

Guided Tours

Today, the Armstrong home in the multi-racial, working-class neighborhood of Corona, Queens is open to the public, offering guided tours in multiple languages.

Armstrong Archives

The Louis Armstrong Archives are accessible in person at the new Armstrong Center. We offer inperson archival tours with museum staff and virtual exhibits with detailed stories from the archives. The digital collections are accessible to the public online through our website at all times.

The new multimedia exhibit,
Here to Stay, curated by jazz
pianist and MacArthur Genius,
Jason Moran utilizes the
Armstrong archives to tell a
dynamic story.

Listening Parties

In addition to the archival tours, we organize listening parties where we spin Louis Armstrong Classic 78s in the Jazz room and invite guests to also bring their own and share insights with our archival experts.



Armstrong Now!

Our Armstrong Now roster includes many artists like: Esperanza Spalding, Amyra León, Matthew Whitaker, Alain Lauture, Ulysses Owens and 2023 Grammy winner, Samara Joy.

The Armstrong Now Artist in
Residence and Signature programs
contextualize Armstrong's
contributions within historical and
21st Century constellations of
Black making, thinking, and
vitality. The program provides
emerging and established
multidisciplinary artists with a
platform to create and perform
new work inspired by the vast
Armstrong Archives collections.

The Jazz Room

As it opened in 2023, this new indoor space allows the Museum to host and stream performances year round. Indoor Jazz Room concerts now joins our outdoor Garden Concert series and exponentially increases the Museum's live music offerings.

Louis Armstrong's music is timeless, as evidenced by his 2022 Holiday album reaching the Billboard Top 10. Armstrong Now and The Jazz Room bring this urgent artistic expression to today's audiences.



After School Program

Our after-school programs cover grades K-12 across all NYC boroughs, delving into Louis Armstrong's digitized jazz archives. The programs offer hands-on activities, exploring Jazz's origins, music elements, composition, and rhythm. They include 12-week residencies, assemblies, and customizable curricula for schools.


Pops is Tops

Internships

The Louis Armstrong House
Museum welcomes applications
for interns year round. Interns at
the House Museum have the
opportunity to lead House Tours,
work closely with our Visitor
Services Manager, work with the
Museum's research collections,
and more.

Trumpet Traditions

We offer one-on-one and small group trumpet classes, utilizing specially donated instruments. This program aims to remove barriers to music learning and performance for students in the Queens community.

Voices of Freedom

We invite students K-12 to learn about Armstrong, investigate the Armstrong Archives, strengthen their musicianship and create new works while learning about the process and techniques of world class artists.

Workshops and assemblies take place on site at the Museum, online, and in classrooms throughout New York and beyond.



Community Calendar

Our Neighborhood Calendar includes a variety of free workshops including dance, music, yoga, collage art and more that aims to continue building community around Pops and Lucille's Home.

Housing and Home Ownership

The Armstrongs were two Black artists who owned their own home in th 1940's. In that legacy, the museum partners with organizations like the Neighborhood Housing Services of Queens to support home ownership and wealth creation in Queens communities.

Justice Arts

Now hosting the Arts Justice
Convening, the Louis Armstrong
House Museum, in collaboration
with New Yorkers for Culture &
Arts (NY4CA), brings together
arts organizations, artists,
justice-impacted individuals, and
those in the justice system. It's an
ongoing series of conversations
with profound reflection,
performances, and panel
discussions to share resources.



Global Ambassadors

Louis Armstrong played in over 62 countries, both privately and as part of the U.S. State Department's Jazz Ambassadors Program. The Museum takes up that legacy by engaging with Armstrong's global fans virtually and inperson and bringing those global partnerships back to Queens. The Global Ambassadors Program has included:

- A 2023 exhibition at "Das Minsk" museum in Postdam Germany titled: "I've Seen the Wall" - Louis Armstrong on Tour in the GDR in 1965. This exhibition is available to the public until the 4th of January 2024
- A 2023 partnership with the U.S. State
 Department's Art in Embassies
 Program and the Shaikh Ebrahim
 Center, which brought Director Regina
 Bain to the Kingdom of Bahrain in the
 Middle East to present on Louis
 Armstrong's global legacy.
- A 2022 2023 partnership with Pina Bausch Dance Company in Germany and the Frank Sinatra High School in Queens.
- A 2021 partnership with the U.S.
 Embassy in Moscow and the Forum for Cultural Engagement to bring Dave Brubeck's Real Ambassadors Musical to students in Russia.
