BM Tameka Pierre-Louis: NCO's relationship with local public schools?

BM Alain Berrouet: An exemplar of a precinct for best practices?

A: 113 Precinct. Crime indicators down for precious years. NCO's online April 2, 2018.

BM Bess DeBetham wants "excused" in attendance record for attending Borough President's Black History Month Celebration instead of General Board Meeting in February.

Earlene Sealy: A curb cut on Springfield Boulevard? I can see a lot of accidents... A: No curb cut on Springfield Boulevard.

Melissa Hubbard: A one-way exit to reduce the amount of traffic? A: A 22' wide curb cut will help.

BM Kyle Bragg: Can this be raised at ULURP hearing? A: Yes.

BM Charles Farruggia: What is the lighting situation?

A: The owner is unaware of anyone asking for better lighting.

BM Richard Hellenbrecht: Committee recommended two designated entrances and exits on North Conduit Avenue. And one additional handicapped parking spot.

A Public Hearing was held on March 20, 2018 at VFW Post on Springfield Boulevard. [He reads the Resolution.]

Motion to accept. Seconded. Roll Call vote: 35 Yes 0 No 0 Abstentions

Belmont Park Issue

- > Bringing Islanders (hockey team) back to Long Island.
- > The local community is opposed [to this project].
- > Other issues:
 - o Entertainment complex.
 - o 250 room hotel (25 stories)
 - Containing retail shopping
 - o More utilities need to be put in (sub-station)
 - o Traffic management
 - 19K seat stadium, 200 times per year with 3000 cars
 - o Belmont Park will still be in operation.
- > A few meetings ago, those in favor [of the project] were predominately from eastern Long Island
 - o A casino could possibly open up if Islanders do not do well
 - o The Belmont LIRR Station upgrade is very costly
- > Impacts the Queens Village area.

BM Rhonda Kontner: Is this a done deal?

A: Governor has signed off. There are Scoping Meetings but there is no scope.

Board Chair: Even though Governor signed off, it is not done yet.

BM Steven Taylor: What is the regional planning approval process and the evaluations on the effects on local communities?

- o Attended a Parks forum on this
- o Proposal for Brookville Park but it needs an advocate
- o No dog runs in Southeast Queens
- > Congratulates BM Kangela Moore on the award received from Partnership for Parks.

Health Committee:

- > No one is attending meetings.
- > Planning on Urgent Care Centers by Long Island Jewish Hospital.
- > Presentations on caregivers.
- > Looking for topics of interest for the community.

Public Safety

- > Two Nor'easters occurred on the two scheduled March meeting dates.
- > Commends Community Coordinator Maxine on the Street Activity Permits process.
- > Remembers the firefighter who died in the Harlem fire.

Motion made to adjourn the meeting.
