Public Comments – Comments by Community Members (1 Minute) up to ten minutes

UPDATE BY 108TH POLICE PRECINCT ON TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ISSUES

Sgt. Gallagher provided the following update:

- Traffic Calming issues Blissville met with business owners, enforcement was conducted, issued 14 parking violations.
- Van Dam and Bradley Avenue Auto Body Shops operation on overnight and issued violations to the body shops, issued 10 parking summonses.
- Crescent Street between 43rd Avenue and 44th Road enforcement needed (triple parking) for the 28-day period, met with business owners, also issued several summonses at this location.
- 37th Street between Bradley Avenue and Starr Avenue Enforcement of cars coming down the wrong direction – Request for a Camera? Met with business owners and conducted enforcement issued 10 parking sidewalk violations were issued. Sgt. Gallagher will visit the location for trucks traveling the wrong way.

Sgt. Gallagher will visit the Illegal business on 37th Street with a camper that is being rented.

Chairperson Danielle Brecker reported double and triple parking near 22nd Street between 43rd and Queens Plaza South. Sgt. Gallagher will revisit the location.

A board member reported on the following:

- unprotected bike lane on 47th and 48th Street between 50th Avenue and Greenpoint avenue, rush hour they are chronically blocked.
- 48th Street between Northern Boulevard and 37th Avenue, chronic problem, bike lanes are blocked.

Debra Markell Kleinert reported 37th Avenue between 57th to 59, there is double parking and parking on the sidewalk.

Sheila Lewandowski discussed the issue of people advertising on social media advertising overnight stays in vehicles as AirB&B Urban Experience. Sgt. Gallagher recommended speaking to Community Affairs.

Enforcement has been conducted at the Queensboro Bridge, seized over 50 motorized scooters and illegal bikes.

Sgt. Gallagher reported that you cannot have anything covering your license plate.

• NYC Hunters Point South Ferry – update on the alternative locations for the Hunters Point South Ferry landing.

Tara Das introduced her colleague Nina Verosa.

Nina Verosa, Transportation Planner, EDC provided a presentation on the NYC Hunters Point South Ferry Landing – Alternative Analysis Study Update (copy attached, Attachment #1)

Tara Das discussed the timeline of the study and the next steps. Still in the process of doing the alternatives analysis study, expect it to wrap up later in the summer, then will do informal and formal engagement study and will return later in the Fall with a final report and recommendations to the community.

- Provide an update on the Mayor Adams 1000 Citywide DOT initiative on intersection improvements and the impact on the CB2 District. (Any intersections within CB 2, What is the process to get on the list) (CB 2 Sent a letter - DOT-566033-Z7L8). As per DOT, the unit is currently reviewing requests and will get back before the end of the year/early next year.
- Provide an update on the Queensboro bridge pedestrian cyclist lane. CB2 is requesting an expedited timeline. (CB2 provided a letter and CB 2 is looking for a response to the CB 2 Letter)
- Provide an update on the clear markings along the Northern Blvd. Protected Bike Lane

REQUEST UPDATES FROM DOT

Blissville

- Discussion of reconsideration of DOTs decision that no action is needed at the intersection of Van Dam, 35th Street and Starr Avenue where a construction fence has been erected; curb-to-curb sending pedestrians into the street with no protection.
- The Blissville Greenway from K bridge to G bridge along Review Avenue connecting Laurel Hill and Blissville and the Boroughs of Brooklyn and Queens. Councilman Van Bramer has written a letter of support for this community inspired project that is also contained in the CB2s "Top 10" budget priorities. DOT-484255-K7Q6 – Request an update
- Request DOT conduct a feasibility study on 37th Street between Review Avenue and Starr Avenue. Change directional and if not approved, add a left turn signal from Review Avenue onto 37th going east. CB2 sent a letter to DOT (DOT-537677-J6D9)

Commissioner Garcia reported on the following:

- DOT Currently assessing the feasibility of converting 37th from a one way east bound to a one way west bound. Will come back to the Committee with their findings. Looking at this area and pedestrian safety and bicyclist safety improvements in the area. They will come back to talk about engagement and what these safety improvements will look like. Will be joining MTA at the September CB2 meeting.
- Provided an update on the Borden Avenue Pump Station which is interfering with a crosswalk. DOT went out and met with the counterparts at DEP and will aim to have more updates as the discussion progresses. DEP is aware of the issue.
- Reported on the missing pedestrian signal at Queens Plaza South on Queens
 Boulevard and Jackson Avenue on the northwest corner. DOT is aware of the issue
 and they are in the process of taking counts. The condition will remain as a stop
 control and are asking engineers if this can be signalized.

- Reported on crossing time from north to south over the past several weeks. DOT
 has been testing out some timing and have been able to increase the crossing time.
 At 27th and 28th Streets they tweaked some time and added a few more seconds and will be able to continue to work on it and will continue to monitor.
- Reported that the Queens Borough Bridge south outer roadway, there is a supply chain related issue for the bridge opening and it is something beyond their control. It will be more into 2024.
- 21st Street Pedestrian Bridge, Council Member Won reached out to DOT about lighting and they were able to get a crew out there and they have since repaired.
- A discussion about the 21st Street Pedestrian Bridge took place.

Debra Markell Klienert thanked DOT for moving the bench on 44th Street just off Queens Boulevard.

- Maspeth Industrial Business Zone Safety Enhancements part II. Provide an update
- Request for Inclusion of Intersection of Greenpoint Avenue and Starr Ave as part of Mayor Adams 100 citywide DOT Initiative on Intersection Improvements. (DOT-565909-V4X8 – DOT Letter on November 25, 2022, as per DOT conditions have not changed)
- Request for improvements to Van Dam Street and Greenpoint Avenue In Early
 October, DOT received a request for improvements at this location and along
 Greenpoint Avenue bike lane between Brooklyn and Queens. DOT will consider adding
 connection to the NYC bicycle network as they develop new projects
- "No thru truck traffic signage" There are only 4 streets in Blissville that allow permit trucks to travel through the street (1) review avenue (2) Greenpoint Avenue (3) Borden Avenue and (4) Van Dam. All other trucks should only be allowed with "truck traffic for local deliveries only" signage. CB 2 is requesting signage alerting trucks of this rule to aid NYPD with enforcement. Specific streets CB2 requests "No thru truck traffic signage" included at 35th Street and 37th Street (DOT-581076-X9W1)
- The Committee reported the painted lines on the road (THE PAINTED LINE BULB OUT at STARR and GREENPOINT) have vanished and a request was made to have them refurbished. DOT reported, they will investigate getting the markings done as soon as the warm weather returns. Provide an update. (DOT -581065-J1R6)
- The committee discussed the Complete Streets Program and requested a review of this.; Specifically, after learning that there was in fact, no part 2 coming to Blissville following the Maspeth Industrial Business Zone Safe Enhancements. Tom suggested that maybe the Governor's Complete Streets Program that is to pay for 87% of a project that uses complete street methodology could be the answer for Blissville.
