- Resolution Algonquin Incremental Market Project: Spectra Energy Corporation is proposing to build an expanded gas line which will run under Indian Point Nuclear Facility. This would be taking a major gas line and putting it under an active nuclear plant. The Resolution calls for an independent reviewer other than the Feds.

E-WASTE DISPOSAL BAN



Starting in January 2015, (per NY State Law) it will be illegal for New Yorkers to discard electronics in the trash. Our Bureau of Recycling and Sustainability has updated the nyc.gov/electronics page to include additional recommendations and recycling options for working & non-working electronics:

1. DSNY's e-cycleNYC program. Apartment buildings with more than 10 units can enroll for this free and convenient pickup service.

- **2. Retail drop-off programs.** For example, drop off electronics (no purchase required) at any Goodwill, Salvation Army, Best Buy, Staples (no TVs), or the Gowanus E-Waste Warehouse.
- **3. Mail-back and pickup options.** For residents who live in smaller buildings and are not able to bring their electronics to a drop-off location or event, the following options are available:
- **Best Buy** will remove an appliance or TV free of charge from a customer's home when a new product is purchased and delivered by Best Buy.
- Staples offers free shipping through their technology trade-in program.
- **Dell** will pick up any Dell product for free through their FedEx Package Return Program.
- If none of these options work for you, please contact the manufacturer of your item. The NYS Department of Environmental Conservation maintains a <u>list of electronic equipment manufacturers</u> registered in NYS.

4. Electronics recycling events.

Bring to events run by organizations such as <u>Lower East Side Ecology Center</u>, or DSNY's <u>SAFE Disposal</u> Events.

5. Donate or sell working electronics.

Snow and Ice Removal

Every owner, lessee, tenant, occupant, or other person having charge of any lot or building must clean snow and/or ice from the sidewalk within **4 hours** after the snow has stopped falling, or by **11:00 a.m.** if the snow has stopped falling after **9:00 p.m.** the previous evening. Snow may *NOT* be thrown into the street. If the snow or ice becomes frozen so hard that it cannot be removed, the sidewalk may be strewn with ashes, sand, sawdust, or similar suitable material within the same time limits. The sidewalk must be thoroughly cleaned as soon as the weather permits.
