BM Mohammed Ishmael: Contact for emergency? A: Dial 911. NCO's are for criminal intelligence.

Sharon Smith: I have a recurring problem with neighbor (retired fireman) who play's loud, profane music.

A: Give information to officer in the back. (Officer Fitzgerald)

BM Pritpal Walia: Introduction to NCOs...

Queens Connection

BM Richard Hellenbrecht:

- Importance of the Airport.
- Gives background on Governor Cuomo's \$10B investment at JFK.
- Going to affect everyone in the area but also has many opportunities.
- His background working with Delta at Terminal 4 to get 22% MWBE participation.
- Tells of options for labor and businesses should get M/WBE certified.
- PANYNJ.gov search for MWBE under "Doing Business".

BM Corey Bearack: I do not see anyone from CB13 on document passed around.

Glen Greenidge: Jim [Heyliger], Philippa [Karteron] come forward.

Why no participation?

Overview of community benefits.

BM Corey Bearack: Airport items go to this Board. CB13 should be the lead with the airport. We need to understand "our" responsibility with the airport.

James Heyliger: JFK and LGA have Roundtables. [Queens Connection] is an apolitical organization.

BM Bryan Block: CB13 should take the lead in this initiative.

Rene Hill, CB12 Chair: Not a CB12 idea, rather a James Heyliger idea. We need to organize collectively.

BM Lorraine Gittens-Bridges: They have been out there. This has not been a secret.

BM Curlene Nelson: Send a list of days and times of all upcoming meetings to District Manager.

QC: Asking for a vote on Resolution to support a "Community Benefits Package." Outside of Elected Officials.

BM Tameka Pierre-Louis: Do you have a Google Drop Box on meetings that have happened so far?

Philippa Karteron: No. But what a great idea, we will make it happen.

BM Tameka: Have you connected to Jamaica Now Leadership Council? Philippa: Yes. Several of us are part of this.

Dr. Arthur Hackett: Confused. How can I get involved? Do I have to be a member of a Board?

Chair: Call the QCB13 Office and you can get on any committee. Give phone number. Glen Greenidge: You can also join an engagement group.

Dieusita Jean, Assembly Member Vanel's Office: Young people who want to have business on kiosk at the airport...

Glen Greenidge: Looking to do capacity building.

James Heyliger: Asking Port Authority for \$1M to start this process.

Student: Any indication by elected officials that they will implement anything on the proposal?

Philippa Karteron: Speaks about her background, expertise on AirTrain project.

Shurn Anderson, Queens Borough President Katz's Office: The Governor's Office has sat with the Borough President and Southeast Queens legislators; nothing is settled and everything is on the table.

Chair: The ask? A proposal?

BM Kyle Bragg: Motion they came, motion to support Queens Connection efforts to facilitate discussion.

BM Tameka Pierre-Louis: 2nds motion.BM Corey Bearak: Amendment – CB13 supports efforts to create a Community Benefits Plan.

BM Kyle Bragg: Separate issue to support.

BM Corey Bearak: CB13 supports and recognizes development of Community Benefits Package Agreement.

BM Felice Hannah: Does not like the word "support" wants "collaborate".

BM James Delany: "Should we confer with the Land Use Committee."

Chair Clive Williams: Richard Hellenbrecht is saying "no".

BM Kyle Bragg is asked to repeat his motion.

BM Kyle Bragg – "...be in support of Queens Connection's work to facilitate discussions on the JFK Redevelopment Project."

BM Corey Bearak: Suggests amendment - "Community Board 13 supports efforts to create a Community Benefits Package as part of the Airport Development Plan."

BM Kyle Bragg: I agree with Corey but, the point is that as a Community Board, we have every opportunity to create our own motion on how we engage the Port Authority because as you (Corey) said, it is in our jurisdiction. I think it is smart to be in support of their efforts.

BM Corey Bearak: Recommendation – "Community Board 13 supports efforts and recommends the development of a Community Benefits Package as part of the Airport Development Plan."

BM Kyle Bragg: Are you excluding Queens Connection? [Chatter] I'll follow your (Corey's) lead.

DM Mark McMillan - "Can you (Corey) say it again?"

BM Corey Bearak - Repeats amendment.

BM Felice Hannah – Thank you for the opportunity. I appreciate all of the work that has been done. Recommends Community Board 13 work with Community Board 12, Community Board 14 and other interested parties.

Chair Clive Williams: Corey can you handle that technicality? Supports and collaborates?

BM Corey Bearak: To me, they are one in the same.

Chair Clive Williams: Because I am Chair, I have to solve that quandary. Since you say you can use it interchangeably, in my opinion, I agree that we all can collaborate. Could you finish off the motion?

BM Corey Bearak: I think that what we are hearing is, "Community Board 13 recommends the development of a Community Benefits Package and commits to collaborating with Community Boards 12, 14 and other interested Community Boards and Community Organizations."

Chair Clive Williams: Asks for second on motion.

BM Felice Hannah: Seconds motion.

Unanimous vote of support.
