SSDI beneficiary enters and ends a trial work period, as well as
 an extended period of eligibility.

Transitioning from Cash Assistance to Employment*(CEU credits available)

- Date: Tuesday, December 3rd, 2024
- Description: Find out what happens when households on Cash Assistance find paid employment and what happens to their cash grant. Learn about reporting requirements, how earnings are budgeted, and overpayment procedures.
