- ♦ The Kew Gardens Library held a Job Fair last year to help those seeking job opportunities. It had a great turn out.

Committee Reports:

<u>DEP/Sanitation Committee</u>, Kevin Forrestal, Committee Chair.

The Committee met regarding the lack of enforcement of illegal postings on utility poles throughout the District. Once a complaint is filed through the 311 system, it gets routed to the agency for inspection. Upon inspection, the responsible party for the illegal posting receives a warning letter giving them ten (10) days to correct the condition. If the postings aren't removed during this period, a summons is issued based on the number of posters that are out there. Most postings in our area are being addressed through Council Member Barry Grodenchik's office and the Wildcats organization.

A letter will be written to the Mayor's Office and the Commissioner of the Department of Sanitation regarding the over salting of streets during the snow storm in November 2018.

A letter was drafted regarding stray voltage damaging water service lines on 188th Street. In the letter the Board requested the suspension of the rules so that DEP could repair the water service lines.

Marc A. Haken made a motion to send the drafted letter to the Mayor's Office regarding the stray voltage damaging water service <u>lines on 188th Street seconded by Maria DeInnocentiis</u>. Committee Chair Kevin Forrestal took a hand count.

Count in favor <u>28</u> Opposed: <u>0</u> Abstained: <u>0</u>

The motion was passed unanimously.

Transportation Committee & Area 7 Committee – Howard A. Fried, Area 7 Committee Chair

<u>Holliswood Transportation/Traffic issues</u> – Mr. Fried stated that a meeting was held on January 30th regarding the request to change traffic direction on 191st Street from Hillside Avenue to Palo Alto Avenue and a speed bump installation on Foothill Avenue from 191st to 193rd Streets. Many area residents attended the meeting. There were fourteen (14) speakers. There was a six (6) to six (6) vote. It was suggested that the residents go back and find a better solution or have a better proposal to be presented at the next Transportation Committee Meeting (TCM) being held on March 7, 2019.





Landscaper-Generated Waste



§16-308(h) FINE: \$250 - 1st Offense \$1,000 - 2nd Offense within 12 months \$2,500 - 3rd and Subsequent Offenses within 12 months

Failure to Remove Canine Waste

Each person who owns, or controls a dog must remove any feces left by that dog on any sidewalk, gutter, street, or other public area and dispose of it in a legal manner. The person may remove the feces and carry them away with him/her for disposal in a toilet or place them in a non-leaking container or bag and deposit them in a DSNY litter basket. *The provisions of this law do not apply to a guide dog accompanying any blind person*.

New York State Public Health Law §1310 FINE: \$250

Please note that the violator (s) must be observed by an agent for the issuance of a violation. When filing a complaint, please give a pattern for the offense (i.e. this occurs weekdays from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. on John Street between Avenues A & B or in front of 16 John Street.)

The City suspends alternate side parking regulations for both street cleaning purposes and traffic flow, on legal and/or religious holidays.




