




Currently - **13,024 open restaurants** (6400 in Manhattan, 3200 in Brooklyn, 2500 in Queens, 700 in Bronx, 200 Staten Island)

New York City's restaurant industry had 23,650 establishments in 2019

Outdoor dining has reached the 17 Community Districts that had none under the pre-pandemic Sidewalk Café program; and






Highest Tier (Sector 4) - \$25/sf to \$31/sf

Lowest Tier (Sector 1) - \$5/sf to \$6/sf (80% of the city)

Based on the median annual rent for a square foot of a ground floor commercial premises in such sector.

There shall be **4 sectors**, provided that sectors 3 and 4 shall only include the area south of and including 125th Street in the borough of Manhattan, and the fee rate for sector 1 shall apply to a minimum of 80 percent of the city.

Roadway cafes may be seasonal and closed between November 30 to March 31.

Germany has a program called *Nette Toilette* or Nice Toilet. It is active in 210 cities and has been running since 2000. Cities pay from \$34 to \$112 per month to a business.



Examples of annual payment from various CTS

- o Single unisex: £550, £800.
- Separate male £400 and separate female £400.
- o Both male and female: £850.
- Multiple unisex toilets or baby changing: £1000. Wheelchair accessible: £1000, £1200.
- o If the toilet is accessible: additional £100.
- o If the toilet allows baby-changing: additional £100.
- Council premises: max £200 regardless of facilities.
 Up to £750 depending on how many days/week the venue is ope
- o £1000 if open 7 days/week, otherwise £800.

PROPOSAL FOR PUBLIC BATHROOM ACCESS

- Reduce Open Restaurant Program fee for restaurants opening up their bathrooms to the public (with Fee Schedule)
- Require restaurants participating in the Open Resturants Program that have roadbed or sidewalk space over XX SF to open up their bathrooms to the public
- Fees generated from Open Restaurant Program would pay for stipend for restaurants not participating in the Open Restaurant Program to open up their bathrooms to the public
