Laura Shepard, Chair of the CB2 Environment, Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Laura Shepard introduced Daniel Abram and Adam Ganser of New Yorkers for Parks.

- New Yorkers for Parks is an advocacy organization that advocates for parks and open space for all New Yorkers. They have been around for 100 years.
- They are working on updating and expanding the 2021 Open Space Profiles for CB2.
- There will be a conversation of the community district needs, new park ideas, park access ideas for bike lanes via greenways.
- New Yorkers for Parks is also interested in increasing the tree canopy in the district.

"Serving the Communities of Long Island City, Sunnyside, Woodside, and Maspeth"

- Daniel Abram went through his presentation with the committee checking on various green spaces, playgrounds, open streets, bike lanes and greenways, etc. and their locations and the status of them.
- Daniel Abrams stated the report should be coming out in the Fall 2024.
- New Yorkers for Parks is working with Cornell Tech with their Tree Folio NYC app to look at areas where trees can be planted and their impact on heating reduction.
- The Schoolyards to Playgrounds program is a Trust for Public Land program that opens schoolyards to be playgrounds after school hours for the community to use.
  - These programs are done through the Department of Education.
  - The maintenance is also shared and worked out with the Department of Education.
  - The challenge is the funding from the City for these projects.
- There was a discussion on new park ideas.
- Discussion on community gardens.

Laura Shepard introduced Noel Gamboa to discuss his presentation on a new park development.

- Noel Gamboa is the President of Little Manila Park Inc.
- Little Manila Park located at Roosevelt Avenue and 70<sup>th</sup> Street.
- Little Manila Park greenspace is located at the corner of 70<sup>th</sup> Street and 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue.
- The second greenspace is the Little Manila Triangle located at the corner of Roosevelt Avenue and 70<sup>th</sup> Street.
- Improved pedestrian conditions were the #1 issues for both Northern Blvd. and Roosevelt Avenue.
- They have reached out to community leaders and elected officials for support and have been working on this project since the pandemic.
- The park on 70<sup>th</sup> Street and 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue has been underutilized for 30 years.
- They consulted with NYS arborists to determine which trees should stay or be removed.
- The area would be open to the public and the area allows for performances.

- Noel Gamboa spoke about Little Manila Triangle located at 70<sup>th</sup> Street and Roosevelt Avenue.
- The vision for Little Manila Triangle is to have sculptures and murals in this area.
- Noel Gamboa is requesting a letter of support from the committee.

Discussion on local flooding will be tabled to the next meeting.

Short discussion on congestion pricing letter.

New Business:

Laura Shepard, Chair of the Environment, Parks and Recreation Committee made a motion to write a letter of support for the Little Manila Park proposal for its entirety to the elected officials and agencies. Carlos Castell Croke, Vice Chair seconded this motion.
