A Message from the Social Security Administration...

Beginning **August 2014**, SSA will no longer issue Social Security number printouts in its field offices. Individuals who need proof of their Social Security number and cannot find their card, will need to apply for a replacement card.

In addition, beginning **October 2014,** the field offices will stop providing benefit verification letters, except in emergency situations. Benefit verifications are available online, and can be obtained anytime by registering for a *my* Social Security account located at: www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount, or requested through our national toll-free number: 1(800)772-1213



§16-123 FINE:

\$100 - \$150 - 1st Offense

\$150 - \$350 - 2nd Offense

\$250 - \$350 - 3rd & Subsequent Offenses

Street Storage of Vehicles Prohibited

When parking is not otherwise restricted by posted signs, no person shall park any vehicle in any area, including a residential area, in excess of seven consecutive days.

§ 4-08 (m) (9)

Restrictions on Crossing Sidewalks

No driving bikes on sidewalks unless sign allows or wheels are less than 26 inches in diameter and rider is **twelve years** or younger.
