No Squatting in Queens

Some of you may have seen recent news reports about a homeowner fighting to regain access to her property from an alleged squatter here in Queens. The DA wants to assure homeowners that criminal charges will be pursued when you unlawfully occupy someone else's home.

You cannot enter a home without permission, stay without consent and later claim vested rights simply because the legitimate homeowner was either unaware or was unable to remove the illegal squatter for a total of 30 days. Property ownership is a fundamental right and the DA's office will not allow anyone to exploit certain laws for their personal gain at the expense of legitimate property owners.

#### Guest Speaker Paul Graziano – Urban Planner/City of Yes

Updates from last meeting: Hand outs were given out.

The Economic/Financial & Commercial Zoning portion of this proposal is with the City Council now. Serious negotiations are going on. Two thirds of the community boards voted the proposal down with no conditions.

The housing proposal at the state level for ADUs resulted in a pilot program created for Community Board 2. The 13 other boards in Queens are off the table. The Department of City Planning is coming back to CB8 in June for the City of Yes for Housing Opportunity. The boards will need to vote on this proposal by June 30th. There are 15 main components expounded on. The main takeaways were:

- The mayor's goal is to create 100,000 housing units in 15 years.
- 100,000 divided by 59 community boards = 1700 units per board.
- Divide 1700 by 15 years = approximately 120 units per year per board.
- Their goal is to go from 52,800 units to 108,000 units. We don't have a problem with that. We are already doing that.

These are market rate rentals displacing owner occupied housing. We have been in a permanent housing crisis since 1948. This is nothing new. They want to get rid of the homeowners so they can get the land to build on. That is the entire thrust of this proposal.


#### **A Few Specific Goals:**

- To re-introduce buildings with ground floor commercial and two to four stories of housing above.
- Allow modest, three-five story apartment buildings where they fit best: Large lots within half a mile of subway
  or rail stations that are on wide streets or corners.
- Permit accessory dwelling units such as backyard cottages, garage conversions and basement apartments.
- Allow buildings to add at least 20% more housing if the additional homes are permanent.
- Eliminate mandatory parking requirements for new buildings.
- Make it easier for underused nonresidential buildings, such as offices, to be converted into housing.
- Re-introduce housing with shared kitchens or other common facilities. Eliminate strict limits on studios and one-bedroom apartments.
- Make it easier to add new housing on large sites that have existing buildings on them and already have ample space to add more, (e.g., a church with an oversized parking lot).
- Allow narrow lots to achieve underlying Quality Housing heights in R7—R10 districts.
- Make it easier for landmarks to sell unused development rights by expanding transfer radius and simplifying procedure.

# FLUSHING MEADOWS CORONA PARK (FMCP) MERIDIAN ROAD TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

The New York Hall of Science (NHSCI) will be hosting the Queens Night market again this year. In the past, due to insufficient parking availability drivers parked illegally which raised some public safety concerns. We were informed that concerns regarding parking arrangements have resurfaced in recent weeks.

Due to these concerns, the Department of Parks and Recreation working closely with NYPD, DOT, NYSCI and the Queens Night Market team have agreed close Meridian Road at the New York Avenue route to Eastbound Grand Central Parkway on Saturdays from 1:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. to accommodate the Queens Night Market. This is effective from May 18, 2024 through October 26, 2024.



The above is the Tentative Department of Transportation's Resurfacing List for our community district. Regular resurfacing usually starts the first week of July and runs through August in our district.

It is important to note that it is a multi-part process. First the road will be milled, that is the removal of the top layer of the roadway first. Then a few weeks is allocated for the utility companies who may wish to do any type of work while the street is open.

This list was pre-vetted and shared with the utility companies long before milling. In most cases these companies have had a lot of time to review for conflicts or opportunities to schedule their work. This work may take a few weeks to complete. Once completed, the DOT's contractor will return to pave the roadway. If it is a major thoroughfare, they will subsequently return to apply markings on the road (i.e., lane markers, crosswalks, etc.).



The City suspends alternate side parking regulations for both street cleaning purposes and traffic flow, on legal and/or religious holidays.




