• The Minutes of the January 21, 2023, Board Meeting were unanimously approved by 39 members.

#### • Chairperson's Report:

A full-time Community Assistant has been identified and is being processed. We are continuing our search for a part-timer. The position is for 21 hours, making the staffer eligible for city benefits.

The Comptroller's office met with all the Board Managers of Queens, at the Borough President's office. It was announced that there will be a routine oversite audit. They are required to conduct this audit every four years. They will be conducting an audit of timekeeping, personnel practices, and purchase documents.

Board Member Harbachan Singh invited Community Board Members and Staff, to an Annual Black History Month Celebration at Borough Hall. Harbachan Singh and Marc Haken are the only non-African American members on the committee. We commend our Board Members for their commitment.

#### **Guest Speakers:**

#### **Denise Downing of Queens Public Library**

She gave a presentation promoting a book mailing service to permanent or temporary homebound residents of New York State. The borrower is issued a library card for the mail at home service and the holder may borrow books, join a book club, speak with a librarian, or join arts and crafts groups. **Also,** there are opportunities to volunteer at the library.

#### Raida Hossain Queens Community Liaison Organ Donation for Live On NY

In conjunction with over 100 hospitals, they help to increase the organ donation rate in New York State. They work on behalf of residents within the 5 boroughs, Nassau County and Suffolk County. One organ donor can affect as many as eight lives. This number can increase to seventy-five when tissue donation is incorporated. Every major religion supports organ donation. A person considering donating can sign up as they register to vote or apply/renew a driver's license. Ability to pay is never a factor, for either the donor or recipient.

#### **Committee Reports:**

#### • Capital and Expense Budget Committee Report - Harbachan Singh, Treasurer

This committee drafted a proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2024 that was submitted in October. We met on February 6, 2023, to review and hear comments on the Mayor's Preliminary Budget. We received comments from the members and from the public. These comments were used in our drafted letter in response to the Mayor's Preliminary Budget. Treasurer Harbachan Singh commended District Manager Marie Adam-Ovide for her work on this.

All board members voted in favor. The motion carried.

#### • Medical Minute by Dr. Penny Stern:

February is recognized as American Heart Month. Heart failure is the leading cause of death for women. The American Heart Association has a "Go Red" campaign, it voices the need for a multi prong approach to women's healthcare. Cardiac failure is prevalent among working aged adults. In America, in every 34 seconds an adult dies of cardiac disease. Black adults are the most likely to suffer from heart conditions and their related health consequences. African Americans die [from heart failure] at a rate two times higher than Caucasian adults. A Million Hearts Initiative in collaboration with the CDC Foundation has a program, "Live To The Beat." This program supports participants taking meaningful steps to reduce the risk factors associated with heart disease including controlling, hypertension, high cholesterol, and high blood sugar.

#### WHAT IS HOME SHARING?

NYFSC's Home Sharing Program helps link adult "hosts" with extra private space in their homes or apartments with appropriate adult "guests" to share their space. Both Hosts and guests benefit from reduced housing costs and the possibility for companionship to offset the isolation and loneliness experienced to many living alone.

#### HOW DOES THE HOME SHARING PROGRAM WORK?

Through the QUICK-MATCH system and a staff of professional licensed social workers NYFSC determines compatible sharemates by evaluating their 31 lifestyle objectives. To facilitate potential hosts and guests in determining their compatibility the staff schedules and attends "match meeting."

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Either the host or the guest must be 60 or older; all participants must be 18 or older.

#### MTA to Perform CBTC Signal Installation Work on: E, F and R Lines in Queens Starting March 17, 2023

R Trains Will Not Operate in Queens After 9:30 p.m.; and Trains Will Run Local to

Accommodate R Customers 🏮 Trains to Run Local During Overnight Hours

The Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) today announced that the next phase of Communications-Based Train Control (CBTC) signal installation work will begin on the Queens Boulevard East line.

The installation work will impact service on the and lines in Queens during the evening and overnight hours. Starting March 17, crews will ramp up installation work between the Union Turnpike-Kew Gardens and Jamaica -179 St stations which will require service changes on evenings and overnights seven days a week. During that time

the , and lines will have the following changes.

#### R Line to Forest Hills-71 Av, Queens, Ends Early All Nights

After 9:30 p.m. Queens-bound trains will end at Queens Plaza. Queens-bound and trains will run local in Queens to accommodate train customers. There is no change in Brooklyn-bound service.

#### Queens-bound Trains Run Local Earlier All Nights

After 9:30 p.m., Queens-bound trains will run local from Queens Plaza to Forest Hills-71 Av, continuing to Jamaica Center. There is no change in Manhattan-bound service.

#### Brooklyn-bound <sup>1</sup> Trains Run Local During Overnight Hours All Nights

After 9:30 p.m., Queens-bound trains will run local from 36 St, Queens, to Forest Hills-71 Av, continuing to Jamaica-179 St.

Starting at about 10:45 p.m. Brooklyn-bound trains from Jamaica-179 St will run local from Forest Hills – 71 Av to 36 St, Queens.

Customers are encouraged to sign up for the MTA Weekender, a weekly newsletter sent every Friday to inform customers of weekend service changes throughout the transit system. Customers can sign up at: https://cloud.info.mta.org/weekend\_update\_subscription

**MYmta** app – Customers who use the comprehensive MYmta smartphone app will see real-time travel information for all MTA services all in one place.

**Live Subway Map** – The Live Subway Map shows the real-time position of trains, planned service changes at any given time, highlights accessible stations, and much more.

Twitter – Twitter users can follow @NYCTSubway for service updates and customer service support.

**WhatsApp** – Customers can chat with NYC Transit via WhatsApp. Riders can receive customer service support in their native language through the help of Google Translate.

For those who prefer to contact the MTA by telephone, information is available by dialing 511. Connecticut customers should call **877-690-5114.** Those who are deaf or hard of hearing can use their preferred service provider for the free 711 relay to reach the MTA at 511.
