- Little Neck Parkway Building, 251-77 Jericho Turnpike
  - o Hearing in March
    - Two issues gym (PCE)
  - BSA approved
    - Child care center open
  - Construction halted because of PAUSE
  - o Issue:
    - Parking in the basement down ramp with two hard-left turns to valet
      - Feels this will create street parking
      - Chime in at next...
- BSA# 220-29-BZ, 146-65 Springfield Boulevard
  - o Never a problem
    - R3-2 and R3-1 lot
  - o Requires variance
    - Normally a reinstitution but owner added 4K Sq. Ft. mezzanine
    - This is the issue
    - No parking issue
    - Passed this along to Barbara Brown (President of civic in the area)
    - Will vote if possible at June meeting
- BSA# 2020-3-BZ, 142-18 Hook Creek Boulevard
  - Use in a city mapped street not currently used
  - o Copies sent to Rosedale Civic Association
  - o Workable
- ULURP @ 245-01 Jamaica Avenue
  - o Series of stores at intersection at Braddock Avenue
    - PCE, Karate Studio
      - These two uses cannot exist in present zoning
      - Request for rezoning

- Community fought for present zoning to preclude a hotel ever being made at this location
- ULURP @ 146-93, 147-01, 147-07 Guy R. Brewer Boulevard
  - o One-story buildings, shops, open lots
  - o Underutilized space
  - o Developer wants to build an eight-story apartment building
  - o EDC concered
  - o Local residents concerned
  - o Parking a problem
