

As New York City Residents we must obey a gamut of regulations. We realize that most residents want to do the right thing and obey the rules. However, they often break them, as they are **unaware** of their existence. Hence, this new segment in our Newsletter....





Did you know???

If you are a property owner who has been given notice by DSNY to remove graffiti, and your property is a residential building containing six or more dwelling units, or a commercial building, failure to comply with the notice received from DSNY may result in the issuance of a violation returnable to ECB.

Additionally, if your property is <u>any type</u> of residential or commercial building, failure to comply with such notice may also result in the issuance of a Notice of Nuisance Abatement returnable to ECB and the removal of the graffiti from your property by the City.

§10-117.3 FINE: \$150-\$300 and/or

Notice of Nuisance Abatement

Landscaping devices can only be used between **8 a.m. and 7 p.m.** (or sunset, whichever occurs later) on weekdays; and used between **9 a.m. and 6 p.m.** on holidays and weekends. **NYC Noise Code**

You may contact your Community Board or 311 to file a noise complaint. The Department of Environmental Protection will send an inspector and issue violations if warranted. It is important to note that the inspectors are <u>not</u> dispatched right away. It is helpful if you have a log of when the landscaper is violating the regulations (i.e. landscaper mows the lawn on block A every Tuesday at 7:30 a.m.). The DEP inspector must witness the violation him/herself.
