#### Guest Speaker: Jamalodeen Baksh, Regional Partnership Specialist from the U.S. Census Bureau

Mr. Baksh gave a presentation on the 2020 Census. Here are the main highlights of his PowerPoint Presentation:

- The mission is to serve at the nation's leading provider of quality data about its people and economy.
- ♦ The purpose is to conduct a census of population and housing and disseminate the results to the President, the States and the American People.
- ♦ 2020 Census is mandated by Article 1, Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution.
- All responses collected are protected by the Federal Law and are only used to produce statistics. Violating Title 13 is a serious federal crime. Violators are subject to serve penalties, including a federal prison sentence of up to five years, a fine of up to \$250,000 or both.
- Determines the annual allocation of \$675 billion dollars in federal funding.
- Allowing Census Bureau staff the opportunity to have a presence at your events speaks volumes to the community. They are available to speak or participate at your events to share the census message.

#### **Committee Reports:**

#### Steven Konigsberg, Zoning Committee Chair

BSA Cal. No. 23-08-BZ – 80-14 Chevy Chase Street, Jamaica Estates, NY

A public hearing was held on March 11, 2019 to request an amendment of the previously granted variance under BSA Cal. No. 23-08-BZ (the "Prior Variance"), to permit modification of the previously-approved plans. This would legalize the existing Synagogue by allowing a larger assembly space in the cellar with an accessory kitchen.

President of the Bukharian Community Center in Jamaica Estates **Mr. Edward Zavlyanov** announced that they wish to withdraw the application. **No vote was taken.** 

#### Steven Konigsberg, Zoning Committee Chair

**BSA Cal. No. 2018-184-A through 189-A** – 87-27 Palermo Street, Holliswood, NY

A public hearing was held on March 11, 2019 to approve a request for a waiver of GCL (General City Law) Sections 35 and 36 to permit the proposed development within the mapped street but unbuilt portion of Clover Place; to allow for the construction of buildings that do not front a mapped street.

A roll call was taken. In Favor: 0 Opposed: 31 Abstained: 0

#### Seymour Schwartz, Health Committee Chair

#### **Ad Hoc T-Building Committee:**

A developer came forward with a proposal for rehabilitation of the T-Building. That included: 206 affordable housing apartments, 12,000 square feet given to the Health and Hospitals Corporation for its free use and 8,000 square feet for a community center. They will begin construction on the T-Building in either April or May. A prepared statement by Queens Community House was distributed as to how they will conceive their contribution. Assembly Member Weprin sent a forceful letter to his colleagues in support of capital funding. He asked the Board to include our community center [T-Building] in our budget request for 2021. He also requested that our city and state legislators do the same.

#### Response to the Mayor's 2020 Preliminary Budget:

A letter was drafted to submit in response to Mayor's Preliminary Budget for 2020 for the Expense Budget and Capital Budget. Many of the responses received from the agencies were the same as given to us in prior years - that is unacceptable [A copy of the letter is on file at the office].

A hand vote was taken. All members voted unanimously to send the letter with no abstentions.

# Kew Gardens Interchange Infrastructure and Operational Improvement Project: Contract D900043 | PIN: X051.60 Phase 4

#### The Project

The New York State Department of Transportation has initiated a \$365 million phase 4 project to reduce congestion and improve the flow of traffic at the Kew Gardens Interchange. Built in the 1930s and expanded in the 1960s, the Kew Gardens Interchange is the complex intersection of the Grand Central Parkway, Jackie Robinson Parkway, Union Turnpike and Van Wyck Expressway, providing access to John F. Kennedy International Airport and Laguardia Airport. Under Phase 4, the final phase of the project, the ramps and bridges connecting the Interchange's roadways will be reconfigured to eliminate the existing stop signs and also provide shoulders and acceleration/deceleration lanes. These changes will result in a smoother and safer flow of traffic.

## Did you know???

RCNY - Title 34, Chapter 4 § 4-08

- (n) Special restrictions on parking.
- (2) Parking for certain purposes prohibited. No person regularly engaged in the repair of vehicles shall park a vehicle upon any roadway or off-street parking facility for the principal purpose of washing, greasing, or repairing such vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency.
