NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

There will be a public hearing held in conjunction with our Community Board 8 meeting on **Wednesday, September 13, 2023 at 7:30 p.m.** BSA application No. 84-08-BZ to extend the terms of the special permit for a period of ten (10) years from October 28, 2018 to operate a gas service station at **67-20 Main Street aka 68-12 Main Street** in Flushing. This is also to amend the resolution to allow a canopy.

NYC Sanitation Announces Trash, Compost and Recycling Collection Schedule for Labor Day, September 4, 2023

In advance of the Labor Day holiday, the New York City Department of Sanitation has announced its trash, compost and recycling collection schedule for **Monday, September 4, 2023**. There WILL BE trash and compost collection on the holiday, in line with the Department's mission to get New York City cleaner, faster.

- Residents who normally receive Monday trash and composting collection should put their material at the curb the evening of Sunday, September 3rd, for collection starting Monday, September 4th.
- Residents who normally receive Monday recycling collection should put their material at the curb the evening of Monday, September 4th, for collection starting Tuesday, September 5th.

While the Department strives to offer this service in a timely manner, please note that collection delays are possible after holidays. We appreciate patience as we work to collect the material.

NYC Department of Education School Year Calendar 2023-2024

This is the 2023–24 school year calendar for all 3K–12 NYCDOE public schools. If your child attends a private, parochial, charter school, NYC Early Education Center (NYCEEC) or Family Childcare Program, please contact your child's school for information about their calendar. Please note the following:

- On days when school buildings are closed due to inclement weather or other emergencies, all students and families should plan on participating in remote learning.
- Individual schools' Parent-Teacher Conference dates might be different from the dates below. Your child's teacher will work with you to schedule your conference.
- On this schedule, elementary schools are defined as programs that serve kindergarten (K) through grade 8, including schools with 3-K and Pre-K programs, as well as those that end in grade 5. Middle schools are defined as programs that serve grades 6–8, and high schools are defined as programs that serve grades 9–12.
