






1. Little Manila Park





















2. Little Manila Triangle



Little Manila Park Sculpture # 2



Jose Rizal: (June 19, 1861 – December 30, 1896) was a Filipino nationalist, writer and polymath active at the end of the Spanish colonial period of the Philippines. He is considered a national hero of the Philippines. An ophthalmologist by profession, Rizal became a writer and a key member of the Filipino Propaganda Movement, which advocated political reforms for the colony under Spain.


Rizal is widely considered one of the greatest heroes of the Philippines and has been recommended to be so honored by an officially empaneled National Heroes Committee. He wrote the novels *Noli Me Tángere* (1887) and *El filibusterismo* (1891), which together are taken as a national epic, in addition to numerous poems and essays.


Statues of José Rizal can be found in various countries around the world due to his significant influence as a national hero of the Philippines and his contributions to literature, education, and the promotion of human rights.
















Mho we are Mission


Our Vision


