Dear	Community Board 8 Resident:								
Did you lose your Senior Citizen Rent Increase Exemption (SCRIE) or your Disabled Rent Increase Exemption (DRIE) for failure to recertify on time? The Department of Finance wants you to know that if you were receiving this benefit from December 1, 2011 onward and were unable to renew your Rent Free benefit because you needed more time due to a disability or physical impairment , you could still be eligible for the benefit.									
According to the Department of Finance, tenants/applicants who lost the benefit; then re-entered the program at a higher frozen rent should submit the "Application for Additional Time to Renew Lapsed Benefit" form. If you are a tenant/applicant who lost your benefit and have not subsequently re-entered SCRIE/DRIE, you should complete the "Application for Additional Time to Renew Expired Benefit" form. These forms have been mailed to the impacted tenants/applicants.

Charlotte E. Ray was born in New York City on January 13, 1850. She graduated from the Howard University School of Law in 1872 and was admitted to the District of Columbia bar that same year, becoming the first female African-American lawyer in the United States. Active in the suffrage movement, Ray was a member of the National Association of Colored Women. She moved to Woodside, Queens in the 1880s and lived there until her death in 1911.

TRAFFIC STUDIES

In the past, the Department of Transportation (DOT) would initiate a new traffic study after 18 months since the denial of a request (*signage, speed bump, traffic light etc.*). This time frame has changed.

According to DOT, "Experience has shown that traffic patterns and traffic growth in New York City do not change within a few months. Therefore, new studies for particular locations are not initiated for 36 months after the analysis has been completed."

Please keep that in mind when resubmitting traffic control requests.


